ministrators and left teachers saddled with too much paperwork.

The City of Bovina received it
monthly sales tax rebate from th state Comptroller
Accounts this week. The check was for $\$ 2,736.80$. This was down by $\$ 565.02$ from
the check which was received at the same time a year ago.
For the calendar year, the city has received checks totalling
$\$ 9,630.05$, down from $\$ 10,768.13$ the previous year. This
cent decrease overall
Virtually every rural county in
West Texas, with agriculture oil-related industries, showed decrease in their sales tax receipts
from the previous year. from the previous year. Th
exception was Deaf Smith County which was up almost five per cent. This can be attributed to some new

per cent and Dallas by five pe per cent and Dallas by five pe
