YES, WE HAVE NO WATER AND LIGHTS

If you were thinking of making a change in location—of moving your family to another town—you would first find out some things about that town. And if you are a good man, with the proper regard for your family's comfort and welfare, the following are among the first inquiries you'd make:

No 1 Have you good churches and schools?
No 2 Have you good farming lands to back up the town?
No 3 Is there plenty of good water?

Hedley people could look any man in the eye and answer the first two questions in the affirmative. We have seven organized religious denominations, with adequate church buildings, and unusually large and active memberships, population considered. We have a splendid school with excellent faculty and a present enrollment of 425, and more coming when crops are in. As to farm lands, thirty years without a crop failure is a mighty hard record to beat. Some of us cuss the country sometimes, when the winds blow and sands fly, and every summer a lot of us just know we're going to dry up and burn up absolutely—but we don't; and the plain, solemn fact is that, year in and year out, less than half of the fine \$300 land in Texas produces crops that equal ours here at Hedley. But—

What about No 3? When they ask us about plenty of good water, unless we're trying for a hot air altitude record, we're simply got to admit that there's nothing doing. And it is entirely reasonable to believe that in the case of many families who entertained the idea of moving to Hedley, the balance swung against us on account of this one thing.

In view of the fact that the installing of a water system would be a "dead certain" paying investment, and not a dead expense, how much longer will we stand in our own light by falling or refusing to do something?
