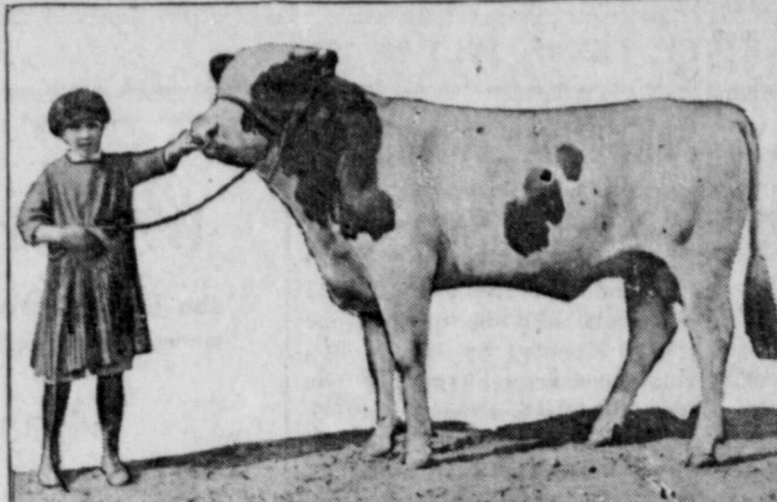

Edith Clarke, age eleven, was the proudest girl in Wisconsin when she purchased Wayside Sir Oille Longfield, a registered Holstein yearling sire at the Green county sale held at Monroe.

Two years ago the two Clarke girls started in the Rock county junior clubs, organized by the Holstein Breeders' association and the farm bureau.

Edith's Holstein calf—Snowgirl Oak Lodge—won second place at the Wisconsin state fair, with a Rock county entry in first place, and the next day

placed first in the junior exhibit with her sister close behind. Nor did these two girls stop there. Edith won the junior prize at the National Dairy show and won the blue ribbon at the Wisconsin Junior Live Stock exposition held at the Wisconsin College of Agriculture, Madison.

The two girls invested their club winnings in live stock. They now own seven head of registered Holsteins, two ponies, eight purebred sheep, including the new-bull, a grandson of Iowa Sir Oille, national grand champion in 1919. They will put the calf in the Rock county show herd and hope to win at the state fairs and national dairy show this year.

CUNNINGHAM OF IOWA GIVEN GREAT HONOR

"Dirt Farmer" Appointed to Federal Reserve Board.

E. H. Cunningham is the farmers' representative on the federal reserve board. The appointment was recently made by President Harding. Mr. Cunningham is a "dirt farmer." With his son he operates a 320-acre farm at Cresco, Ia. For three years Mr. Cunningham has served as secretary for the Iowa Farm Bureau federation. He has also served as president of the United States Grain Growers, Inc. and is now a member of the board of directors of the National Live Stock Producers' association.

Mr. Cunningham is noted for his vigorous championship of the farmer's

cause. It is a favorite story among the farmers of Iowa that when the federal reserve board came into that state after the war and ordered the farmers to sell their products on a demoralized market and pay their notes at the bank, to "deflate" all costs.

The appointment is a popular one. The congratulations and the support of the farmers go with Mr. Cunningham into his important new work.

BIG PROFIT ON COTTON SEED

Farmers of Louisiana Parish Also Make Big Saving in Purchase of Soil Fertilizers.

A profit of \$3 a ton on cotton seed, and savings of \$5.25 a ton on six carloads of acid phosphate and \$15 to \$18 a ton on three carloads of nitrate of soda for the last few months is the record in dollars and cents gained by farmers of Webster parish, Louisiana, who are members of the parish farm bureau according to L. A. Miller, secretary of the local organization.

This is not only dollars made but it is dollars saved," Mr. Miller said. "Our accomplishments so far are only a drop in the bucket compared with the increased advantages we are going to gain over our short-sighted nitrate-bureau neighbors who continue to buy and sell individually against an organized world."

CO-OPERATIVE MILK MARKETING COMPANY

Illinois Organization Has Experienced Big Growth.

When successful co-operative dairy marketing organizations of Illinois are mentioned, the name of the Stephenson County Co-operative Milk Marketing company, immediately comes to mind. Organized in February, 1921, and opening up for business the following April, the co-operative has experienced a remarkable growth and now has almost 1,000 farmer-members.

During the second year's business just closed the sales of the company totaled \$518,364.55, or an average of \$43,197.04 per month. The running expenses were \$61,742.57 and \$411,645.56 was paid to patrons for products and in the 7 per cent dividend for stock.

A total of 13,129,766 pounds of milk and 1,704,000 pounds of cream was handled by the plant during the year. The following is an itemized account of the sources of sales:

Butter, which easily constitutes the largest single item of sales, is sold under the brand name, "Vita Gold." It scores 90 per cent or over and commands one cent above the top price on the Chicago market.

