Quartermaster, Communications Quartermaster, Communication
and Chaplains Sections. It also has it's own "Air Force" of helicopters and a transportation sec
tion of small boats and dukws and land vehicles which carry per sonnel and cargo to and from Ai Service and Combat Groups. The Unit has received commendations
from both the Army and Navy for from both the Army and Navy for
it's contribution to the air war against Japan.
Cpl. Stone is entitled to we two bronze combat stars on the the Unit's participation in Centra and Western Pacific Campaigns. During these campaigns the ship went through twenty enemy air raids and received credit for shoot ing down two enemy bombers. He is assigned to the gun crew He entered the service Jan. 29
1943 and received his training Sheppard Field.
