I suppose too, they will raise all the Court House officials' salaries without them having to join a union!

Are these financial wizards trying to get the county taxes as high, or higher, than our school taxes? This is too much of a raise, and we, as tax payers, should see that they do not get away with it. To The Public

The Commissioners' Court of Donley County on the 26th day of May, 1947, as a Board of Equalization. It was brought to the attention of the Court:

1. That the Court House and Jail were in need of major repairs or new construction;
 2. That the Permanent Improvement Fund set up by the Constitution to take care of major repairs and new construction had a balance of \$15,723.11;
 3. That in the past eight years \$40,294.00 had been transferred from the said Permanent Improvement Fund and used for current operating expenses;
 4. That the expenses for operating the county's business have increased in the past few years out of proportion to the increase in the county's income;
 5. That the county must buy new road machinery for all precincts; and
 6. That the assessed valuation of the property in Donley County is very low in relation to the present market value of such property.
- In view of the aforesaid facts and observations, the Court agreed on a 50 percent raise on the present tax valuation of realty, and a 20 percent raise on personalty.

W. VS AN. Agriculture Slash Voted; Truman Signs Greek Aid Bill; ICC Grants Train Fare Boost

FARM FUROR: Stormy Weather

Possibly the most violent storm of the year, according to the economic and political barometer, is the one which was raised when the house appropriations committee recommended a 32 per cent cut in department of agriculture funds for the coming year.

Slashing more than 383 million dollars from the amount asked by President Truman, the committee opened the floodgates for a deluge of protests from Clinton Anderson, secretary of agriculture, and Democratic congressmen, who claimed they would fight the action right up to next year's elections, if necessary.

Declaring that the reduction "directs a sharp cut at the interests of the American farm family and the general welfare," Anderson said that the "greatest harm" would be to the soil conservation program, the farm price support program and programs designed to help veterans and low income families become better established.

The 32 per cent cut would eliminate the Agriculture Adjustment administration by July 1, 1948. Currently, the AAA is carrying on its basic program of promoting soil conservation on 3,500,000 cooperating farms by paying farmers for following practices intended to increase soil fertility and, hence, to increase production. The proposed fund slash would mean that farmers this year would be paid about 50 per cent of what they previously had been promised.

In answering the criticism, the house appropriations committee said that its recommended cuts are "selective" and reasonable—based on actual farm needs.

AID BILL: To Stop Reds

The 400 million dollar Greek-Turkish aid bill, spearhead of the so-called "Truman doctrine," has been passed by congress and signed into law by the President.

What the Difference?

It's easy to confuse the Greek-Turkish aid bill and the general foreign relief bill, also passed by congress. Here are the differences:

1. The aid bill provides 400 million dollars to Greece and Turkey alone to strengthen those nations against the inroads of Communism.
2. The foreign relief bill earmarks 350 million dollars to stave off starvation and sickness in Austria, Greece, Italy, Hungary, Poland, China and Trieste.

Target of much criticism from certain elements in congress, the measure was opposed principally on the grounds that it represented a national course which eventually

would render the United Nations meaningless.

Mr. Truman, however, defended the plan with the contention that the United States, in extending aid to Greece and Turkey, "is helping to further aims and purposes identical with those of the United Nations."

He added that "we intend to make sure that the aid we extend will benefit all the peoples of Greece and Turkey, not any particular group or faction." The bill empowers the President to provide the Turks and Greeks with financial aid and military equipment for the purpose of keeping the gates of the Near East closed to Communism.

TRAVEL PAY: Train Fares Up

To offset increased operating costs, Interstate Commerce commission authorized an approximate 10 per cent increase in basic passenger fares for 60 railroads operating east of the Mississippi and north of the Ohio and Potomac rivers.

The change will boost one-way passenger rates from 2.2 to 2.5 cents a mile in coaches and from 3.3 to 3.5 cents a mile in sleeping and parlor cars. There will be an increase of about 15 per cent in coach round-trip rates and about four per cent in Pullman round-trip fares.

In granting the increase, ICC noted that those railroads which requested the new rates incurred a deficit of 54 million dollars from passenger train operations last year.

HOUSING: Unfounded Hope

Popular belief that any substantial reductions in the cost of new housing will occur in the near future is not founded on realities.

