PUBLIC HIGHWAYS

CLEAR SNOW FROM HIGHWAY.

Motortrucks Given Passageway for Carrying Coal and Various Other Supplies.

In an effort to keep all lines of supply open for uninterrupted traffic during the winter months, and to thus aid in minimizing the discomforts of the public, an appeal is going out to highway authorities throughout the country where snowfall is heavy, to keep the roads clear of snow.

Emphasis is placed upon the fact that the transportation of coal and other fuel is more important in winter than in summer, and that it is equally as important to keep rural

small routes and main market roads free from snow as it is to keep railroad tracks clear.

Officials connected with highway work anticipate a prompt response to this appeal. They report a decided increase in the interest of the public on this matter of prompt removal of snow from highways, not only to meet the necessity of keeping all sources of supply and communication in effective operation, but as a means of protecting the public's investment in roads.

If there were little or no demand for traffic during snow weather, highway authorities state the cost of snow removal would be justified. Snow melting on the roadbed tends to soften the subgrade and loosens the base under the wearing surface. Evidences of these damages may be seen after heavy snows in the late winter and early spring.

When snow is not removed on trunk highways, traffic gradually breaks its way through when thaw begins. The traffic will create one or two sets of ruts or tracks. The constant tracking in the same rut produces disastrous results to the road surface, making repairs difficult and expensive.

ACTIVITY IN HIGHWAY WORK

Up to July 1, 1919, State Bonds Aggregating \$224,800,000, Had Been Authorized.

Aside from money to be used co-operatively under the federal aid road act, aggregating nearly \$680,000,000, some states will expend large sums, and their several subdivisions will provide large additional amounts.

"It is interesting to note that up to July 1, 1919," says the secretary of agriculture in his annual report, "state bond issues aggregating \$224,800,000 had been authorized and approved by popular vote and that provision has been made for voting next year on proposals for the issuance of additional state road bonds to the extent of approximately \$314,000,000. During the present and the next fiscal year there will be made available for road improvement at least \$1,000,000,000. Certainly few laws, if any, have produced greater results, either in terms of expenditures for a good purpose, or in terms of helpful legislation, than the federal aid highway act. It seems clear, in the circumstances, that the principal limitations of the program will be in the provision of funds for road manufacturing organizations."

BUNGALOW MAKES ECONOMICAL HOME

Design Will Appeal to Man of Modest Means.

IS NOT EXPENSIVE TO BUILD

Five-Room Bungalow of Frame Cottage Type Makes Comfortable Home for the Family of Average Size.

Steadily increasing rentals are being demanded by the owners of houses of all kinds, and the person who has not a large income is finding it more difficult to find a comfortable home for himself and his family. While these families, perhaps, cannot afford to build an elaborate house, there are many designs that will provide a home that will suit their needs and their pocketbooks.

Such a home is shown in the accompanying illustration. Here is a house that is attractive in exterior appearance, contains five good-sized rooms, conveniently arranged, and can be built for a moderate sum. It is a one-story cottage, of the bungalow type, although not, strictly speaking, a bungalow. The lines of the exterior are good. The gables at either end and in the porch roof; the series of four windows in the living room; the fireplace chimney; the terrace with the brick floor and the porch, with its brick column supports, and the shingled walls all are features that combine to make this design attractive.

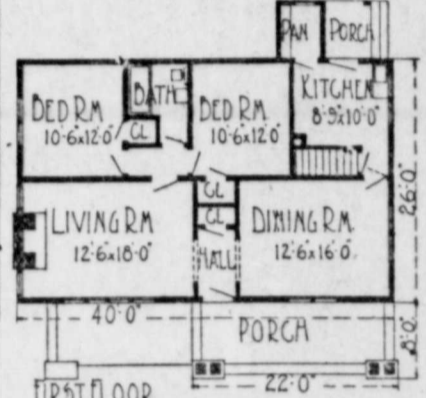
The dimensions of the house are 40 by 26 feet, with an 8-foot projection for the front porch. The house is of standard frame construction set on a brick foundation wall. The basement is fully excavated—that is, extends under the whole house, and provides ample room for the furnace, fuel storage and for rooms that can be devoted to storing food and the many other articles that usually find their way to the basement.

While the interior arrangement is somewhat out of the ordinary, a study of the floor plans will demonstrate that the rooms are placed so that the work can be done easily and that the occupants will find living in the house a comfort. The five rooms consist of living and dining rooms, kitchen and two bedrooms, besides the bathroom. The entrance is into a narrow hall that divides the living and dining

Home building this year will tax the capacity of the members of the building industry, and the manufacturers of building materials. The home builders who make their plans ahead of the time when actual operations in the colder sections of the country can begin, will be certain that their new homes will be erected during the year; those who wait, or many of them at least, will be disappointed, if the judgment of those familiar with building conditions is correct.

