Funeral services were held Tuesday from the First Baptist Church in Hedley by Rev. V. A. Hansard of Amarillo and Rev. M. E. Wells of White Deer, both old friends of the family. Burial was in the Odd Fellows Cemetery at Lakeview with Womack Funeral Home in charge.

Soviets See Outlook Atom;
No Slump—Readjustment Seen;
Postal Rates May Be Increased

ATOM BAN: Russia's Goal
Rejecting the American plan for international supervision of atomic energy, Andrei A. Gromyko, Soviet delegate to the United Nations, called for an immediate decision to outlaw the use of atomic weapons.

He described present United States monopoly of the atom as "an illusion" and predicted that this country's dominance in the field might be overcome soon by other nations. Gromyko presented a four-point outline of Russia's position in the debate over the atom:

1. Prohibition of atomic and mass destruction weapons is the greatest problem before the United Nations.
2. Russia is willing to submit to international control and inspection only if the atomic bomb is previously discarded.
3. Inspection must be limited in authority to "the necessity of ensuring the use of atomic energy for peaceful purposes only," and it must not interfere with the internal Soviet economy.
4. Ownership and management of atomic energy production facilities cannot be placed in the hands of an international authority.

POSTAL RATES: May Go Up
A measure embodying the first general revision of postal rates since 1879 which would add about 110 million dollars a year to post office revenues has been introduced in the house of representatives.

The bill provides for a 30 per cent increase in parcel post rates and would revise the air mail rate from five to six cents an ounce. In addition, the new plan would add about 30 per cent a year to present rates for second-class mailing of newspapers and periodicals sent outside the county in which they are published.

Another provision would maintain the current three-cent local and non-local rate for first class mail beyond the July 1 deadline when those rates were slated to revert to the former two-cent level.

The new rates would go into effect 60 days after the bill is passed and signed by the President.

NET PROFITS: Industries Gain
Top money maker in the United States in 1946 was the textile industry, according to a Wall Street Journal survey, rode the seller's market harder than any other group to register a 219.9 per cent increase in net profits over 1945.

Fourteen textile corporations were reported to have net profits of \$109,435,562 in 1946, compared with \$34,206,787 the previous year.

Profits 78.9 per cent above 1945 were recorded by food products and packing house industries, those which lie closest to the family coffers.

Gains also were made by distillers, whose net profits soared 144.6 per cent, and iron and steel with a 53.7 per cent increase despite damaging strikes.

Long, Long Trial
Gen. Lucius D. Clay, military governor of the American zone in Germany, has predicted that at the rate German denazification courts are proceeding it will take several years to dispose of the huge number of cases still pending.

READJUSTMENT: No Depression
Not a depression but a price "readjustment" is in store for the United States, the federal reserve board has predicted.

Reserve board economists explained that a downturn in prices is "necessary, healthy and inevitable." The inconsistencies in the national economy, which have arisen out of the fact that our economy is part rigged and part free, will have to be eliminated.

For instance: About 14 million organized workers have derived benefits through forcing higher wage levels. Twice that many unorganized workers have not shared to an equal extent in the wage increases.

A number of industries, able to control prices, have driven them upward. Others, at the same time, have been held down by government controls.

The main reason that farm and food product prices soared after the war was that there was little else the consumer could purchase. Now, with production making a comeback, the previously scarce radios, refrigerators, automobiles and so on are competing for the consumer's money.

Federal reserve board economists say that farm prices are expected to stabilize about 25 per cent under the 1946 peaks. They also express confidence that they can put the brakes on any further inflation if congress provides the necessary assistance.

Fire Losses Zoom
Losses from fire in the United States followed the general trend of the times during the past year. They went way up.

Summing up for the past year, the national board of fire underwriters reported the greatest fire loss for any 12-month period in history of the nation.

Total amount was \$616,408,000, making an increase of 22 per cent over the \$497,133,000 in fire losses for the preceding year. Losses during the first four months of this year were greater than those recorded in either 1935, 1937 or 1938.

SEAWAY: Soon a Reality?
Despite powerful opposition, the long-sought St. Lawrence-Great Lakes seaway which would make ocean ports of at least three large inland cities may become a reality in the near future.

The combined seaway and electric power project, designed to bring vessels from the Atlantic ocean along a 2,300-mile waterway to Chicago, Detroit, Duluth and other cities, has been advocated by every president since Taft.

Sen. Arthur Vandenberg (Rep., Mich.) has introduced a bill which would make the vast project self-liquidating within 10 years by means of exacting toll charges from vessels passing through the route.

Previous proposals entailed the spending of hundreds of millions of dollars as a public works project. If the bill is passed by both houses of congress and if American cooperation with Canada is authorized, real work on the seaway may be expected to begin within a year.

GIANT'S DEATH
End of an Era?

