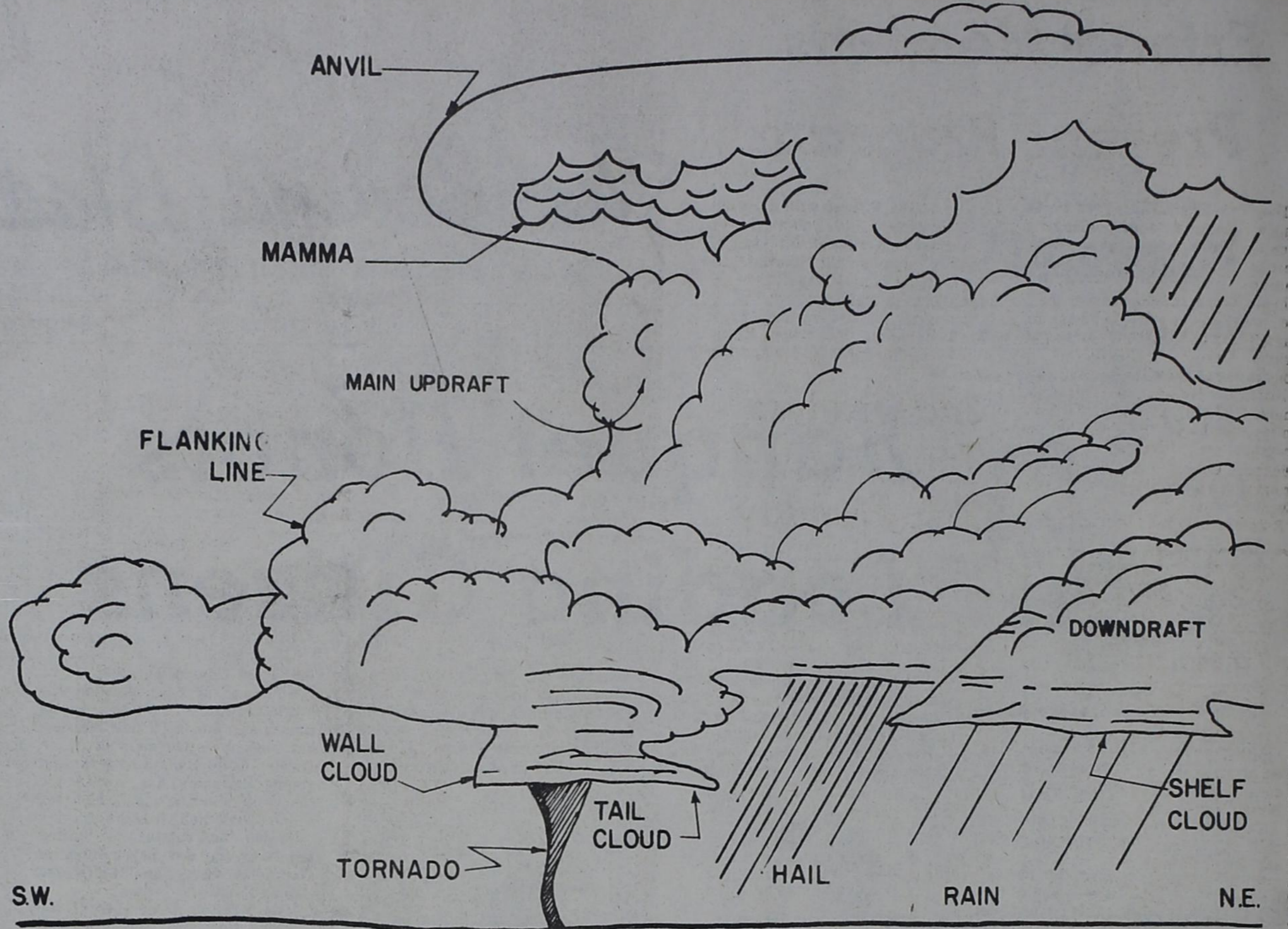

**TYPICAL TORNADO-PRODUCING CLOUD....**The form of the usual tornado-producing cloud is anvil-shaped at its crest with a rougher overshooting top at the dome. Mamma, which appear to be

balloon-shaped formations, may drop from the anvil shape. At ground-level the common appearance is rain falling from a shelf cloud, usually in the northeastern portion of the parent cloud.

