HISTORICAL SKETCH OF TEXAS BAPTISTS

In support of the Southern Baptist \$75,000,000 campaign, J. N. Rayzor of Denton has written a tract of historic interest to Texans. It is being used in furtherance of the Baptist task of raising \$16,000,000 in this State to meet the five year needs of missions, education and benevolences. The tract is called "A Profitable, Permanent Investment."

Mr. Rayzor shows that in 1839, three years after the setting up of the Texas Republic, a handful of Baptists met to make plans for preaching the gospel. They decided to appeal to the Baptists of the States to send missionaries, and the appeal was drafted by J. R. Jenkins, whose daughter in later years became the wife of Dr. R. C. Burleson, and two others. Mr. Jenkins sent a copy to Jess Mercer, his former teacher, and Mercer responded by sending his check for \$2,500 and promising more if needed.

Responding to a request to select two missionaries for work in Texas, Mr. Mercer designated William Tryon, a Mercer graduate, and James Huckins, an alumnus of Brown University. Tryon was assigned to Washington, capital of the Texas Republic, and Huckins to Galveston, then the commercial center. The Congress of the Republic was in session when Tryon arrived and he was made the chaplain. He quickly began preaching, and folks from miles around came to hear him.

Among these were Mr. and Mrs. Eli Mercer. They were converted and Tryon baptized them. Eli Mercer was a brother of Jesse Mercer, who had given \$2500, and when he heard of this, he exclaimed: "It is enough. I have received a thousandfold in come from my investment."

At the same time Huckins was preaching in Houston and Galveston. One evening at sunset a group assembled on the beach at Galveston to witness the first baptismal service in the Gulf of Mexico. Huckins led into the surf and immersed Gail Borden and his wife. Borden gave condensed milk to the world. Mrs. Borden was the sister of Eli Mercer and a niece of Jesse Mercer. When Jesse Mercer heard of this he exclaimed: "Again I have received a thousand per cent on my investment in Texas missions."

The first representative body of Baptists to assemble in Texas was in 1841, when Union Association was organized. Tryon asked for a Baptist education society. This was formed and he and Judge R. E. Baylor were selected by it to procure a charter for a university. Tryon drafted the charter and Judge Baylor approved it after changing it to read "Tryon University." Tryon changed it to "Baylor University." The university opened its first session at Independence in 1845 with a one-teacher faculty

MOVE TO REVISE CALENDAR

Advocates of Change Will Bring the Matter to Attention of League of Nations.

One of the first projects to be laid before the League of Nations, when it gets ready for new business, is one to revise the calendar and make it uniform throughout the world. Bureau officials of the United States, Switzerland and Great Britain got into touch with church officials before the war on the subject of calendar revision, and have kept up consideration of the matter since. Church leaders say an agreement has been reached and a uniform report is nearly ready to go to the league.

The calendar has not been revised before because of objections from the churches to dates for the great religious feasts. These objections are said to be removed. A fixed date for Easter, the adding of a thirteenth month, the making of every week begin with a Sunday and having exactly 28 days in each month—these are the main features agreed on. Church people favoring the revision say that if the league itself cannot act, it can designate a calendar congress to do so, to sit at Geneva.

Where Honors Are Even



Tailored suits continue to come from the hands of manufacturers in two distinctly different types, with the buying public showing a preference for the fanciful designs.

In the matter of decorations, fur is widely but not lavishly used, and carefully done silk embroidery is very often used with it. Being of the same character they look well together. At the right of the two suits pictured here there is a fine example of the combination of fur and embroidery in a suit of wool velours. The skirt in this model has two narrow plaits at the side and is very long. The coat is a very handsome affair, uneven in length about the bottom and having wide panels, shorter than the front and back, set in. They are banded with two narrow bands of dark fur. Embroidery, in the same color as the cloth, finds an advantageous position at each side of the coat skirt. The body buttons a little to the left of the front with large, flat cloth-covered buttons, and there is high collar of the

cloth, banded with fur, that fastens at the left side. Fur in two large ornaments finishes the narrow girdle with long ends at the front. With this dressy suit a sailor hat of silk beaver looks particularly well.