To those who have decided to build a home this year and to those who have just been "thinking" about it, the study of home building plans



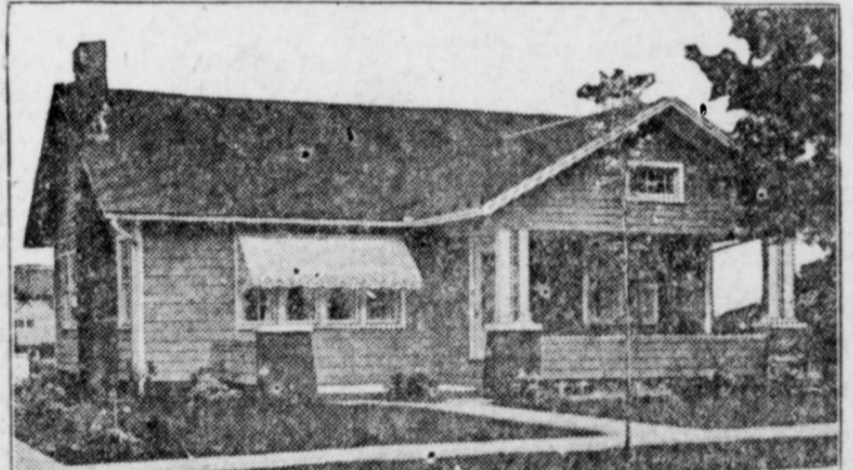
will be a pleasure. Books of plans, containing homes of all sizes and descriptions to be built of the many different kinds of materials, are available and can be secured from architectural dealers, contractors and building material dealers. These prospective home builders will find, make mighty interesting reading during the long winter evenings, and will go far toward helping in the selection of a home building design.

TRULY TIMES HAVE CHANGED

Modern Traveler Can Hardly "Do" Europe on Bayard Taylor's Modest Expenditure.

In his "Views Afoot," published seventy-three years ago, Bayard Taylor tells of being sick with a fever in Goettingen. He asked the landlord of the inn to send for a physician, and the latter sent for a professor of the university. Taylor writes:

"He made a second call the next day, when, as he was retiring, I inquired the amount of his fee. He begged to be excused, and politely bowed himself out. I asked the meaning of this of Herr Wilhelm, who said it was customary for travelers to leave what they chose for the physician, as there was no regular fee. He added, moreover, that twenty groschen, or



rooms, which are both front rooms and corner rooms. The living room is 18 by 12 feet 6 inches. At the end, in the outer wall is the fireplace. The dining room is of the same depth, but 16 instead of 18 feet wide. Double windows, one set looking onto the porch and the other in the end wall make this a cheerful, sunny room. Back of the dining room is the kitchen, 8 feet 9 inches, by 10 feet, with a good-sized pantry built into the outer wall and extending parallel with the back porch.

The two bedrooms are of equal size, 10 feet 6 inches by 12 feet, and are at either end of a short hall, which is entered through the living room. Between the bedrooms is the bathroom, which, it will be noted, is convenient to both sleeping rooms and the living room as well. Closet space is provided in connection with both bedrooms and in the entrance hall.

Taken from both the standpoint of exterior convenience and comfort, this design is an unusually good one for the home builder of limited means, who must provide for a family of average size—three or four persons.

Building a home to suit one's own needs and to conform to individual ideas of what a home should be in appearance and arrangement is the most satisfactory way of acquiring a more or less permanent place to live. By building, the owner can select the design, and decide on what materials shall be used. When a house is purchased already built, there usually is one or two that do not quite fit the purchaser's ideas of room arrangement, and often the remodeling cost of the house up would have required

about 60 cents, was sufficient for the two visits."

By the way, Taylor made that two years' trip through Europe, covering England, Scotland, Ireland, Belgium, North and South Germany, Bohemia, Austria, Switzerland, Italy and France for a total expense of less than \$500, including transportation from New York and back. He couldn't do that today.—Los Angeles Times.

CONDIMENTS OF MUCH VALUE

Spices Used in Flavoring Not Generally Given Credit for Their Good Qualities.

Some of the spices that are often employed in flavoring preserves, both of fruits and meats, have a value that is more important than the mere tickling of the palate. An investigation recently made in France shows that vinegar is not only an excellent preservative but a powerful means of killing bacteria.

Ginger, black, white and red pepper have little bactericidal effect, but the action of mustard is most marked. However, the best of all are cloves and cinnamon, which act through their essential oils (called eugenol and cinnamic aldehyde).

La Nature remarks that these researches are highly important, for they show that, even in the small quantities in which they are used these spices may be employed in preserving far better than chemical antiseptics, such as boric and salicylic acids, which are often added, though the French law prohibits their use.