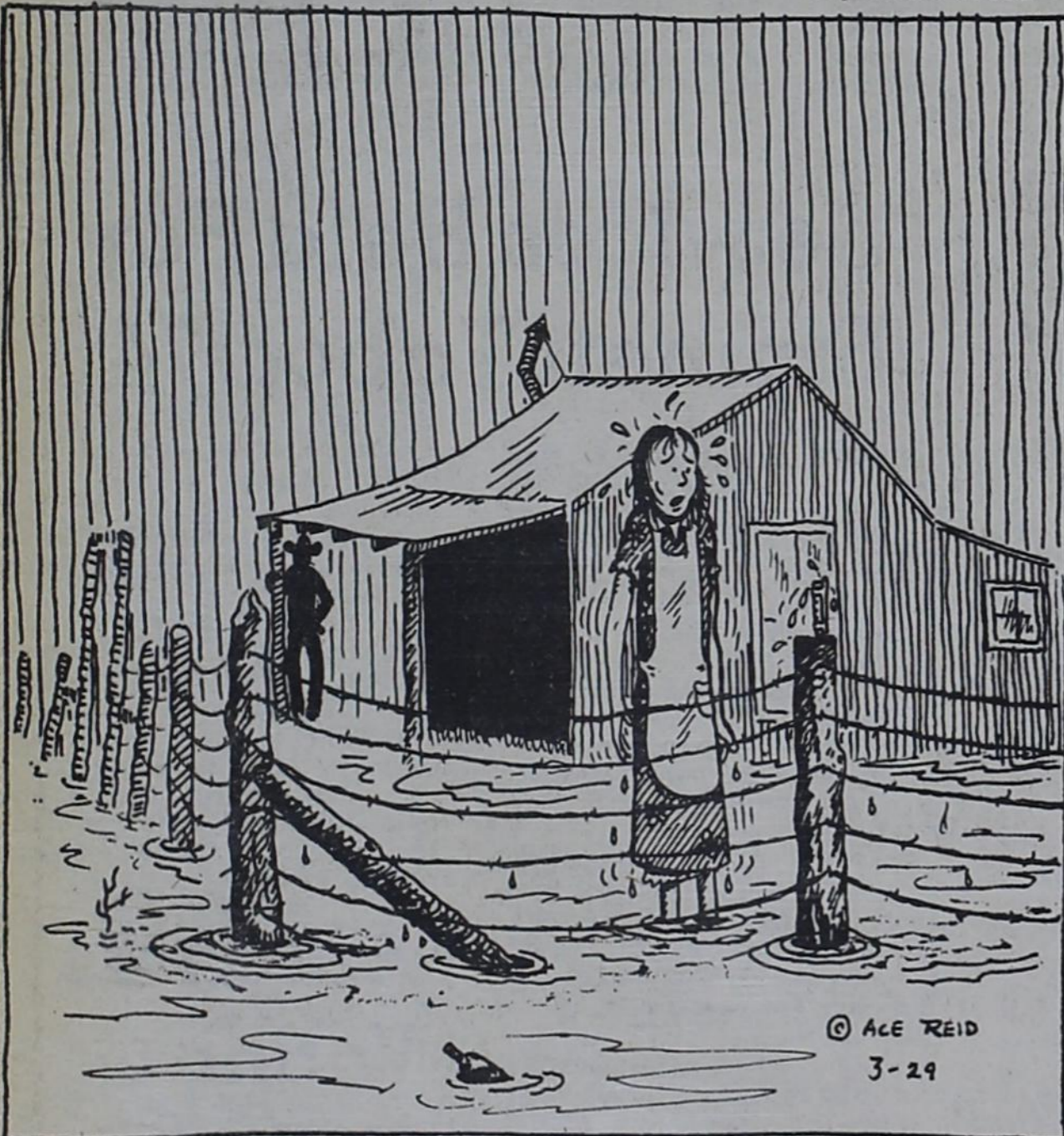
Southwest of this there will be a wall cloud, sometimes with a horizontal tail cloud at the forward or northeast lower portion of it. This tail cloud is not the tornado. The tornado itself forms typically at the southwest

lower edge of this wall cloud. Behind the tornado there is not likely to be rain, but, instead, a precipitation-free cloud base. (Drawing courtesy Texas Tech University Institute For Disaster Research.)