The suit at the left is a quite different affair, much plainer and made of a sturdier material. Bone buttons and narrow braid are the very practical embellishments allowed to it and its lines are simple and mannish. But it has the high, cozy looking collar of fur that is found in the company of all sorts of suits and the narrow belt of the material. But this is extended only across the front of the coat, buttoning at the sides. Just by way of not going to extremes in being plain and practical, the belt is double, with no particular reason for being so except that it adds an attractive and unexpected interest to this small item in the suit's make-up. The hat is a tailored model, but not so plain as a banded sailor. Neither suit is afraid of comparison, honors are about even between them.

Three-Piece Matched Suit



The sumptuous ribbons which the looms have turned out, more than anything else have inspired the designers of dress accessories this season. It seems these wide and gorgeous products of the ribbon weaver's art, are most beautiful when not too lavishly used and are at their best when used against a background of black or other somber tone, that casts into relief their wonderful colorings. Therefore they appear in millinery in scarfs, overblouses and bags to be worn with gowns of dark and quiet colors.

At the right of the picture of two matched sets shown here, duvetyne is used for the foundation of a three-piece set that includes a turban, scarf and bag. This soft, glove-finish fabric makes an ideal foil for the brilliance of tinsel brocaded ribbon in which exquisite colors are blended and enriched with silver tinsel shot through the pattern. The ends of the wide scarf are bordered with the ribbon which is finished with deep fringe of knotted silk. The bag is a well-balanced composition of duvetyne and ribbon with a silk tassel, and the small

draped turban is made almost entirely of ribbon having a silk tassel like that on the bag, for its finishing touch.
For more practical wear the set made of duvetyne, shown at the left of the picture, also includes a scarf, hat and bag. A dark and rich color is chosen for a set of this kind, and it dispenses with magnificence to content itself with smartness—therefore, it is made without ribbon. The hat is an off-the-face model, draped with consummate cleverness, and finished with an ornament. The scarf ends in big chenille tassels and fastens under an ornament like that on the hat. In its arrangement about the neck it follows the universal mode for neck pieces by its cozy effect. They all suggest a nice, warm place into which the chin may snuggle down. A tassel of chenille makes the right finish for the shopping bag that completes this set.

and an attendance of a bare score. Tryon and Huckins, the missionaries, Eli Mercer and Gall Borden were the members of the first board of trustees.

With the growth of population Tryon recognized the need for more missionaries in Texas, and in response to his appeal about twenty men were sent from the States. A copy of his appeal fell into the hands of a young ministerial student about to graduate in Covington, Ky. This student exclaimed: "This day I consecrate my life to Texas." Stepping from a steamer at Galveston in 1848, this young man knelt on the sands and exclaimed: "O God, give me Texas for Jesus before I die." That man was Rufus C. Burleson, whom history has given a large place in the religion and education of Texas. It was he who baptized General Sam Houston.

William Tryon's last act before his death was to secure the passage by the Union Association of a resolution calling for the organization of the Texas Baptist State Convention. Organization of the Convention was effected in 1848.

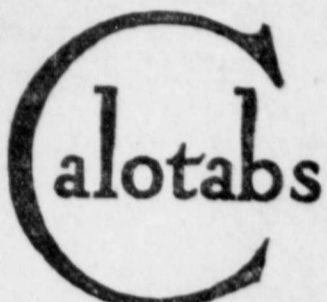

After invocation by Dr. S. B. McCormick, chancellor of the University of Pittsburgh, there was an address of welcome by E. V. Babcock, mayor of Pittsburgh.

Speaking of the accident conditions generally in the mining industries and of the outlook, Dr. Van H. Manning, director of the bureau of mines, says: "I am often asked, 'What has the bureau of mines accomplished in saving of human life in the mines?'"

"It was in 1911 that the bureau held under its auspices a great national first-aid and mine-rescue meet at Pittsburgh, which was attended by 22,000 miners. The slogan of that meet was 'safety first'."

"Since that time the bureau has gone its way, improving its methods, interesting the miner in his own safety and that of his fellow man; doing what it could to point out to the owners of the mines the dangerous places that could be avoided and making recommendations as the result of its experiments looking toward still greater safety."

"We are not content to rest on the progress made. There are now more than a million miners in the United States, and each year more than 3,000 are killed in accidents and a quarter of a million injured. Taking the cold, business calculation of the state compensation commissions and eliminating the suffering and sorrow of 3,600 killed each year, the economic loss from these fatalities alone is \$12,000,000 a year, for these commissions are paying an average of \$4,000 for every life lost."

