## Bovina Youth Critical After Bike Accident

By MARSHAL JERRY ATCHLEY On Saturday, March 17 at 2:45 p.m., a local youth was injured in an auto-bicycle accident at the corner of Avenue D and Halsell.

An automobile, driven by William Gromowsky, was traveling east on Avenue D and the bicycle ridden by eight-year-old Chris Zehner was traveling south on Halsell. There was an unidentified vehicle stopped at the stop sign on Halsell facing

The Zehner youth passed the stopped car and went into the intersection. William Gromowsky attempted to stop when he saw the boy on the bicycle, but there just wasn't enough time.

Gromowsky pulled his vehicle to his right in an effort to miss the bicycle, but the bicycle hit his car on the left front where the fender meets the door. Young Zenher was thrown over the bicycle and his left shoulder and the back of the left side of his head hit the windshield. He then fell to the pavement.

The accident was heard by Marshal Jerry Atchley, Mrs. Atchley, and Deputy John Vaughn who were half a block away, and they rushed to the scene. Deputy Vaughn arrived first and saw that the Zenher youth needed immediate help. Vaughn administered mouth to mouth resuscitation and brought the Zehner youth oxygen to start him breating again. 4

Marshal Atchley contacted the Bovina Ambulance Service, which arrived approximately five minutes later. After caring for the Zehner youth, they transported him to Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona.

The boy received emergency treatment and then was transported to Amarillo to Northwest Texas Hospital by the Friona Ambulance Service.

Chris is the son of Mr. and Mrs.

Jim Zehner of Bovina. He is currently in the Intensive Care Unit at Northwest Texas Hospital, Amarillo.

The elections are scheduled for Saturday, April 7, and any voters who believe they will be out of town that day may cast absentee ballots.





TYPICAL TORNADO-PRODUCING CLOUD....The form of the usual tornado-producing cloud is anvilshaped at its crest with a rougher overshooting top at the dome. Mamma, which appear to be

balloon-shaped formations, may drop from the anvil shape. At ground-level the common appearance is rain falling from a shelf cloud, usually in the northeastern portion of the parent cloud. Southwest of this there will be a wall cloud, sometimes with a horizontal tail cloud at the forward or northeast lower portion of it. This tail cloud is not the tornado. The tornado itself forms typically at the southwest

lower edge of this wall cloud. Behind the tornado there is not likely to be rain, but, instead, a precipitationfree cloud base. (Drawing courtesy Texas Tech University Institute For Disaster Research.)

The Secretary of this Board of Trustees shall post on the bulletin board in the building where the Board of Trustees meets the names of all candidates that have filed their applications in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Order,

and said Secretary shall otherwise comply with the terms and provisions of Art. 13.32 of the Election Code.

Election Order & Notice

3. That said election shall be held at the following places, and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election:

(a) at Bovina High School Building, in Bovina, Texas, in said School District, with Leslie McCain as Presiding Judge and Patsy Sherrill, Ernestine Minter and Don Murphy, Clerks.

The polls at the above designated polling places shall on election day be open from 7 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.

4. Patsy Nance is hereby

appointed Clerk for absentee voting, and are hereby appointed Deputy Clerks for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at Ridgelea Elementary School within the boundaries of the above named School District and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting

which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 9 to 12 a.m. and 1 to 5 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee Clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent.

6. The manner of holding said election shall be governed, as nearly as may be, by the Election Code of this state, and this Board of Trustees will furnish all necessary ballots and other election supplies requisite to said election.

7. Immediately after the votes have been counted, the officers holding said election shall make and deliver the returns of said election and perform all other duties as provided by the Election Code.

8. The Board of Trustees shall give notice of said election, and this combined Election Order and Notice shall serve as Notice for said election. The President of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and instructed to post or cause to have posted said combined Election Order and Notice at three public places where notices are customarily posted in this school district, and said posting shall be made at least 20 days before the date of said election.

The President shall also cause a copy of this combined Election Order and Notice to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the

county where this school district is located. Said publication shall be not more than 30 days nor less than 10 days before the date of said election.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary posted written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board located in the central administrative office of this school district, a place convenient and readily accessible to the general public, and said notice, having been so posted, remained posted for at least 72 hours preceding the scheduled time of said

meeting. It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary furnished a notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting to the county clerk of Parmer County, Texas, the county in which most, if not all, of this school district's pupils re-




