PRESIDENT HARRINGTON RESIGNS.

Commissioner of Agriculture Named President of A. & M. Colle.

Austin, Aug. 8 .- No little surprise was occasioned in the state house this afternoon, following the giving out of a telegram received by Gov. Campbell announcing that President H. H. Harrington of the A. & M. College had tendered his resignation to the board of directors, assembled at Corpus Christi, its acceptance and the appointment of R. T. Milner, Commissioner of der guard of soldiers and deputies. Agriculture, as Dr. Harrington's successor. The action of the board of directors temporarily disrupts the official family of the State government and occasions some complications.

The telegram to the governor was from K. K. Leggett, president of the board. The message did not say, however, whether or not Commissioner Milner had accepted his new honor. Gov. Campbell got into long distance telephone communication with Mr. Milner at Corpus Christi a few minutes after receiving the telegram, and learned from the Commissioner of Agriculture that he had accepted the appointment. The governor's reception of the news was with the words: "Now, that gives me more torubel; doesn't it?"