"The causes of these fatal accidents are much better known. Operators and miners are giving much more thought to the dangers of the mines, and the wide-awake among them have installed more modern safety devices. Through the experimental mine of the bureau mining men and miners both have a keener understanding of the dangers of coal dust and have learned how to combat them."

"The dedication ceremonies brought to Pittsburgh for the three days the most prominent mining and metallurgical men of the nation, not alone those interested in the safety-first movement, but also those connected with the allied industries that use the products of the mines."

After luncheon at the bureau of mines buildings the guests boarded special trains to the experimental mine of the bureau of mines at Bruceton, Pa., 14 miles from Pittsburgh. Upon arrival there a prearranged explosion of coal dust took place in the experimental mine as a demonstration to the visitors, and after that there was an inspection of the mine and the explosives-testing plant, the guests returning to the city at 6 o'clock in the evening.

The second day the new laboratories were open for inspection by the guests the entire day, and at 2 o'clock the elimination contests in the National Safety First-Aid and Mine-Rescue meet were held at Forbes field; also the awarding of the state championships. At 5 o'clock, at Forbes field, there was a demonstration of the explosibility of coal dust and at 8 o'clock the chamber of commerce presented a pageant typifying the spirit of the mining industry, with music by the band of the Carnegie Institute of Technology.

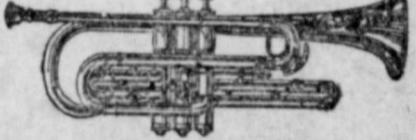

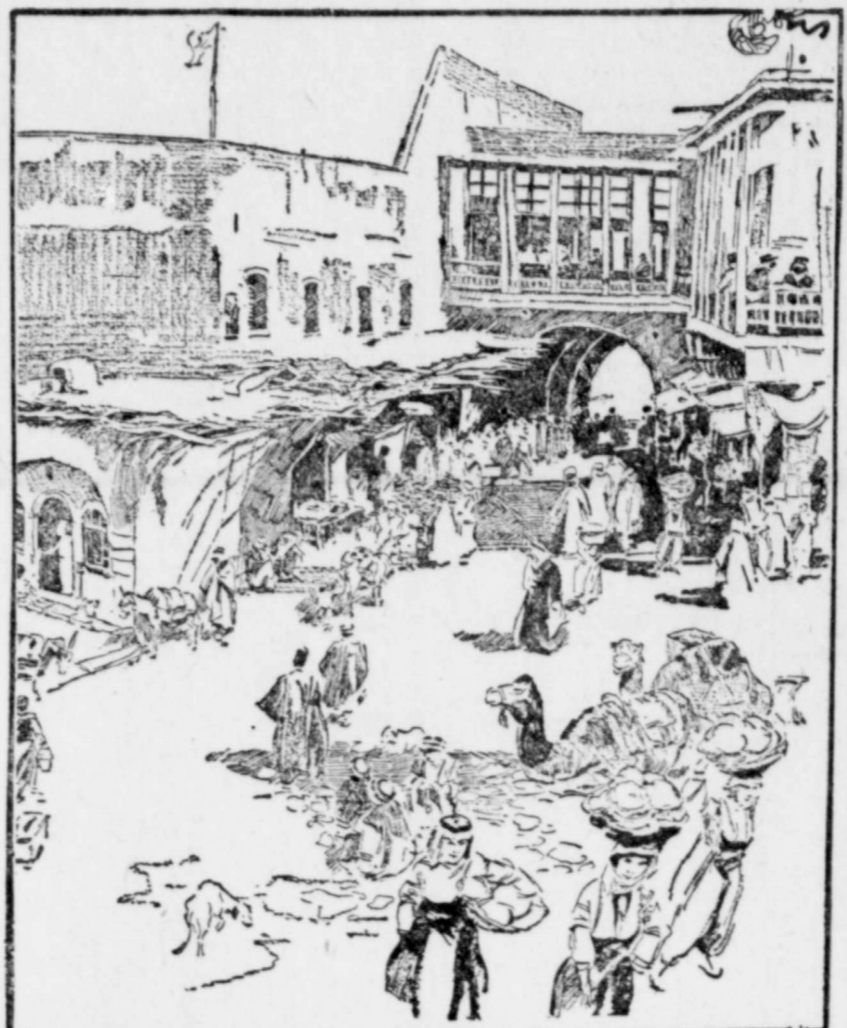

BROUGHT JOY TO ART LOVERS

Masterpiece of Painting, Recently Found in Spain, Has Stirred Critics and Connoisseurs.