The battleship Oklahoma, first of the so-called "super-dreadnaughts," might well be recorded in history as an accurate symbol of the era during which it ploughed the seas for the U. S. navy—heroic but futile.

In her 31 years of steel-clad existence she never fired a shot at an enemy. Based at Berehaven, Ireland, during World War I, she saw no action; and on December 7, 1941, five Japanese torpedoes sent the sturdy old ship lunging to the bottom of Pearl Harbor before her crew could man the guns.

Raised to the surface and then abandoned as not worth salvaging, the Oklahoma was consigned to the scrap heap and taken in tow for the last long voyage across the Pacific. Suddenly, 640 miles northwest of Pearl Harbor, the tragic battleship listed heavily, as if tired of war and its aftermath, and slipped into the sea, three miles deep at that point, for her final escape from the era of violence that had been her lifespan.

PORK SUPPLY: Seek More Pigs
Seeking to boost the nation's pork supply during the spring and summer of 1948, the department of agriculture has recommended a general 15 per cent increase in pig production this fall.

The increase, achievement of which would bring an additional five million pigs to market next spring and summer, is being sought because present prospects indicate that supplies of beef and veal will be shorter in 1948.

Farmers will have no difficulty in getting sufficient amounts of feed to fatten a larger fall crop, the department said.

While the national goal calls for an overall increase of 15 per cent, the recommended regional increases would be 18 per cent in western states, 16 per cent in the Midwest corn belt and in the Northeast, 12 per cent in East Central states and 13 per cent in the South.

SURPLUS SUGAR: Many Protests
Unless surplus sugar stocks are released to needy housewives, a congressional group will demand immediate repeal of sugar control, according to Senator McCarthy (Rep., Wis.) who is at the head of the movement.

Protests against the department of agriculture's sugar control program have been sent to congressmen from all parts of the country, McCarthy revealed.

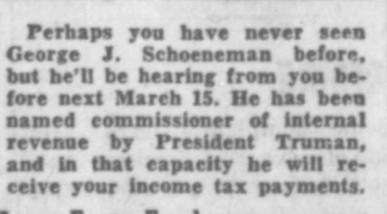
"The department of agriculture is trying to make people believe there is a scarcity when there is a large surplus," he said, and added, "They are permitting industrial users to stock up, but are denying housewives the same privilege at the beginning of the canning season when it is needed most."

END THE WAR: Students Riot
Demonstrating violently in open defiance of Chiang Kai-shek's order to quiet down, thousands of university students in several Chinese cities fortified their demand that the civil war be ended immediately by calling for a general strike.

Declaring sternly that the student riots were instigated by Communists, Chiang said they would be quelled forcibly if necessary. The students reacted with further parade and violence in Shanghai, Nanking and Peiping.

About 25,000 students were on strike from 16 universities, with their demands including everything from a better system of grading papers to higher government living allowances and an end to the war.

Beat the Boys and the Birds to the Cherries

"Cherries are ripe!" When that little schoolroom song is in season, get busy in your kitchen! The robins, or other two-legged depredators answering to such names as "Butch" and "Porky", may consume the luscious crop of the old cherry tree before you can say, "NEXT WINTER'S PIES!"

To can cherries by the cold pack method, wash and stem them. Pit or leave whole, but prick whole ones with a needle. Pack into hot jars. Cover sour cherries with boiling sirup made of one part sugar and one part water or cherry juice. Cover sweet cherries with sirup containing one-half to one part sugar and one part liquid. Process 20 minutes in hot water bath. The hot pack method calls for

one-half to one cup sugar to each quart of pitted cherries. Add the sugar to the cherries and let stand one to two hours. Simmer 10 minutes, then pack into hot jars and process 10 minutes in hot water bath.

These directions are taken from the famous Ball Blue Book of home canning methods and recipes. If cherry pies, tarts and cobbiers made from home-grown cherries won't satisfy your family's craving for this piquant summertime fruit, put up cherry jelly, pickled cherries, cherry preserves, Maraschino cherries, and conserves combining cherries with pineapples, raspberries, etc. Canned Bing cherries are delicious to eat as dessert or in salads. You'll never lack for princely meals with cherries in your closet of canned foods.

Summer Weddings Will Be Incentive For Many Parties



For a simple bridal shower refreshment, a punch bowl with floating orange slices and silvered strawberries makes a pretty picture. Serve this with cake or cookies.

Bridal days are once more with us, and there's hardly any circle of friends where at least one wedding does not take place. A good friend of the bride usually gives the honored girl a shower, and it is with such pleasant things that we are concerned.

Whether it's a lingerie, kitchen or personal shower, the theme of the party refreshments should be daintiness. If you can carry out the theme with a centerpiece of bride and bridegroom, well and good, but it isn't necessary. Use your daintiest linen and fresh, fragile flowers, and your table is bound to be pretty.

