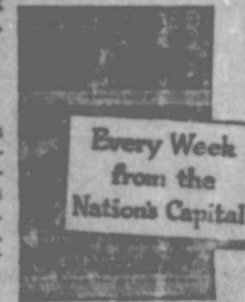

DRAFT-AGE FARMERS RELEASED for TEMPORARY WAR JOBS!

State Headquarters for Selective Service permits draft-age farmers in this area to accept war jobs during slack seasons without affecting their deferment classifications.

Because men are urgently needed in vital war industries in this area, farmers and farm laborers may accept temporary jobs in essential industries under the following conditions as cited in a Headquarters memorandum of Dec. 6th to all local boards, WMC Area No. 6:

off-season for farming operations in some occupation in war production or in support of the war effort; and

- (A) They remain in their seasonal occupations for a period of not less than 8 months of the year; (B) They become engaged during the

- (C) Upon the reopening of the season in which they may pursue their normal seasonal occupation they return to the seasonal occupations that constituted the basis for their original deferment and resume their status as necessary men therein.

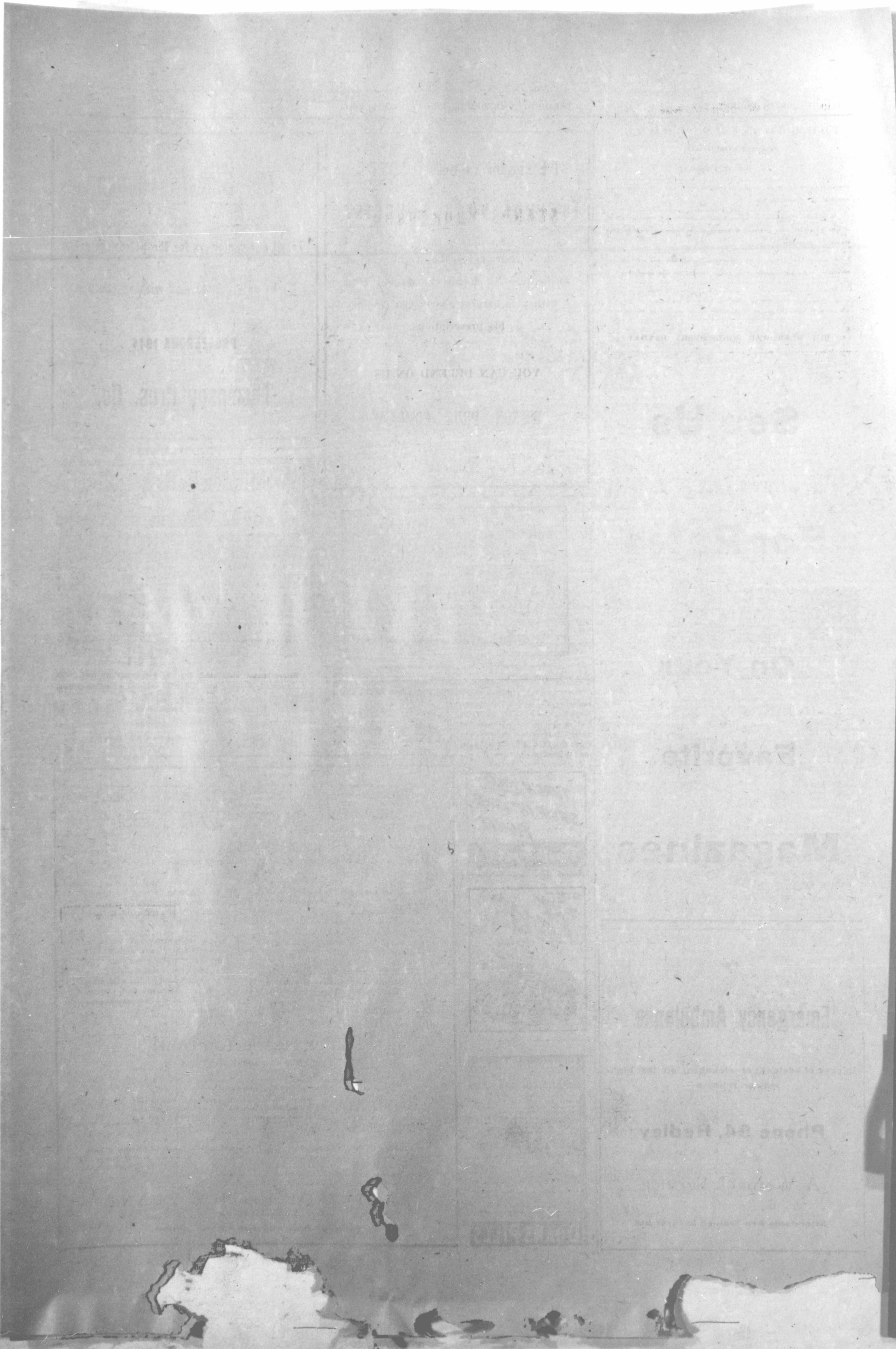

THAT vacant spot in the entertainment world is filled, now that John F. Sullivan—Fred Allen to the world at large—is back on the air on Sunday evenings. Once again, he's working 40 to 50 hours a week to bring us that 30 minutes of entertainment. During the last war Fred served with the AEF; during this one he's doing his best for war in the service; while he was on that long "vacation" he did several programs which were exclusively for transmission to overseas Allen fans in the armed forces. He played his

first radio role in 1932—Helen Morgan was his guest star. Now, 11 years later, he's at it again, better than ever.

For the first time in 23 years of stardom Richard Dix turns from hero to heavy in RKO's "The Ghost Ship." "When I returned home after a day of violent villainy at the studio, I was almost ashamed to face my wife and the kiddies," he remarked.