A discovery that has given art and connoisseurs of art in Spain a topic of conversation was the other day when somebody found an old barn at Extremadura, an ancient painting of great merit, but with the name of the painter, the *Ch. Science Monitor* states.

Manuel Cossio, an expert, devoted a work of "transcendent importance" for the history of Spanish art, the cursor of the figures by El Greco Zurbarán—but offers no opinion on the identity of the artist. Mr. Zurbarán, a millionaire of Bilbao, forward with the large sum of money needed to persuade the possessor to offer the picture for foreign sale, and so it remains temporarily in the Prado museum while the government decides whether or not to acquire it permanently. The critic in agreement that the unknown painter painted it in the first half of the sixteenth century. 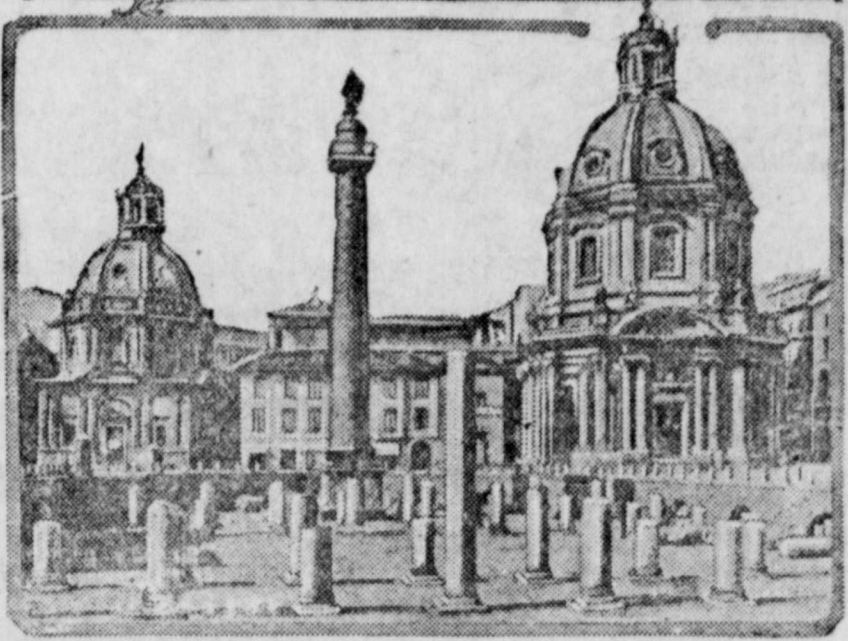

Trajan's Column



Trajan's Forum and Column.

HERE is a movement in Kansas City for the erection of a memorial to the American soldiers who took part in the world war, in the form of some monumental work of sculptural art. Its advocates, says the Kansas City Star, will find a historic precedent worthy of study and pregnant with suggestion in the famous Trajan's column at Rome, which remains today after eight centuries one of the world's memorial wonders. In its original setting it was but a part of a magnificent system of public buildings—two libraries, the Basilica Ulpia and the temple of Trajan—which composed the forum erected by the Roman emperor Trajan to commemorate his reign and to enliven his victories for posterity. The designer of the great forum of Trajan was Apollodorus, the Greek architect. The name of the artist under whose inspired hand the column grew from base to capital and who recorded in its stones the martial deeds of his imperial master has been forgotten. That he was a Roman, however, is attested by the fact that the column itself is distinctly Roman in its design and in its inspiration. Today, of all the splendid buildings and monuments that composed the forum of Trajan but one remains intact, the great column which tells the story of Trajan's achievements.

It was after his return from the Dacian wars that Trajan, in 113 A. D., caused to be erected in the midst of the forum he had built this column, which was designed not only to perpetuate the memory of his Dacian victories, but also to afford a repository for his ashes, which were placed in a golden urn in a chamber under the column. Surviving eighteen centuries of wars and the corroding touch of time and of "brolls that root out the work of masonry," the column of Trajan is today one of the most beautiful of Roman works of art and a document in stone of priceless value to the historian.

Is of Grecian Marble.

