Leaders Consider What Must Be En counter in Territory to the South of Torreon.

Culiacan, Sinaloa.-"At the triumph of the cause of the constitutionalist order, which we represent, peace will be established in my country."

With this brief statement to news papers, Gen. Venusitano Carranza replied to a flood of messages from peace societies in Europe, which ask ed for peace in Mexico.

These messages were sent by societies in England, Russia, Belgium. Portugal, Switzerland, Holland and Spain. This simultaneous action gave rise to much speculation among Gen Carranza's advisers, and the opiniou brought about by some action of the Huerta government at the City of Mex ico through its agents in Europe.