That assertion was made by James C. Downs Jr., president of the Real Estate Research corporation, who explained that besides being geared to a high national debt, housing costs, like prices of other hard goods, are directly affected by the large demand for American capital and production by other countries.

"The housing shortage today is worse than a year ago," he said, "and it will continue to grow progressively worse for some time."

He pointed out that increased earning power has put a greater number in the market for new homes, but at the same time builders are afraid to start new construction because of high costs. The theory that prices would drop kept many persons from buying or building homes last year, Downs said.

POLIO MENACE: Not Too Bad

Although it is yet too early to know definitely what course the disease will take this year, the infantile paralysis situation in this country appears considerably better than in 1946, according to public health service officials.

Last year a total of approximately 28,000 polio cases marked the twelve month period as the second worst in history. The worst was 1916 when 27,363 cases were recorded.

Income Tax Slash Likely for 1948: Knutson

Rep. Harold Knutson (Rep., Minn.), original advocate of the "20 per cent across the board" income tax reduction plan, is holding to his contention that "congress will vote an income tax cut this year."

Further, the chairman of the house ways and means committee "sees no reason" why another slash "shouldn't be made in 1948. The Republican program calls for more Knutson declared.

IT'S WONDERFUL: Long Time Peace

Announcing the immediate abolition of capital punishment in Russia, Soviet authorities explained the move on the grounds that it was made possible by Russia's growing strength, the people's patriotism and the certainty of peace "for a long time."

Said the Moscow radio: "The international situation during the time after Germany's capitulation and Japan's capitulation shows that the cause of peace can be considered secure for a long time in spite of attempts by aggressive elements to provoke war."

Meanwhile, Herbert Hoover looked on the other side of the mask to charge Russia with attempting to bleed the United States through relief channels and blaming her for the economic paralysis of Japan and Germany.

He declared that further relief will remain necessary as long as the Soviets continue their obstructionist tactics and demands for reparations, thus blocking peace treaties with the two countries and keeping their economies paralyzed.

NO POTATOES: Wheat Is Cheaper

A paradox in potatoes, whereby thousands of bushels of the tubers have had to be destroyed in this country because starving Europe refused to take them, was described to the international emergency food council by John W. Gannaway of the department of agriculture's potato branch.

Because spring potatoes rot so rapidly unless refrigerated, the only way they could be shipped to Europe would be to dehydrate them. The U. S. offered to give the potatoes to European countries for the cost of dehydration.

Gannaway said the offer was turned down because foreign governments can buy American wheat for six cents a pound. One pound of dehydrated potatoes, equal to about 10 pounds of raw product, would have cost 14 cents.

RETRIBUTION: Black Curtains

Forty-nine guards and foremen of the Nazis' infamous Mauthausen prison, convicted by an American military court for the slaughter of more than 700,000 persons of all nationalities, died on the gallows in the Landsberg prison yard in the largest mass execution in the history of American war crimes prosecution.

Two days were required to complete the black-curtained proceedings. Twenty-two men were hanged on the first day; 27 on the second. The group was part of the 61 Mauthausen guards convicted at the Dachau trial a year ago. Twelve received life imprisonment penalties, 49 the death sentence.

Crest of the News

NEWEST PLASTIC to hit the market is a revolutionary water-sealed fabric, translucent in appearance and silky to the touch but possessing remarkable strength. Because it is waterproof it may be used in kitchens and bathrooms for shower curtains, drapes, bathnet covers, table covers, bibs, aprons and for a multitude of other purposes. The new material is immune to most acid and alkali stains and may be laundered easily.

SCHIZOPHRENIA, the hitherto unmaped world of the unbalanced personality, may be opened to exploration by use of a new drug called mescaline. Experimenters report that they have been able to produce visual hallucinations, particularly in neurotic patients, by administering mescaline. They say the drug may be an important factor in arriving at an understanding of schizophrenia, the psychologists' term for a split personality.

A "SILENT" AIRPLANE, labeled one of the major aviation developments in recent years, has been produced by scientists. Its five-bladed propeller, revolving more slowly than the conventional type, reduces noise to a minimum. Demonstrated at Langley field, Va., the plane made scarcely any more commotion passing 300 feet overhead than a glider. The new aircraft is said to be the first one in all noise eliminating methods

FIELD DOG TRIAL HOLDS BIG THRILL FOR SPECTATOR

Provides Fascinating Demonstration of Canine Speed, Grace, Precision

Anyone who likes dogs or has an interest in sports will find many hours of relaxation and enjoyment in following field trials, states the Gaines Dog Research Center, New York City.

