PUTTY FAILURE OFTEN DUE TO POOR APPLICATION

When you see the putty cracking away from your windows in big chunks, don't be too quick about blaming it on the putty. The chances are the putty failure is due to the way the putty is put on. Like so many other things there is a right and a wrong way to apply putty. The right way takes a little more time and material, which is the reason you do not find it on windows that are made to sell at a price.

In one sketch, we show you the ordinary way that putty is applied to



Wood and glass do not come in contact with each other. Notice also the putty groove which anchors the putty.

windows. This method is quick and cheap, but it is usually temporary because swelling of the wood from the inside causes the putty to crack off.

In the other sketch is shown the proper way to apply putty. It is known as "bedding." Notice here the layer of putty on all sides of the glass. It actually is resting in a "bed" of putty.

We Are Going to Install a Cold Storage Locker System in Hedley

We Must Have 75 Contracts to Start-----We Have 40 Signed Now

We have decided to install one if the people want it. Whether they want it or not will be determined by the number of subscribers contracting for the lockers.

The very latest equipment will be installed with sanitary metal lockers. The rental for the lockers will be \$10 per year, based on standard lockers of 6 cubic feet. The plans are to erect the plant at the rear of our store with an outlet into our market and also onto the side street.

If you are interested in getting a cold storage locker system for Hedley, to be installed immediately and in operation around the middle of July, get in touch with us at once, sign up for the locker and as a matter of good faith leave your deposit for a year's rental. This money will not be spent or touched until the plant is in operation.

Should the number desiring storage lockers be insufficient to warrant construction of the plant, all deposits will be returned. But we are going to install the cold storage locker system or break a leg thing. Quick action is necessary in the part of those wanting lockers so that construction work can be started on the plant immediately.

Come in at your earliest opportunity and let's get the locker system in operation before the extremely hot weather.
