DON'TS Safety Is Watchword For a Merry Christmas

Here are a few "don'ts" for Christmas, recommended by safety authorities:

1. Don't give small children toys involving alcohol, kerosene or gasoline engines. They may tip over and set the house on fire.

2. Don't permit small children to run electrical toys without the supervision of an adult.

3. Don't permit small children to use toy movie projectors without using safety film which burns slowly. Ordinary film burns explosively and gives off smoke and fumes which may cause death if inhaled.

4. Don't use candles or light extra fires without being extremely careful, especially in regard to candles on trees.

5. Don't wear inflammable costumes, especially Santa Claus beards, without fireproofing them.

6. Don't use inflammable ornaments and evergreen decorations.

Quickly Made Dolls For Late Gift Choice

HERE is a boy and a girl doll that you can make quickly. The body is two tubes of material made of fabric stitched together to simulate socks and shoes and then stitched, turned and stuffed as indicated at the left of this sketch. The head is a two-inch ball of cloth covered first with cotton and then with tightly



stretched cloth sewed in the back as in steps 1 and 2. The wig is made as in step 3. The diagram shows how the tubes and the head are sewn together. Sew across the top of the legs to make the doll jointed. Sew the arms down and the tips of the feet up as indicated. Sew clear through the head when adding the head eyes about half way between the top and bottom. This shapes the cheeks. A few stitches in red make the mouth. The pleated skirt is cut straight. The trousers are slightly shaped in the crotch. The sweaters are made from the striped tops of children's socks.

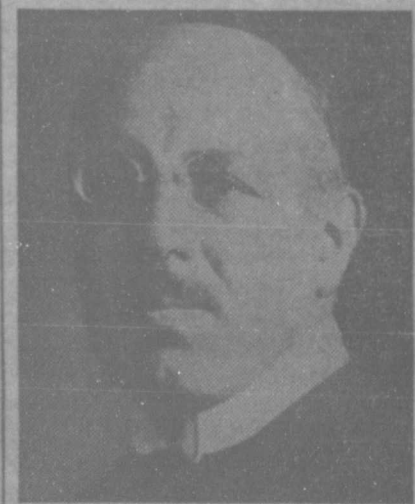

Comment from Britain's publicity-wise George Bernard Shaw: "Finland would probably not have refused the Russian offer... had she been acting... in her own interests, but Russia believes that Finland thinks she has the backing of America and other western powers."

Meanwhile, the Finnish legation in Washington announced calmly that its ever-prompt war debt payment of \$24,893 will be made as due this month.

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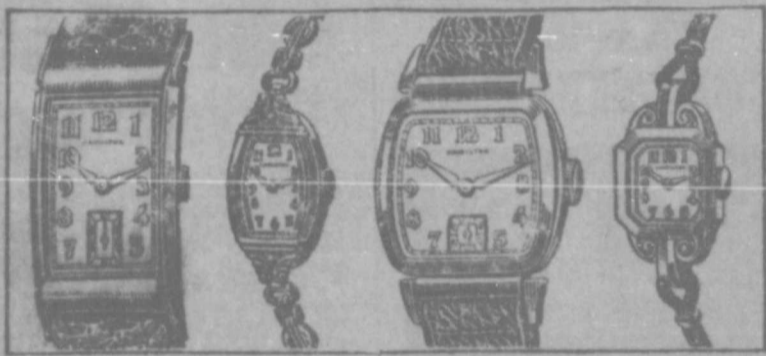