A field trial might best be described as a public competition for hunting dogs. The main purpose is to encourage and set standards for the breeding and training of better hunting dogs. Aside from its more serious aims, the field trial provides unrivaled recreation for both participants and spectators.

Trials are held for almost every breed of sporting dog and hound on all kinds of small game. There are 37 breeds which are eligible for trials. Some trials limit contestants to representatives of one breed exclusively, as, for instance, Beagle trials in which the game pursued is rabbit or hare. Most retriever trials are open to several breeds such as Labrador Golden and Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, to name but a few. Entries in bird dog contests are largely made up of Pointers and English Setters although the entries may include any or all of the other pointing breeds—Irish Setters, Gordon Setters, German Shorthaired Pointers, Brittany Spaniels and Wire-Haired Pointing Griffons. These are used on various upland game birds, such as quail, pheasant, grouse, prairie chicken and Hungarian partridge. English Springer Spaniels, Cocker Spaniels, Brittany Spaniels and several other types of Spaniels are frequent field trial contestants, starring in the role of retrievers. Basset hounds, Foxhounds, Coonhounds and Dachshunds also take part in trials, demonstrating their sporting blood in the pursuit of the rabbit, fox and weasels.

Grow Perennial Flowers From Seed

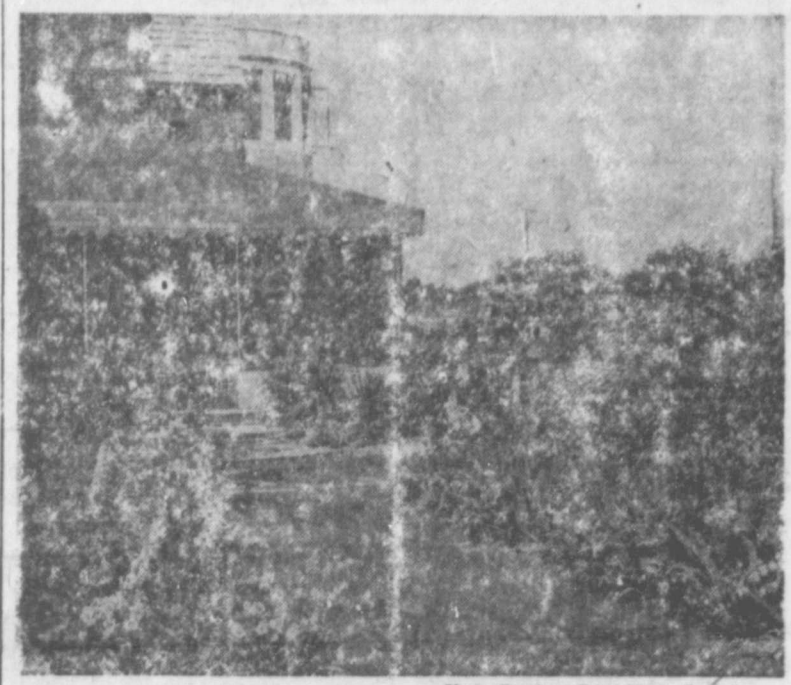

You can save considerable garden money and add new zest to your gardening by growing your own perennial flowers from seed. The best quality seeds cost only a few cents a packet and with simple care will produce scores of plants to bring color and beauty to the garden for years to come. Most perennials grown from seed bloom the second year after sowing.

Seed should be started at about the same time as that of the annuals, such as zinnias and marigolds. The secret of success is to get the seedlings to transplanting size early enough so that when set in their permanent places in garden or border, they will get a good root-hold before cold weather comes on. A specially prepared seed bed or seed box is best for starting perennial seeds. A seed bed can be easily prepared by knocking the bottom out of a good-sized shallow wooden box and sinking the sides into the ground. The top should be about two or three inches above the surface. Use finely prepared, crumbly garden loam containing plenty of humus. It is important to locate the seed bed where it will be sheltered from strong winds and from sunlight during the hottest part of the day. A seed box or flat may also be used, with holes bored in the bottom for drainage. This has the advantage of being movable to sheltered locations when necessary.

