## Mr. and Mrs Sims Recejve Letter

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Sims: Since your son, First Lieutenan Mack L. Sims, Jr., 0735828, Air Corps, was reported missing 26
March 1944, the War Department has entertained the hope that $h$ survived and that information would be revealed dispelling the uncertainty surrounding his absence. However, as in many cases the coaditions of warfare deny u such information.
Public Law 490, 77th Congress as amended, provides for a review and determination of the status of
each person who has been missing or missing in action for twelve
ent months. Accordingly, your son's case was reviewed and he was continued in the status of missing as of 27 March 1945. The law further provides that a subsequent
review shalt be made whenever review shalt be made whenever
warranted. Upon such subse warranted. Upon such subse
juent review the making of a find ing of desth is authorized.

All available records and report

:oncerning the absence of your son have been carefully investigated and are deemed to warrant a sub sequent review of his case. Intor-
mation in the hands of the Wa mation in the hands of the War
Department indicates that you Department indicates that your
son was a crew member of a B-25 son was a crew member of a B- 25
aircraft which took off on a nonaircraft which took off on a non-
combat mission from Nadzab, New Guinea, and the plane was last seen after its take off, and circum-
stances surrounding its disappear ance are unknown. Extensive searches were made on the follow-
ing day, but no trace of the plane or its missing crew membees could be found. A review of all the
tacts in the case at this time has mation.
since no information has been
received which would support presumption of his continued sur vival the War Department musi now terminate your son's absence
by a presumptive inding of death. Accordingly, an official finding of death has been recorded. The
finding does notestablish an actual finding does not establish an actual
or probable date of death; however or probable date of death; however
as required by law, it includes presumptive date of death for th
purpose of termination of pay dilowances, settlement of account and payment of death gratuities in the case of your son this date aas been set as 19 January 1946
I regret the necessity for this nessage but trust that the ending of a long period of uncertainty nay give at least some smal
measure of consolation. An ap measure of consolation. An ap
praisal of the sacrifice made by our son in the service of his ountry compels in us feelings of uumility and respect. May Provi
lence grant a measure of relie ience grant a measure of reliei
from the anxiety you have ex rerienced during these many
