I heartily endorse you for the office in question, and it will be a pleasure to me to lend you any influence I may have towards securing that office.

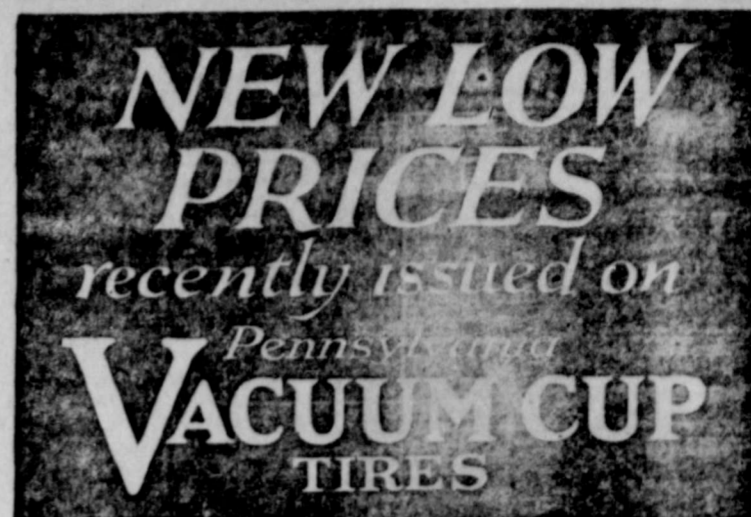

## Uncommon Sense . . .

### KEEP BRAKES IN ORDER

AT THE approach to every dangerous turn of a state road is a sign which reads:

#### GO SLOW.

The automobilist who has been sense and good brakes heeds the warning. He gets around the turn without anything happening to him.

The speed maniac, or the man whose brakes are out of order, keeps right on. And we usually read of one or both in the accident columns of the newspapers, sooner or later.

The road we all must take is pretty well marked with warnings, although it takes experience to read some of them.

If we have the brake called will power, and keep it in trim, we have nothing to fear from the dangerous places.

If our judgment is bad and our will power likely to give way we never get where we are going, except in a very badly damaged condition.

There is no occasion for such great hurry that the warning signs must be over-run.

On the road to wealth, and especially the road to pleasure, the warnings are very abundant.

Yet thousands and thousands of people run past them every day, with the usual disastrous results.

There is little enough time in the average life. We must all work rapidly if we are to get a good lifetime's work accomplished in the working years that are allotted us.

But we can always slow down at the risky corner, provided we keep our will power in condition, and use the judgment that ought to be a part of our make-up.

The "too much play" turn in the road is more dangerous than the "too much work" corner, but it is well to slow up at both of them.

Then the "overindulgence" and "late hour" spots call for almost a halt.

Read all the signs and observe them. It is delightful to speed along the road and feel that we shall get where we are going in jig time.

### YOUR HAND

How to Read Your Characteristics and Tendencies—the Capabilities or Weaknesses That Make for Success or Failure as Shown in Your Palm

ILLNESS SHOWN IN THE HAND.

TROUBLES with the throat are indicated in the hand by nails that are moderately long, but are thin and brittle. Typhoid fever may be dreaded if there is a small square on the line of life, with a St. Andrew's cross inside, and generally with a bluish dent. Wounds are shown by spots on the line of the heart, and the line of the head will be seen to be broken under the line of Saturn, in both hands, with the two fragments overlaying each other. A wound inflicted in a fight has its mark or sign in a spot on the upper mount of Mars, and if there are fine lines on the mount of Jupiter (at the base of the forefinger), with a star at the line of the head, we may foretell or read a wound in the head.

It must be remembered, of course, that while the hand affords many valuable indications of illness, past, present, or to come, these signs should never be used to supersede or supplant diagnosis by medical experience. Palmistry is not a science sufficiently exact for that.

### Huge Airplane Has Radio.

There has been installed on one of the huge Goliath biplanes engaged in the Paris-London aerial service a combined radio telephone and telegraph equipment of 35 watts antenna outfit, with the sending range of about 180 miles at 900 meters' wave length. The complete radio equipment weighs only 125 pounds. An air-propeller-driven generator for six volts and 700 volts and a six-volt storage battery supply the necessary current. A three-bulb amplifier is used for receiving on all wave lengths between 300 meters and 1,000 meters.—Radio Electrician.

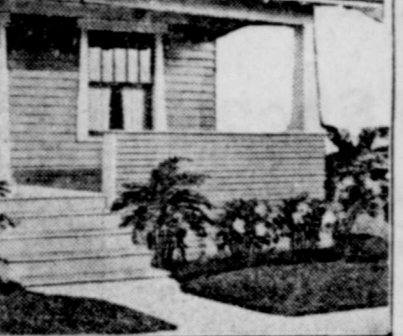

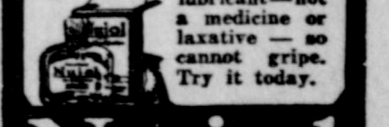
