## ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HEDLEY, TEXAS CHAPTER XVI

Article 60. Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Hedley, Donley county, Texas: That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to drive or cause to be driven any motor vehicle or motor cycle within the corporate limits of the city of Hedley at a speed that will exceed fifteen miles per hour.

Article 61. Any person or persons violating this ordinance may be fined in any sum not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars.

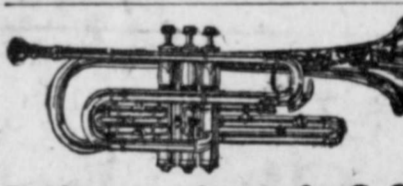

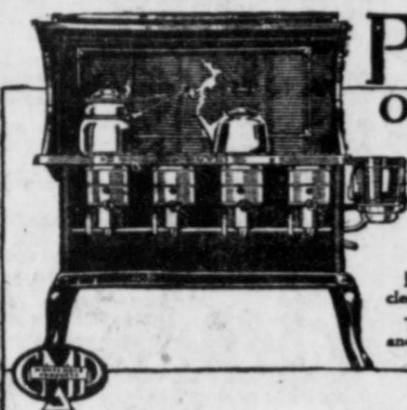

Whereas, Zoe Bidwell Nix did, on the 14th day of June, 1920, file her petition in the District Court of Donley County, Texas, numbered 1081 on the civil docket of said court, wherein the said Zoe Bidwell Nix is plaintiff and Dothan H. The nature of plaintiff's cause of action is a suit for divorce up on the grounds of abandonment and for the exclusive care and custody of Hershel Nix, the sole surviving issue of said marriage, the abandonment alleged to be for more than three years and alleging that plaintiff has custody of the said Hershel, and that she is able to educate and maintain him, and that her father, Fred Bidwell, is ready, able and willing to assist her in the education and maintenance and nurture of the said Hershel.

Herein fail not, but have these before said court on the first day of the next term thereof, with your return thereon, in writing, showing how you have executed the same.

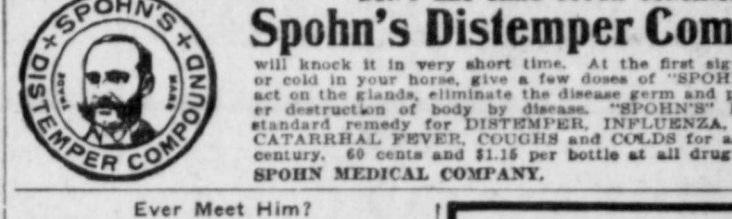
