



Doris Herington, 51, has announced she will seek the Democratic nomination in the spring primary for the office of Parmer County Tax Assessor.



Her veil of tulle was edged with lace and was attached to a spray of seed pearls. The bridal bouquet was a cascade of gardenias and pink rosebuds.



A season for whoopin' and hollerin' in Bovina

After the Bovina football team lost its final game of the regular season, there was a feeling of uneasiness amidst the Mustang players.

Bovina's playoffs chances - its entire season would be decided by a coin flip. Mustang players gathered in their locker room to watch the proceedings, which took place in the Bovina coaches' offices. All could be seen through a large window separating the two rooms.

'There was a lot of whoopin' and hollerin'," Bovina head coach Bill Talley said of the postflip celebration. "Really, it was just elation."

The fact Bovina was even involved in the flip was

reason enough for joy. The fact the Mustangs won one of the two playoff spots available in the District 2-1A flip with Anton and Farwell, however, was historical.

For the first time since 1965, Bovina had made the Texas high school football playoffs. The Mustangs ended an 8-3 season with a 28-0 bi-district loss Nov. 20 to Wheeler, which played for the Class 1A state championship Saturday night.

Bovina overcame a recent reputation for losing, as the Mustangs endured an 0-19-1 record during 1984 and '85. Bovina then dropped from 2A to 1A and went 3-7 last season.

For their accomplishments this season, Bovina has been named the Super Team surprise team of the year.

"I thought our seniors contributed a great deal to it," said Talley, who came to Bovina in '85. "They had been down a rough and rocky road in seasons past, but they had meetings with each other throughout the season and had a winning attitude. They (Bovina's seniors) told me they were going to be different than other senior classes and they were going to provide some leadership."

Eight of Bovina's 22 players this season were semiors, including five who played football for four sea-

Running backs Todd Ware and Bud Venable provided much of the offensive punch for Bovina, as Ware had 960 yards rushing and 14 touchdowns while Venable picked up 1,086 yards.

Junior quarterback Scott Scaff also was a key, as the Mustang basketball standout returned to the gridiron after sitting out his junior season.


"He made a big difference," Talley said. "He allowed us to run the kind of offense we wanted to and move the football."

And while Bovina may have been a surprise to the rest of the state, Talley claims to have been convinced it was justified to expect something special from this season's Mustangs.

"It was a pleasant surprise we won as many as we did. My heart may have been overruling my head but really, in the preseason, I sensed something about this team," Talley said. "The key was a winning attitude prevailed at every practice."




