Thomas J. Wiggins Dies

Thomas J. Wiggins was born in Alabama June 22, 1863. At the close of the Civil War with his widowed mother and grand parents he came to Texas and settled near Mansfield below Ft. Worth. He was converted at the age of twenty seven and became a member of a Baptist Church remaining a member until his death. In 1908 he was ordained a deacon in which capacity he served until failing strength and declining years intervened. He has been a member of the Masonic Order for 85 years.

March 19, 1891 he was married to Miss Sarah Ellen Grimesley. To this union two children were born, Mrs. Elvia Davanport of Childress and W. W. Wiggins of Hedley, both of whom survive. He also leaves eight grand children and four great grandchildren.

Mr. Wiggins had lived here 16 1/2 years. He passed away last Friday after a lengthy illness. Funeral services were held Sunday from the First Baptist church by Rev. A. L. Teaff, assisted by Rev. W. E. Lawson.

Palbearers were Harrison Hall, Clyde Bridges, Leon Reeves, George Thompson, Alva Simmons and Roscoe Land.

Interment was in Rowe cemetery under direction of Womack Funeral Home. The Masonic Lodge had charge of the service at the cemetery.