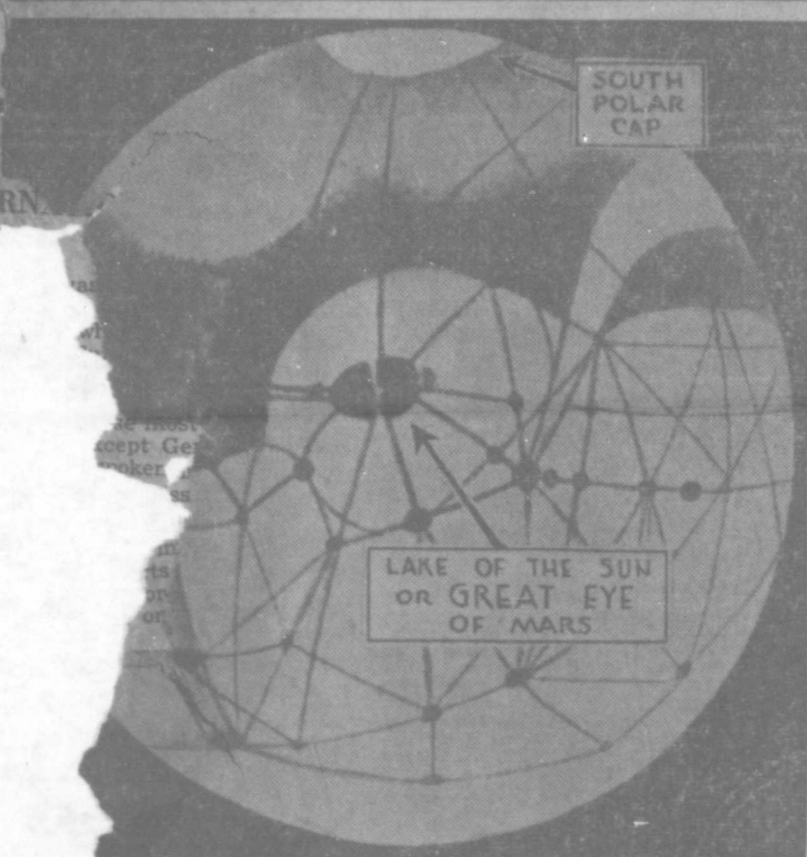

U. S. Growers Trade Priced Tobacco To Netherlands for Sumatra Leaf

NEW YORK.—American tobacco trade with the Netherlands is a two-way exchange that strikes a rough balance financially—but not on the scales. In recent years the United States has been selling about \$2,500,000 worth of low-price tobacco and buying about the same value at high prices—Sumatra wrappers at about \$1 a pound. It takes about 20,000,000 pounds of exports to offset 2,500,000 pounds of imports, the foreign agricultural service reports.

Sumatra wrappers are bought through the exchange auction sales. In per capita use of tobacco, the Netherlands compares with the United States, but has preferred cigars and smoking tobacco. Recently cigarettes have been gaining. Until 1930 the Oriental type was favored. Since then there has been a shift toward the English type—made almost exclusively from fine-cured tobacco—and to the blended American type. The Netherlands now imports about 150,000,000 American-made cigarettes and an additional 125,000,000 from England. Nearly half the cigarettes retail at the equivalent of about 8 cents for a package of 20, and about seven-eighths of the total consumption sells at the equivalent of two for a quarter or less.

National Guard Tests New York Anti-Aircraft Defense



National Guardsmen of Battery D, 212th coast artillery unit, only National Guard anti-aircraft unit in New York state, load a three-inch, super-powered gun, one of 325 ordered by the government. The new weapons, which would defend New York city in case of air attack, have a three-inch bore, fire a 28-pound projectile containing 253 one-half-inch lead pellets, and can fire 30 shells a minute. Guns were tested at Fort Tilden, Rockaway beach, New York city. It was the first time since 1917 that a N. Y. National Guard regiment held winter maneuvers.

Ersatz in England



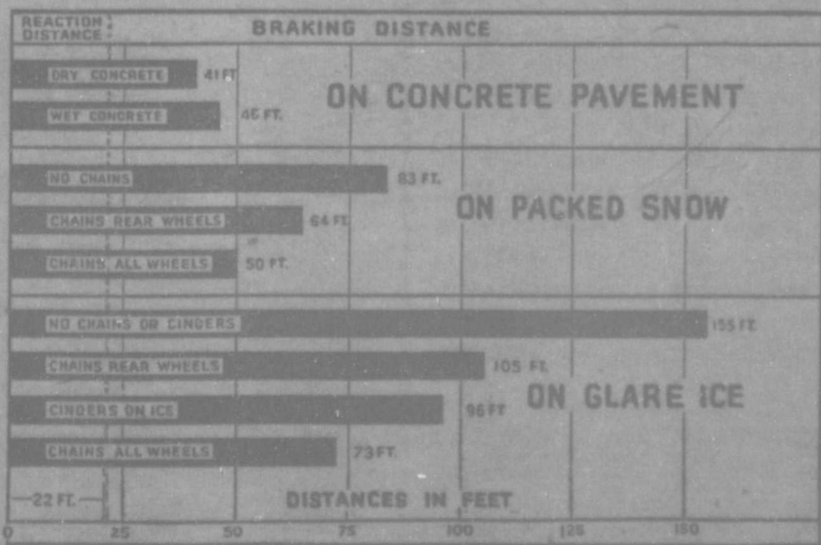
