Rogers Is Named To Committee On Faculty Pay

Lieutenant Governor Pres-ton Smith Friday announced the appointment of Senator Andy Rogers of Childress to the interim Committee on Fa-culty Compensation in -State -supported Colleges and Univer-sities.


