Typhoid fever the is here and. as we bave stated before, it is up to our citizens whether or not they are to be visited by this dreadful scourge. Cleanliness in essential above all ot ber thing. Typboid germs are found in milk and water, expectally the latter, *o keep the water barrels clean The domestic fly is reganded as the greatest of typhoid fever. spreaders and no matter bow clean you may be otherwise you are io peril so long as you allow the fly to bave entrance in your home. Sclentists are agreed that the common howse fly is rexponsible for seventy-tive per cent of the typhoid caves. Don't allow frod of any kind to romain where flies canalight upon it as germe are transmitted in this way. Keep your dosts and windows screened and kill the flies that obtain entrance. Get busy now. After you get the fever it is ton late.-Hale Center Live. Wire