Concrete Examples Given to Show That Practice is Worthy of Dairyman's Attention.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

There are many reasons why cows should be entered in a cow testing association. These reasons are good reasons. But the real story—the story in which all are interested—is told on the balance side of the ledger. In other words, "does it pay?" and here are some concrete examples furnished by the United States dairy division from the South Chittenden Cow Testing association, Vermont, where cow testing did pay.

In one herd the average production of milk per cow was raised from 4,387 pounds in the year 1917-18, to 5,331 pounds in 1918-19, and at the same

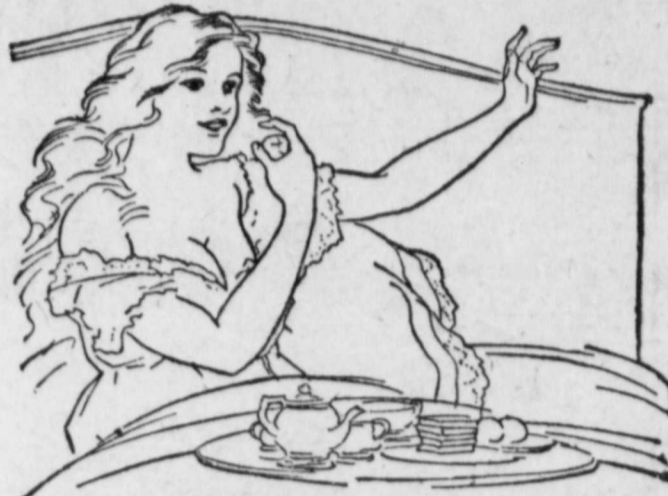


Weighing the Milk.

Frontiers used to be "imaginary lines" or marks on a map. The miles and miles of new frontiers in Europe are not "imaginary" and not confined to maps. You can walk right up and touch them.

Out there in central and eastern Europe, frontiers are fine-tooth combs, that delay trains for hours at every crossing point. Some of the new frontiers are "flying walls" of soldiers with fixed bayonets. Others are guarded fences.

Travelers without exceptional credentials go through searching examinations, often bodily "friskings."

Soldiers armed to the teeth guard the trains and passengers during examinations and customs inspections, to see that nobody gets out or in without the official papers.

Roads at frontier points are also guarded by soldiers who preside over striped gates that go up and down like the crossing gates of American railways.

Passports and visas in the new countries are made as difficult as possible. Business men are held up weeks, as a rule. The official idea seems to be to keep everybody that's in the country in, and to bar everybody else out.

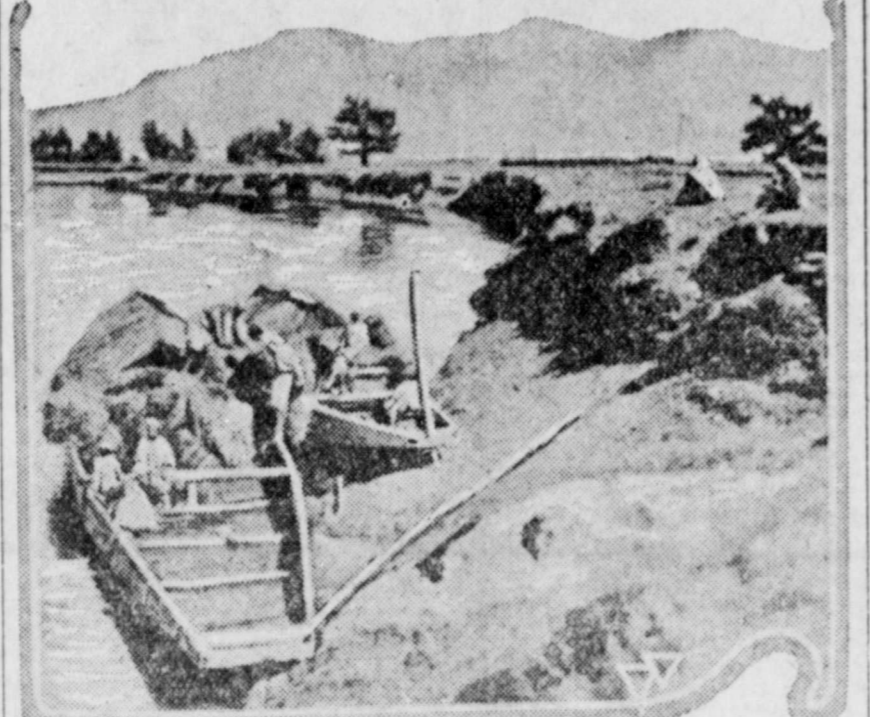