Organization of the milk marketing company was effected by the Stephenson county farm bureau, in co-operation with the dairy marketing department of the Illinois Agricultural association. Much of the success of the association is due to the efforts of G. F. Baumeister, for the past five years county farm adviser, and Alfred Abrenzen, the present manager.

Local stations effect a much more efficient organization than would one central group to which all farmers are members. Locals are located at Dakota, Damascus, German Valley, Egan, Belleville, Forreston, Shannon, Pearl City, Lena and Waddams Grove. Farmers belonging to these locals have their officers and are represented on the governing committee of the association. No man can purchase more than five shares of stock in the company, and every stockholder must be a producer.

General satisfaction in their organization is being expressed by the large majority of the membership in the co-operative. They receive from 75 cents to \$1 more per hundred pounds for their milk than was the case prior to organization. With this new incentive of an excellent market in their own co-operative association, milk producers tributary to the Stephenson county plant have shown a new interest in dairying and the industry is being rapidly boosted in the territory.

FILLED MILK IS PROHIBITED

Law Passed in New Hampshire Forbidding Sale and Manufacture After Hot Fight.

A law prohibiting the manufacture and sale of filled milk has just been enacted in New Hampshire after a strenuous fight. In addition to this anti-filled milk measure, a law has been enacted prohibiting false advertising of dairy substitutes. Credit for the passage of these measures goes to the New Hampshire Farm Bureau federation.

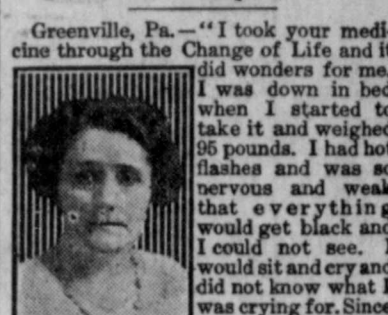

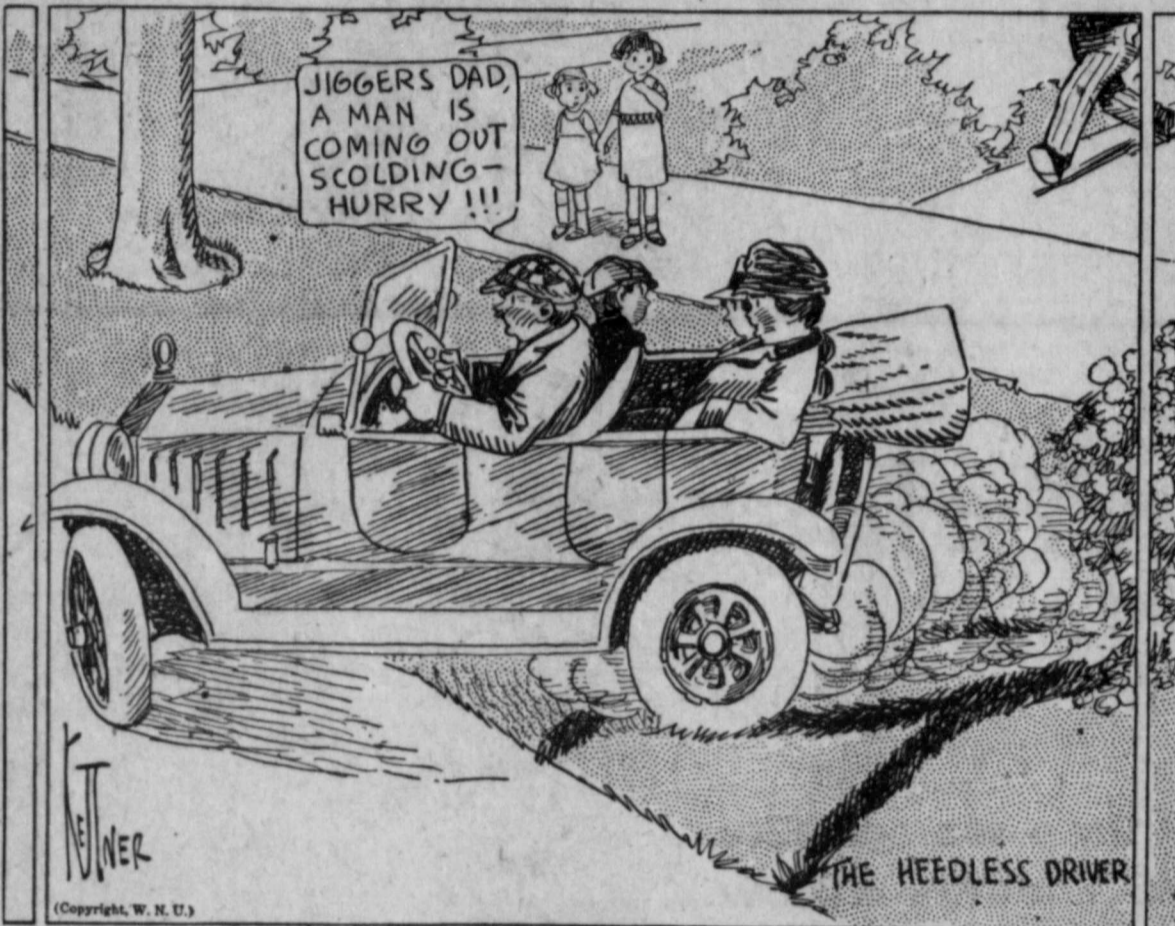

DAIRY FACTS

SUPERIOR SIRES HELP DAIRY

Improvement Means Mating of Females Already in Herd With Purebred Bulls.

