## Swing of SOUTHWEST FARM MARKETS

Southwest farm markets paid mostly steady to strong prices last week, reports the Production and Marketing Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture. However, grains, eggs, strawberries, and most feeds went down, and some livestock weakened.

Cotton closed Friday from 25 cents to \$1.50 higher than a week earlier after rather wide fluctuations up and down. Demand strengthened for the higher white grades but the lower grades continued dull. Activity in spot markets fell off.

Cattle he'd generally steady last week, but some calves weakened at Houston, and cows at San Antonio. Beef cows brought up to \$17.50 at Oklahoma City; while common and medium kinds moved at \$11.50 to \$14.50 at Houston, and \$12 to \$15.50 at San Antonio. Medium to good classes sold at \$14 to \$16.50 at Fort Worth.

Hogs sold at mostly even to higher prices, but feeder pigs weakened some at San Antonio. Bulk of sales of good and choice medium weight butcher hogs at the week's close went at \$23 at San Antonio and Oklahoma City; \$23.50 at Ft. Worth. Sows cleared generally at around \$18 to \$18.50.

## HOUSEHOLD MEMOS... by Lynn Chambers



**Make the Most of Your Strawberries!**  
(See recipes below.)

**Strawberry Favorites**  
Those luscious ripe red berries of which we are so fond have a mighty short season, but today's recipes should help you make the most of them. Eat what you can get now, but put up the red ripe strawberries so you can enjoy them next winter.

If you want to have fresh strawberries all the year around for very special occasions, you may want to freeze them, if you are fortunate enough to have a freezing unit. Otherwise, can them whole, or put them up as marmalade, jam or jelly.

If the berries seem a bit expensive, you can stretch them by using fruits that go well with them in jams, such as pineapple or rhubarb. Budget your canning sugar now, too, so you'll have enough for all your needs of the season.

**Strawberry Marmalade.**  
(Makes 12 6-ounce glasses)  
2 oranges  
2 lemons  
1/2 cup water  
1/4 teaspoon soda  
1 quart strawberries  
7 cups sugar  
1/2 bottle fruit pectin  
Remove rind from oranges and lemons. Cut off white membrane. Force rinds through food chopper. Add water and soda, and bring to boiling point. Cover and simmer 10 minutes. Add orange and lemon pulp with juice. Simmer for 20 minutes. Add crushed strawberries. Measure 4 cups of prepared fruit; add sugar. Bring to boiling and boil 5 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in fruit pectin. Let stand 5 minutes. Skim and seal in hot, sterile glasses.

Another strawberry favorite for the season is jelly, but in this recipe the precious fruit is extended with young, strawberry-pink rhubarb.

**Strawberry Rhubarb Jelly.**  
(Makes 12 6-ounce glasses)  
4 cups juice  
8 ounces liquid pectin  
8 cups granulated sugar  
To prepare fruit, cut about 1 pound of fully ripe rhubarb into one-inch pieces and put through food chopper. Crush thoroughly and force through the food chopper 1 quart of strawberries. Combine fruit and place in jelly bag to extract the juice. Measure sugar and fruit juice into saucepan and mix. Bring to a boil over high heat; add liquid pectin at once, stirring constantly. Bring to a full, rolling boil and boil hard 1/2 minute. Remove from heat and skim. Pour into sterile glasses and cover with paraffin at once.

**Strawberry Jam.**  
(Makes 10 6-ounce glasses)  
4 cups prepared berries  
3 pounds (7 cups) sugar  
1/2 of an 8-ounce bottle liquid pectin  
To prepare fruit, place 2 quarts of fully ripe berries through a food chopper; or, crush completely, one layer at a time. Measure sugar and fruit into saucepan, mix well and bring to a full rolling boil. Stir constantly before and while boiling. Boil hard 1 minute. Remove from

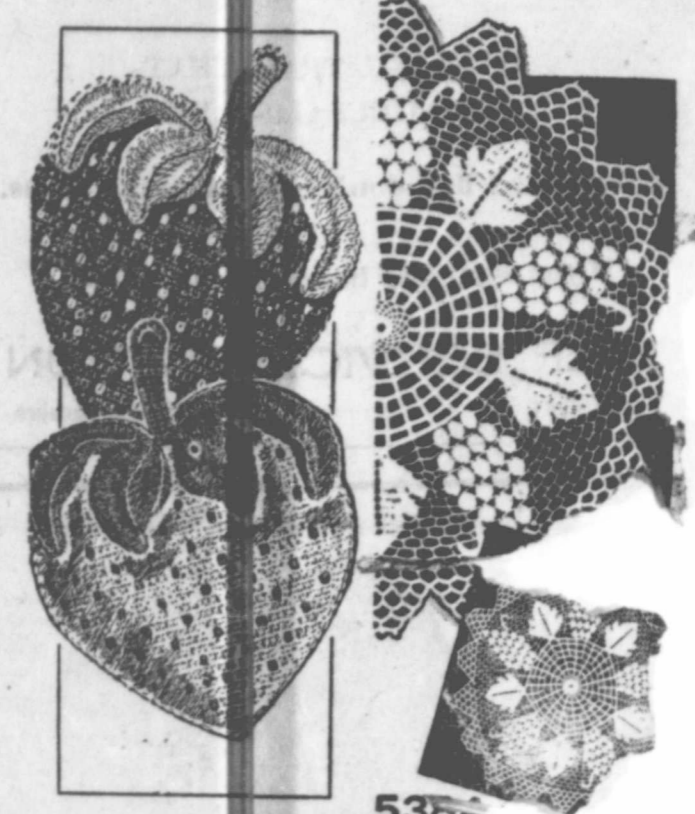