Pastel color combinations in table settings and refreshments are highly favored as they carry out the theme of the occasion. Food, however, need not be elaborate, because the girls probably will be too excited to eat much. Do, however, make everything delectable, and you will be well rewarded for your efforts.

A SIMPLE afternoon or evening party might consist of a light delectable cake and punch as follows:

Whipped Cream Angel Food.
1 cup whipping cream
3 egg whites
1/4 cup water
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 cups flour
1 1/2 cups sugar
3 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt

Whip cream until stiff; beat whites until stiff and combine carefully. Add water, vanilla and dry ingredients, which have been sifted together at least three times. Bake in layers at 350 degrees about 30 minutes or until done. Use the following filling:

Lemon Filling De Luxe.
1/4 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
3 eggs, beaten slightly
Grated rind of 1 lemon
6 tablespoons lemon juice
1/4 teaspoon salt

Place shortening in pan over hot water to soften. Add remaining ingredients. Cook over simmering water, stirring constantly, until well thickened and of good piping quantity. Cool before using.

Strawberry Punch.
(Makes 1/2 quart)
1 quart water
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup corn syrup
2 quarts strawberries
3 cups chilled orange juice
1 cup chilled lemon juice
4 cups ginger ale
2 thinly sliced oranges or limes

Combine first three ingredients. Bring to a boil and add the washed, hulled strawberries, and boil, covered, for 3 minutes. Remove and strain through a sieve, without pressing, and chill. Just before serving, combine with remaining ingredients, using orange slices for

ANOTHER EASY but satisfying answer to the refreshment problem is a sabbat served with homemade hot-from-the-oven muffins that take just a few minutes to bake. But first, consider the salad, made with easy-to-use canned shrimp:

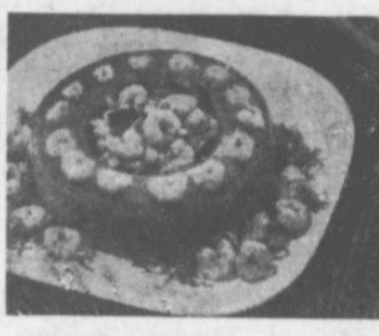
Shrimp and Avocado Salad Ring.
(Serves 6)
2 tablespoons plain gelatin
1 1/2 cups cold water
1 1/2 cups boiling water
1/2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup lemon juice
2 ripe avocados
1/2 cup chopped celery
1 No. 1 can shrimp
Mayonnaise

Soften gelatin in 1/4 cup cold water for 5 minutes. Add boiling water with sugar and salt and mix until dissolved. Add remaining cold water and lemon juice and mix thoroughly. Arrange about 1/2 of the shrimp in the bottom of a 1 quart ring mold which has been rinsed in cold water. (Reserve remaining shrimp for filling.) Cover shrimp with 1/2 cup of the clear gelatin mixture and chill until firm. Chill remaining gelatin until thickened. Peel and mash 1 avocado and fold into slightly thickened gelatin mixture. Peel and dice other avocado and add to mixture with celery. Pour over jellied shrimp and chill until firm. Unmold on a crisp greens and place Shrimp Filling in center. Serve with mayonnaise.

Shrimp Filling.
Remaining 1/2 can of shrimp
1 cup diced cucumber
1/2 cup diced celery
Salt and pepper

Combine ingredients and season to taste. Place in center of shrimp-avocado ring.

Combine shrimp and avocado for a pretty salad. Make your salad in the morning and save last minute fluster when the guests appear. Bread and butter sandwiches made finger style, or whole wheat muffins are a good accompaniment.



YOU'LL FIND these whole wheat muffins nourishing as well as a delightful change from other types because they're less well known.

Whole Wheat Muffins.
1/2 cup all-purpose flour
1 cup unsifted whole wheat flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
4 tablespoons granulated sugar
1 egg, well beaten
1 cup milk
4 tablespoons melted shortening or salad oil
1/2 cup raisins

Mix together dry ingredients. Combine remaining ingredients. Add all at once to the flour mixture, stirring, not beating, vigorously, until just mixed and of a lumpy appearance, but no longer. Over-stirring will make your muffins coarse. Fill greased or oiled muffin pans 2/3 full and bake in a moderately hot (375-degree) oven for 35 minutes.

To save sugar used in icings, sprinkle a small amount of sugar on the cake before baking. This, in turn, may be sprinkled with finely shredded nuts or coconut shreds.

Fruit pies as well as berry pies will have better flavor if the juice of half a lemon is sprinkled over the filling before baking.

Bread and rolls will be much more quickly made if the yeast in them is doubled. Four teaspoons of vinegar also will help speed the process and keep bread better during the summer months.