Dick Powell claims that he has answered the question of how to stay happily married while acting in pictures 102 times since he began work in Rene Clair's "It Happened Tomorrow." He says he plans to issue a mimeographed statement—"It's just the same as if you worked for the telephone company in Kokomo. Don't take your business home." He adds: "It helps if you love your wife!"

Jean Arthur'd like to remain Jean Arthur on the screen, but can't. It's her real name, and a certain blonde comedienne made it famous first. So 19-year-old Jean, of "Song of the Open Road," has had to give in and become Jean Vail professionally.

A new tap ballet is being created for Eleanor Powell, dancing star of United Artists' "Sensations of 1944"; it combines ballet steps and regular tap steps, and Eleanor is putting in six hours of practice daily with David Lichine of the Monte Carlo Ballet Russe.

Ronnie, nine-year-old son of George Burns and Gracie Allen, prides himself on manfully remaining dry-eyed when scolded for bad behavior. But recently he came home from school with a good report card, and George and Gracie were so proud and pleased and praised him so much that he stood it as long as he could—and then burst into tears!

The March of Time's "Naval Log of Victory" is a factual record of our navy's fight to regain control of the seas from Murmansk to Midway. Documented by scenes of actual air and sea combat, the film is an overall picture of actual naval tactics in operation from Pearl Harbor to the present. It is our navy's answer to Pearl Harbor, and nobody can afford to miss it.

**Kicking Nazis From Greenland**

Vital war information was reaching Germany from a post not far from the North American continent. A Nazi radio and weather base was operating in the Arctic off the coast of Greenland. It was solidly built and its occupants, hidden by blizzards and arctic wastes, expected to remain permanently. But the Nazis were surprised by vigilant Danes who spotted the base, battled its occupants and got word to the United States. Soon U. S. troops penetrated the arctic wastes and smashed the Nazi nest. The campaign is shown in the following sketches by Norman Thomas coast guard combat artist, and photographs taken at the base.