Some perennial seeds are very small. Mix them with sand so that they will not be sown too thickly in the row and merely press them into the soil instead of covering them. Larger seeds need a shallow covering of soil. Firm the soil down on them so that they will make immediate contact with the moisture and plant food. Keep the soil moist but not wet until the seeds sprout. Some gardeners spread damp burlap over the surface to furnish needed moisture, removing it at the first sign of sprouting.

Here are a number of perennials that beginners can start from seed with almost sure success: Columbine, gallardia, coreopsis, hollyhock, painted daisy, sweet william, hardy pinks, hardy alyssum, and the violets.

Perennial seeds usually take somewhat longer to germinate than those of annual flowers. Don't be discouraged if the tiny sprouts do not show themselves for two or three weeks after the seed is sown.

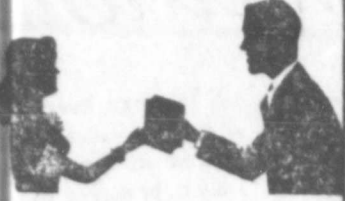

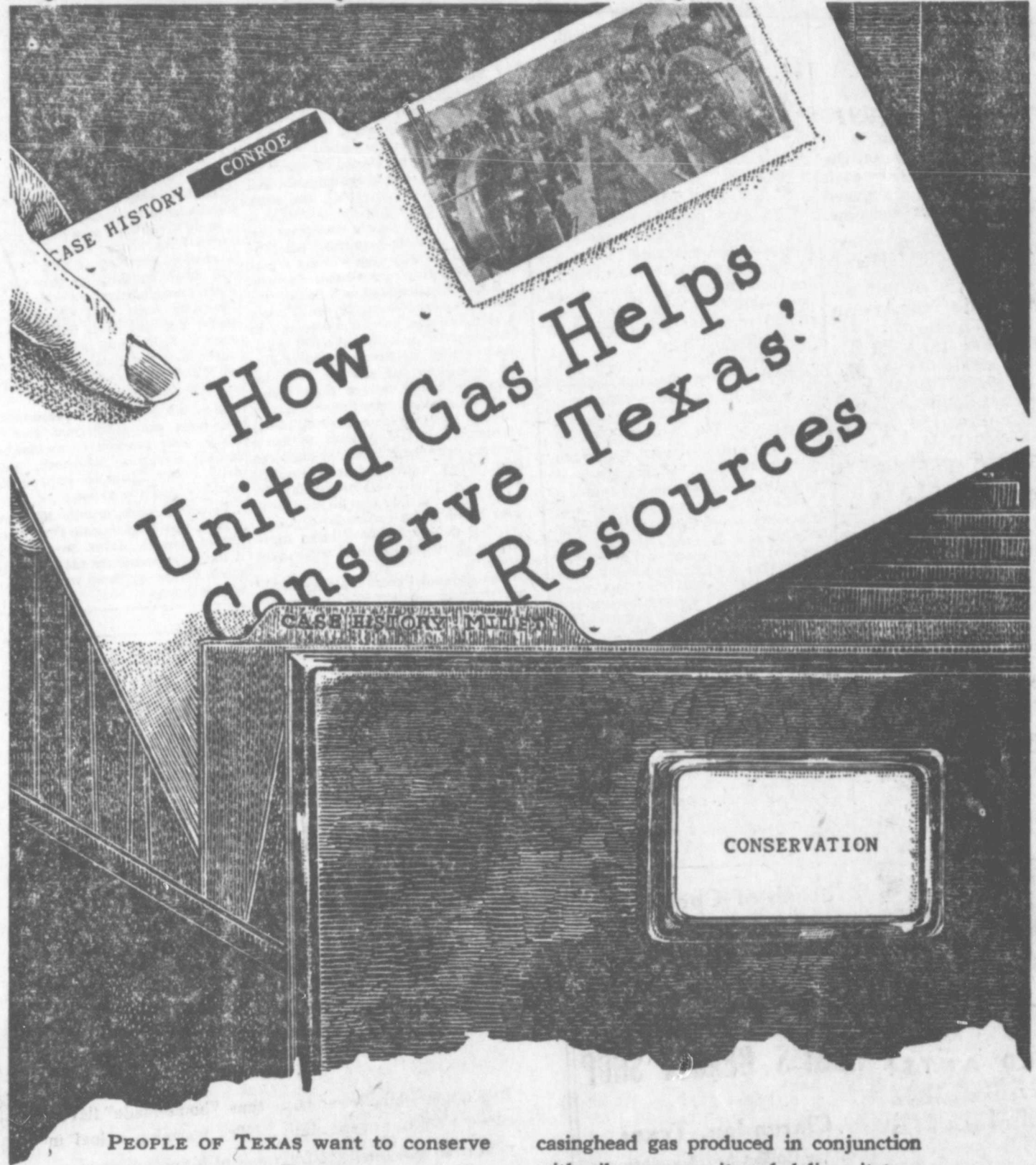

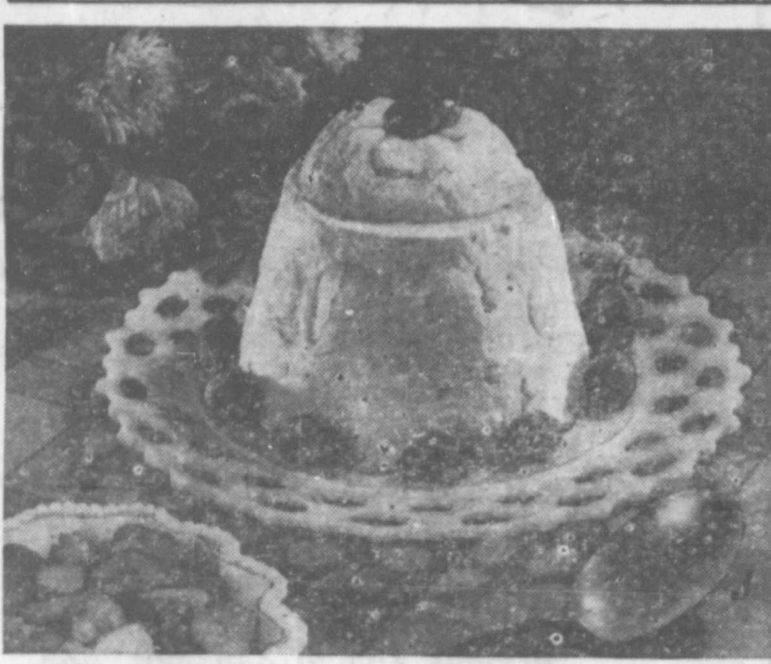

Fruit Magic

When lazy warm weather comes upon us and foods don't tempt the appetite, Mrs. Homemaker is hard pressed to provide her family with enough nourishing food to sustain them. Families seem to prefer the lightest of food, and it sometimes is hard to build up the calorie count on salads and cold meats.

