them beyond that. Paul even states deprecatingly in 2 Corinthians $12: 6 \mathrm{~b}$ that he "refrains from speaking about his vision experience so no one would think more of him than
was warranted by what he did or said." He wanted the
Corinthians to focus Corinthians to focus on the simple gospel of accepted by
grace through faith and grace through faith and
transform their ordinary lives accordingly. A sensational experience can be very helpful but as Mitchell said, "if focused on too seriously, too much,
then like medicines it can have then like medicines it can have