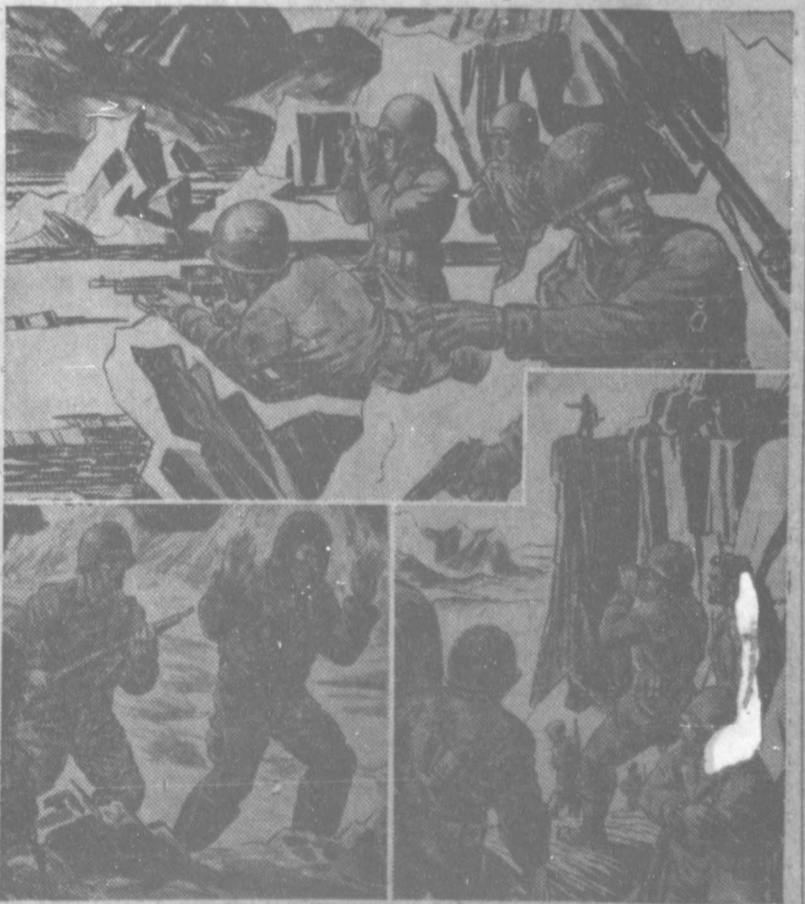


Coastguardsmen and soldiers go ashore from a cutter. Guns of the cutter cover the landing. This landing was preceded by a heroic fight by Danish hunters, one of whom was killed by the Nazis. Another Dane, who was captured, acted as a guide for the Nazis. But at his first chance this Dane seized the German commander of the base and delivered him to U. S. custody.

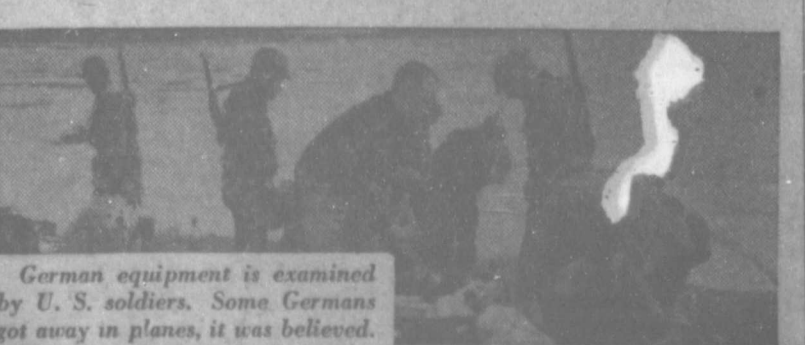

Drama in Bow  
NATURALLY, since we must use less material in clothing, we must expect a sheath-like treatment to be the next new step fashion takes. Here it is, in a dress with a bow for drama.  
Pattern No. 8509 is designed for sizes 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20. Size 12, short sleeves, 3 1/2 yards 36-inch material.

**AROUND THE HOUSE**

Before storing white shoes or other summer footwear, wash and replace the shoe laces, clean or polish the shoes, insert shoe trees, and place the shoes in boxes or other wrappings. They will keep better and be ready for immediate use next season.  
Examine children's shoes frequently. In as short a time as four weeks a child's foot may grow from one to three sizes larger.  
Foods that have baked or dried on enameled ware can be loosened by soaking the utensils in hot water. Then wash as usual with soap and water.  
If your tablecloth is beginning to look shoddy, cut it up with the pinking shears to make place mats, bibs for the children, or pot-holder pockets to hang on the kitchen wall.  
Instead of pricking your fingers pulling out sandburrs, hold your socks or other clothes over a pan of water and pull off the burrs with a regular hair comb.  
To keep stockings and socks from wrapping around the clothesline on a windy day, drop a marble in the toe of each. You'll get longer wear from your stockings if you take this precaution, and these days that is something.  
When hot compresses are required, use a potato ricer to wring out the hot water and save your hands.