But fruit and rich milk or cream can come easily to the rescue when other means fail. There are so many delectable refrigerator desserts made of fruit and berries and cream that it will take more than a season to try them all.

First of all there's the shortcake variety. Bake your biscuits golden brown, split and butter them and then drizzle luscious crushed and sweetened fruit or berries between the biscuits. Drown them in cream, either plain or whipped, and watch them disappear.

Then, too, there's an amazing variety of frozen desserts which take their share of fruit and cream. These take but a few minutes to make and keep well for several days in the refrigerator.

If you're shy on sugar use preserves or fruit sauces, and, still, you need not have to dip into the sugar bowl at all.

TRY SOME of these recipes and your warm weather problem will be solved:

Apricot Sherbet.
(Makes 1 quart)
1 cup evaporated milk
1 cup apricot preserves
Whip chilled milk very stiff. Beat in lemon juice, then fold in preserves. Pour at once into cold freezing tray and chill for several hours.

Variations: Strawberry, cherry or peach preserves or marmalade may be substituted for apricot preserves.

Apple Sherbet.
(Makes 1 quart)
1 cup evaporated milk
1 cup sweetened lemon juice
2 cups sweetened applesauce, chilled
Dash of nutmeg
Whip chilled milk very stiff. Beat in lemon juice. Fold in applesauce and nutmeg. Pour at once into cold freezing tray and chill well.

