"fork tenderness." There is little ex-
cuse for underdone or overdone chicken if you follow the recipes
given today, with particular care to cookery. A moderate temperature
is best to use for chieken so as not is best to use for chieken so as not
to shrink it too much, make it dry
or tough. Most people who like chicken say
there's no better way to cook it
than to fry it. The generally accepted method is as follows:

1. Rub seasoned flour into pieces. cup flour, 1 teaspoon paprika, $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt, and scant $1 /$ tea-
spoon pepper. Save left-over flour
for gravy.
2. Heat enough fat in a heavy
skillet to give a depth of about $1 / 2$ of water should sizzie when tem3. Start meaty pieces first, slip-
ping less meaty pieces in between ing; use two skillets if noid crowding; use two skillets if necessary.
3. As soo as chicken begir. to
brown, about 10 minutes. reduce heat, and cook slowly until tender,