The ancient name of this famous column was the Columna Colchis, so called from its winding stairs like the spiral of a shell, by which ascent was made from pedestal to top. It is built of huge blocks of Greek marble. The shaft, base and capital, not counting the pedestal, which measured eighteen feet in height, are exactly 100 Roman feet high (ninety-seven and a half modern English). In diameter the shaft measures twelve feet at the bottom, tapering gently to about ten feet under the capital. On the top of the capital, in its original form, stood a colossal gilt bronze statue of the emperor, nearly twenty feet high, holding an orb in one hand and a spear in the other. This statue was stolen and carried away during one of the inroads of the Byzantine emperors in the fifth century, and was replaced in the sixteenth century by the statue of St. Peter, which now surmounts the column.

The tall pedestal on which the column is built is richly decorated with reliefs of armor and trophies taken from the Dacians. On one side is a tablet carried by two figures of Victory and upon it is the dedicatory inscription. At each angle above the cornice of the pedestal is an eagle supporting a garland of flowers. Immediately beneath the tablet is the doorway to the spiral staircase, lighted by forty-two small openings. The winding stairs consist of 184 steps around a central newel, all of solid marble.

As beautiful a work of sculptured beauty as is the pedestal itself, the part of the column which most moves the modern beholder to wonder and astonishment is the shaft, which, standing on the tomb of the emperor, rises with its mass of relief wrought figures a hundred feet in the air. It is formed of twenty-three drums of marble, arranged in spiral bands of reliefs, which climb the column to the feet of the statue of the emperor which formerly stood upon its capital. Wrought into these stones are more than 2,500 figures, besides a great number of background accessories, worked out with great minuteness of detail, the figures varying in height from three feet at the bottom to nearly four feet at the top. The sculptures represent the complete history of Trajan's two Dacian campaigns, upon which his military renown rests, and the story is told in stone as a historian might tell it by the written word—

more graphically, perhaps, as it has the effect of a moving picture of those ancient days embayed in stone as if by some sudden enchantment.

History Wrought in Stone.

Chapter by chapter the entire history of the Dacian campaigns is revealed, with a continuity of thought and a precision of historical facts and verity of detail that are marvelous. The building of bridges, the natural difficulties of the country in which the wars were fought, the methods of siege and storm, advance and attack by land and river, in open field and against walled cities, the details of ancient military engineering, costume, arms and all implements of war, all these things are wrought there with such a wonderful fertility of design and dramatic vigor of expression as to form a veritable encyclopedia of Roman warfare of that period.

The whole of the column was originally covered with gold and color. Brilliant crimson, blue and yellow were largely used for the reliefs forming the main shaft and must have presented an appearance of barbaric splendor in the days of their pristine chromatic glory. Nor was this drama in stone enacted with its Hamlet left out. The figure of Trajan is everywhere with a predominant appeal. The idealized emperor is presented under all sorts of conditions that were calculated to redound to his glory, as the warrior leading his hosts, as the master engineer directing the mechanical constructions, as a leader of scouting forces, as a soldier sharing the hard lot of his fellow soldiers, as the "little father of his country," leading, directing, encouraging by example, at all times in the spotlight, the soul of the army and the soul of Rome.

SOUGHT TO REACH HEARTS

Doctor Holmes' Literary Efforts Well Described by the Writer of "Authors and Friends."

Doctor Holmes' social nature, as expressed in conversation and in his books, drew him into communication with a very large number of persons. It cannot be said, however, in this age marked by altruism, that he was altruistic; on the contrary, he loved himself and made himself his prime study—but as a member of the human race, he had his own purposes to fulfill, his own self-appointed tasks, and he preferred to take men only on his own terms. He was filled with righteous indignation, in reading Carlyle, to find a passage where, hearing the doorbell ring one morning when he was very busy, he exclaimed that he was afraid it was "the man Emerson!" Yet Doctor Holmes was himself one of the most carefully guarded men, through his years of actual production, who ever lived and wrote. His wife absorbed her life in his, and mounted guard to make sure that interruption was impossible. Nevertheless he was eminently a lover of men, or he could not have drawn them perpetually to his side. His writings were never aimed too high; his sole wish was to hit the heart, if possible; but if a shot hit the head also he showed a childlike pride in the achievement.—From "Authors and Friends," by Annie Fields.

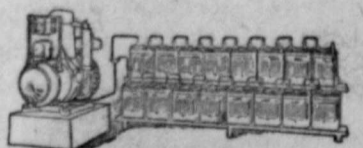