Orange Ice Cream.
(Serves 8)
20 marshmallows
1 cup orange juice
Grated rind of 2 oranges
Juice of 1 lemon
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pint whipping cream
Add 2 tablespoons of water to the marshmallows and place them in the top part of a double boiler. Stir constantly until the marshmallows are half dissolved. Remove from heat and stir until creamy. Cool, add orange juice, rind and lemon juice. Whip cream until thick and add to the mixture. Place in tray and freeze, stirring often, until firm.

Good Housekeeping Secrets
When cooking cabbage or onions, the objectionable odor may be eliminated if the vegetables are cooked in half milk and half water. Use any excess liquid for making cream sauces or soups.

If you like crisp skins on baked potatoes, scrub clean and then rub with a metal sponge and bake.

To retain color in green vegetables, cook in an open pan with a minimum of water and watch cooking time carefully.

Butterscotch Ice Cream.

(Makes 1 quart)
3 tablespoons butter
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup brown sugar
1 cup milk
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons cornstarch
2 tablespoons cold milk
Pinch of salt
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon vanilla
1 cup heavy cream, whipped

Cook butter and sugar in top of double boiler, until butter is melted and well blended with sugar. Add milk and heat to boiling. Mix cornstarch with cold milk and stir into butter and sugar mixture; add salt and cook until thickened. Cool and add vanilla.

Fold in whipped cream and turn into refrigerator tray and freeze, stirring once during freezing.

Marshmallow Delight.
(Serves 8 to 10)
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pound marshmallows
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups diced or crushed pineapple
1 pint whipping cream
2 tablespoons sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup maraschino cherries, cut up
Cut marshmallows into quarters. Add pineapple and place in a covered container overnight. Whip cream, add sugar and vanilla. Fold whipped cream into marshmallows and pineapple; add cherries. Pour into freezing tray and allow to chill thoroughly or partially freeze before serving.

***Grapefruit Sponge.**
(Serves 6)
3 eggs, separated
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup canned, unsweetened grapefruit juice
1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup cold water
Berries
Beat egg yolks until light. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar and beat well. Add grapefruit juice and cook mixture over boiling water until it coats a spoon. Stir constantly. Soften gelatin in cold water for 5 minutes. Add to hot grapefruit juice mixture and cool until slightly thickened. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Gradually beat in remaining sugar. Fold into cooled mixture and pour into a one-quart mold. Chill until firm. Unmold on a plate and serve with sliced or crushed berries in season.

Fresh Peach Cream.
(Serves 8 to 10)
2 cups fresh peach pulp
1 cup granulated sugar
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon almond extract
1 tablespoon lemon juice
3 tablespoons cold water
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups coffee cream
Combine peach pulp, sugar, coffee extract and lemon juice. Add coffee cream. Pour into tray and freeze. Remove tray and stir once during freezing process. The stirring may be done in the tray.

Household Hints
If you have a job that keeps you on your feet all day, try placing a powder puff in the heel of your shoes.

When ripping snap fasteners from discarded clothing, keep the pairs together by punching a small hole in a card and snapping the fasteners in it.

To clean black or dark blue felt, use a teaspoonful of ammonia mixed with half a cup of cold tea.

Pin hanks in the line along the top of the shoes. They will dry faster, and the extra pins will help keep the shoes from blowing away. This also saves line room for other pieces of clothing.

In working with plywood it is well to remember that even the very best grades have defects on one side while the other side is nearly perfect.

Cook meat tender at a low, constant temperature if you want to avoid shrinkage. You'll get a golden brown surface on your roasts this way, too.

Keep tablecloths from wrinkling by folding them once and winding them on a large roll of newspaper.

When sending things to the cleaner, if possible tell him the history of spots on the garments to be cleaned.

Try waxing your bureau drawers. Scrub the drawers with soap and water first, however, to be sure no musty odors are left in them. When applying the wax, use a clean cloth and apply as much as the wood will take without becoming sticky. The application of wax to bureau drawers will close the wood pores and give a hardwood finish to soft woods.

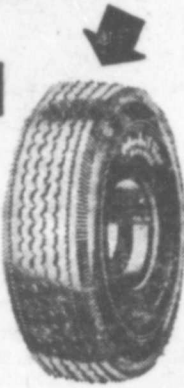
