The capitalist part of my brain (damaged in just one playground concussion) just kicked in. Why not revive dangerous playground equipment and market it to parents who would like to let their children have fun and take nisks and maybe even injury? Or why not build an old-fashioned ply injury: O somewhere and make it a destination point for traveling families? Fabrication should be easy. When nothing is plastic, you don't need molds. Everything 1

of 48 year-old Jay Donaldson and 20 yearId Miss Bertha Gordon. He was given a 50 year prison term of which he appealed and in a second trial held in Dawson County the conviction was upheld. Apparently he only received seven years for killing Miss Gordon. Officers believed the murder occurred in the car that Sunday afternoon as blood stains
were found on the seat and windshield and a bullet hole through the side of the car. The bodies were then tossed out on highway 84 about four miles from Post. Lying on the
 ground between the bodies
was a .45 -caliber revolver. Even though Bridges was convicted twice, he filed several appeals and
the sentence stood until the sentence stood until
a Judge Kreugaer found there may have been an error, hence Monte's
LINDA years. According to record PUCKETT the original opinion was amended to read 20 years Bridges had alr
killed Mr. I. Nathan, a prominent businessman on a street in Post on March 9 A verdict was returned as not guilty. Well here we are with a total of three people dead 50 year sentence that was reduced to 20,
and the man is still free as a bird. So he goes to Borger and murders another gentleman, Mr. Fred English a hotel proprietor. He hen leaves the country and ends up in San
Bernardino, California where he walks into the Sheriff's office and asked to be arrested. He was extradited back to stand trial for the murder of Mr. English. He was given a 25 year sentence for that murder.
It's unclear how much time Monte
Bridges actually served, but according to hi Bridges actually served, but according to his living in Chicago for seven years. He had suffered a stroke the week before his death
a Chicago hospital. This little recap of Monte Bridges
me to another colorful member of the Bridges family, a sister named Ella. Their parents, Mr. and Mrs. J.P. Bridges lived on a ranch near Post, Texas. Ella's childhood was much like most other West Texas
girls, with the exception that she was an girls, with the exception that she was an
unusually beautiful child. As she grew into womanhood, she was intelligent as well as beautiful.
World War I had just ended and among those soldiers mustering out, was a young engineer, Louis Howard, who had fought
in France. The neighbors didn't know in France. The neighbors didn't know much about him except that he was from
Mississippi, was handsome in a western
manner, honest and a deviushly hard
worker."
Ella was 19 years old when Louis married Ella was 19 years old when Louis m
her in Post on February 22, 1919. They moved . It was there that their son Lowis Jr. was born.
Howard's engineering skills allowed hin to prosper as a road contractor in West Texas. But as an architect, maybe not so good. He began building a new $\$ 25,000$ house for his family, but it turned out to be
an architectural freak, for when the builders an architectural freak, for when the build garden, while the back door welcomed all visitors on the residential street. Disturbed with the outcome but undaunted, the Howards moved in. Their daughter Jan was born in the new home. They had been married nine years at that time. Another five years of their union endured, though
none too happy and in 1933 Ella filed for a divorce charging Howard with "cruel and harsh treatment" toward her during the year prior to the filing of the suit. When the divorce was granted on March 17, 1933, the myth that the Howards were rich exploded in the face of Lubbock townspeople.
Ella got half of the bedroomy sutte thent, Ella got half of the bedroom suite, the family
car, and $\$ 925$ representing half of the money car, and $\$ 25$ representized from the sale of exempt furniture and $\$ 125$ for the children.
Howard moved off to Austin and Ella took the children and moved to Fort Wor Ella had been divorced for two years when she met T. Karl Simmons who blew
into Fort Worth one day from his nearby stock ranch at Bixby. He had gone to see friend who had a horse for sale. The friend introduced him to Ella and they began seeing each other regularly. Apparently Ella was still very beautiful, husbandless, and to a strong man with a roving eye, the poor girl
was to be pitied. Her father had died and was to be pitied. Her father had died and her mother had remarried and moved out of
Texas. Her brother was in dreadful trouble. Texas. Her bronerwa strugling to support her children, but now she had Simmons strong shoulder in which to lean on as she whispered the story of her black sheep brother, Monte Bridges, whose difficulty lay in his trigger finger, and was quick on the
draw. draw.
Simmons spent a great deal of time in Fort Worth, becoming a familiar sight to many of
the residents of the town. He stood by Ella the residents of the town. He stood by Lis