In most cases dairy herd improvement must mean the mating of such females as are already in the herd with a superior male, says the New York State College of Agriculture at Ithaca. If the superior characters in the sire are more likely to be transmitted than the less desirable ones in the dams, the sire's more desirable qualities will predominate in the daughters.

One of the most outstanding examples of what a good sire can do in a purebred herd is in the case of Embagnard Tritonia Homestead. This bull, still unproved, was purchased in 1911 by the University of Illinois, but his ancestors had been excellent as producers or as transmitters of production. The first ten daughters of this bull to freshen gave as two-year-olds an average increased production over that of their dams of 3,907.7 pounds of milk and 160.65 pounds of butterfat.

The value of good purebred sires in grading up scrub or grade cows was shown at the Iowa State college in an experiment starting in 1907. Native scrub cattle from Arkansas were graded up through the continuous use of purebred sires. The granddaughters had an average increase of 4,471.7 pounds of milk and 186.00 pounds of butterfat over their scrub dams.

FALL CALVES ARE PREFERRED

Young Animal Develops Sufficiently During Winter to Get Some Good From Pasture.

With many farmers it is the practice to have the cows freshen in the spring. There is much to be said in favor of fall-calving. In a fall-calving schedule, there is usually more available help for caring for the calf and it gets better attention during the first few months of its life. The fall calf is kept in the barn and is more constantly under the observation of the caretaker, so that any disturbance is much more likely to be detected.

During the winter months the calf develops sufficiently so that by the following spring, it is old enough to get some good from the pasture. A six-month-old calf cannot, however, depend entirely on pasture for its feed. Flies and hot weather are particularly bad for the little calf and spring calves suffer a great deal because of them.

It requires a great deal of care and attention to give the calf a proper start. Such attention is seldom given when the crops are being put in and cultivated. There are other practical advantages of fall freshening which do not directly affect the calf. The dairy farmer can usually plan his breeding so that the majority of his calves will be dropped at the most favorable season of the year.

DETERMINE VALUE OF BULL

Do Not Send Animal to Butcher Until He Has Had Chance to Prove Himself.

It is a mistake to dispose of a bull that has any prospects whatever until his true value is determined by his progeny. Many a dairy bull has gone to the block only for it to be found later on that some of his daughters are making fine records. You cannot tell much about the record of a bull until he is about seven years old, and he has to be about seven years old before much can be told of his breeding qualities. Do not butcher an animal that may be the making of your herd, until he has had a fair chance to prove himself.

ESSENTIAL TO MILK COW DRY

Pays to Spend Few Minutes in Stripping Udder to Make Sure of Getting All Milk.

Milking cows dry is essential. When milk is left in the udder after each milking, the glands will gradually slow up on secreting milk and ultimately the cow will dry up. It pays to spend a few extra minutes stripping the udder to make certain that all the milk has been extracted.

ROOTS DESIRABLE FOR COWS

Greatest Objection to Mangels is Amount of Labor Involved in Harvesting.

Mangels or roots make a very desirable feed for dairy cows. The greatest objection is the labor involved in growing, harvesting and storing them. This renders them more expensive than silage and for this reason they are seldom grown in large quantities where it is practical to build silos and fill them with a satisfactory crop.

Pigs Require Good Care.

It isn't the number of pigs that are farrowed so much as the number saved that counts. The first ten days in a pig's life are the most critical. Give both sow and her litter special attention then.

Benefits From Cows.

Cows earn while they are making the soil richer. During the bad weather when farmers cannot work in the field they may feed and milk cows and thus receive wages for their labor in addition to improving the soil.

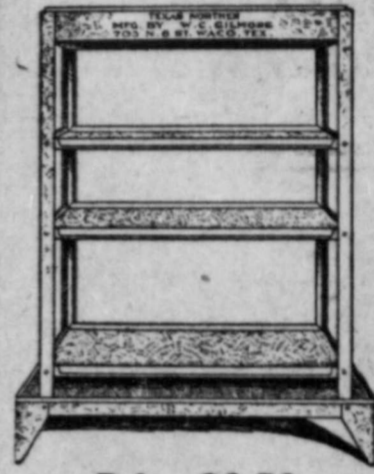