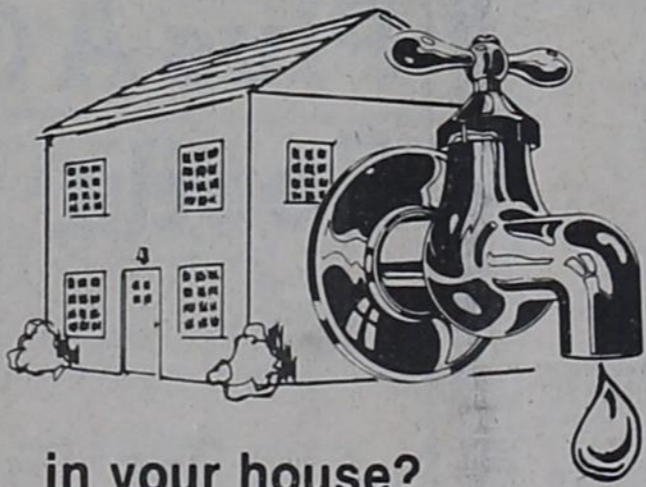

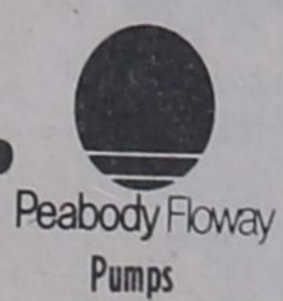

## Bike-A-Thon Slated For Cystic Fibrosis

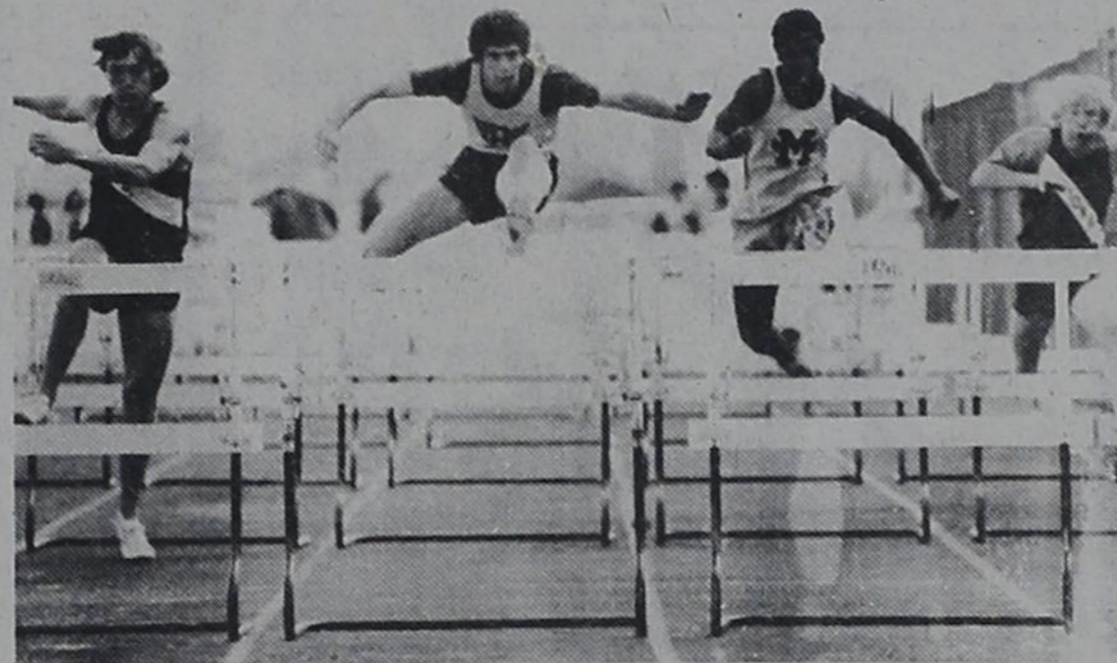

