ORDINANCE No. 29

An Ordinance Prohibiting Owners of Chickens, Ducks, Turkeys, Guinea and Other Fowls from Allowing Said Fowls to Run at Large Within the Corporate Limits of the City of Hedley, Texas, and Providing a Penalty Therefor.

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Hedley, Texas, that owners of chickens, ducks, turkeys, guinea and other fowls are prohibited from allowing said fowls to run at large within the corporate limits of the City of Hedley, Texas.

Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance, or any of them, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined in any sum not less than Five Dollars and not more than Twenty five Dollars, and each day on which the provisions of this Ordinance, or any of them, are violated, shall constitute a separate offense.

This Ordinance to be in effect from 27th day of September, 1929.

PUBLIC SCHOOL NOTES AND THE P. T. A.

Preparations are being made for the opening of school next Monday, Sept 9. Due to the fact that the new high school building will not be completed, it will be necessary to use one of the church buildings as a classroom.

All parents and patrons of the school are invited to be present at the opening exercise which will be held in the school auditorium at 9:30 a. m. Monday.

In case students care to transfer in from other schools for high school purposes, they may do so any time during the school year. Grade children must transfer before August first.

The opening of school, Sept. 9, will also be Rally Day for the local P. T. A., and we hope to enlist as members every parent teacher and all others who are interested in the educational and social standard of home, school and community. Did you know that the Parent Teacher Association is the only organization in Texas that works exclusively for child welfare, and that its main object is to bring into closer relation the home and the school, that parents and teachers may co-operate more intelligently in the education of the child? And as a great writer has said, "For what grander, holier purpose under heaven does a human being need knowledge than for the training of a child?"

A new feature that has been adopted this year is that each member paying dues, and having name sent in to our State Secretary at Austin, will receive a membership certificate, so we urge that everyone come on first day of school and give name and dues to either of the membership committee, composed of Mrs. Beaty, Mrs. Clyde Bridges, Mrs. Lake Hart, Mrs. Abe Vinyard, Mrs. Herlie Moreman and Mrs. O. R. Culwell, so that our enrollment may be completed and the names sent in soon as possible, as this will be necessary for us to hold our affiliation with State and National work. We are also a unit of the County Federation. So let's hold our P. T. A. up to the high standard that has already been attained, as we took second honors at the District Convention last term.

Our first regular meeting will be on afternoon of Sept. 19th, in auditorium, immediately after school dismissals.