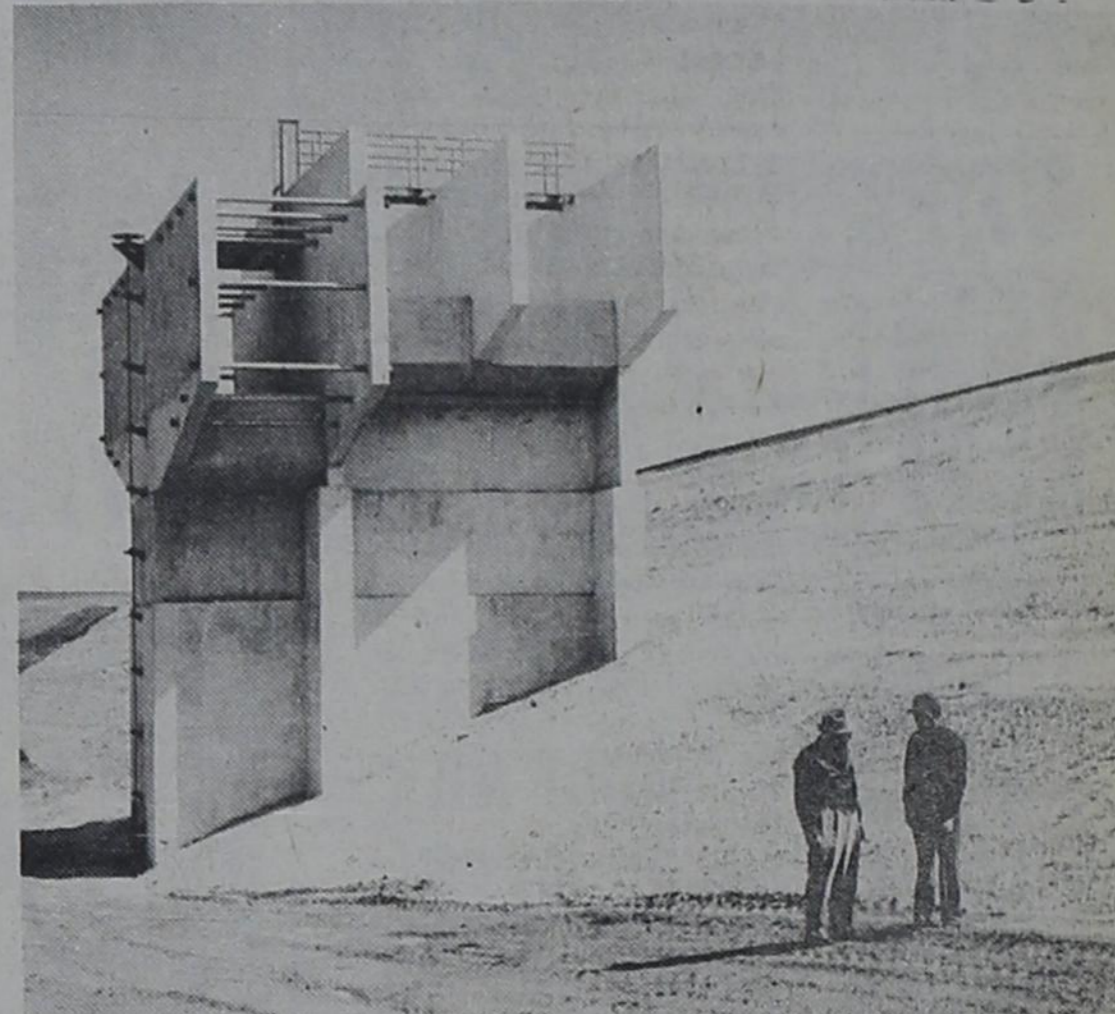
The Bike-A-Thon will be held on Sunday, April 8 from 2-5 p.m.

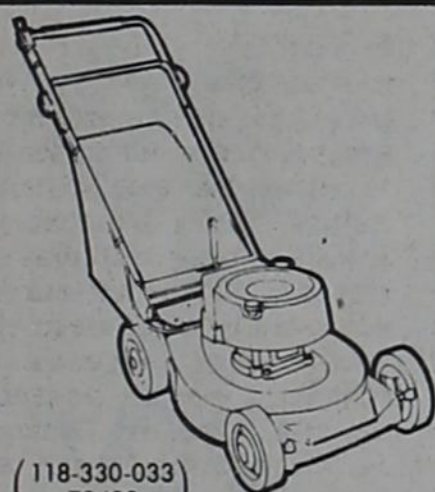
