Swing of SOUTHWEST FARM MARKETS

Many southwest farm products set lower trends last week, but grains and cotton continued to climb, the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Production and Marketing Administration reports.

Cotton harvesting made good progress but car shortage hampered movement to market. Spot sales scored a record volume for the season, although some farms still held for higher prices. Prices advanced around \$3 for the week.

Poultry showed considerable weakness off and on during the week, but most markets steered somewhat toward the close. Eggs held mostly unchanged. Dallas and Ft. Worth bought select caged eggs at around 55 cents per dozen. New Orleans paid 63 cents for fresh grade A large eggs, and Denver gave 55 to 60 for large white. Heavy hens turned generally at 24 to 25 cents per pound, no fryers 32 to 37.

Texas hog markets closed steady for the week, while other southwest terminals suffered losses up to 30 cents or more. Top hogs sold late in the week at \$28.50 at an Antonio, \$29 at Fort Worth, \$28.80 at Wichita, \$29.50 at Denver, and \$29.25 at Oklahoma City. Pigs ranged mostly from \$25 to \$27.50, and pigs \$20 to \$26.

Most cattle markets lost 25 cents to \$1 compared with a week earlier. One exception was Houston, where common to medium cows sold steady at \$12 to \$14.50. Another was San Antonio, where cutter and common cows brought \$11 to \$14. Cattle and common cows turned at \$11.25 to \$13.50 at Fort Worth, and \$10.50 to \$13 at Oklahoma City. Wichita took common and medium grades at \$13 to \$15.

PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF TEXAS

NO. 527

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME

WHEREAS, farming and ranching activities in Texas afford the principal income of a vast majority of its inhabitants;

and, WHEREAS, the farming and ranching business income leads all other industries of Texas; and,

WHEREAS, the farmers and ranchers of Texas have, through their various organizations, crusaded for recognition, representation, and economic equality through democratic procedures;

and, WHEREAS, the farm and ranch groups recognize the necessity and supreme importance of having an educated, prosperous, and organized agricultural husbandry in this State;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Beauford E. Jester, Governor of Texas, do hereby proclaim the week of October 25 - 30, 1947, as TEXAS FARM AND ORGANIZATION WEEK.

I urge our citizens to cooperate in the recognition and observance of this week so that special attention can be given this important phase of our Texas life.

Don't paint electric cords. This is a bad idea for rubber and promptly cracks it to crack.

Empty the vacuum cleaner bag frequently. An excessive accumulation of dirt impairs the suction of the cleaner.

Make a syrup of brown sugar and a little butter or margarine and serve it over cooked carrots cut lengthwise. Or glaze the carrots in this syrup in a frying pan or in the oven.

Glue rubber washers to the bottom of your dish-pan with water-resistant airplane glue. This will hold the dish-pan steady in the sink and will prevent black stains from forming in the sink.

FIRST ATTEMPT:

In Chile
First corrosive efforts of the new Communist international organization in the Western hemisphere were uncovered in Santiago, Chile, where two Yugoslav diplomats were accused by the Chilean government of instigating, under orders, a Communist campaign against the United States and hemispheric solidarity.

The two men, Andrej Cunja, Yugoslav charge d'affaires, and Dalibor Jakasa, secretary of the Yugoslav legation in Buenos Aires, were expelled from the country.

They were, according to an official statement, acting for the Communist international headquarters in Belgrade and had received instructions to:

- Intensify and co-ordinate a campaign against the U. S. in order to bring the greater democratic sectors over to join themselves to Soviet strategy against the western democracies.
- Attack the policy of continental defense.
- Develop a plan of sabotage or production, either by slowing work or causing strikes and conflicts in industries producing raw materials.

It was certain now that the Communists had begun their attack on the mutual defense agreement of the nations of the Western hemisphere had entered into last August at the Rio conference.

ULTRASONIC:

High Pitch

Scientists at Pennsylvania State college have revealed that they are able to generate sound, too high-pitched to be audible to humans, which carries enough energy to kill a mouse, start a fire or keep 20 marbles suspended in mid-air.

A small, lantern-shaped siren chops air, released from a compressor, into sound waves having a pitch of 30,000 cycles, far above the highest pitch which normally can be heard by the human ear.

Researchers found they could burn a wad of cotton in six seconds by holding it above the siren in open air. White mice placed in the sound field died in one minute. The sound also boiled coffee, popped popcorn and killed insects.

Modern Methuselahs

World's highest proportion of centenarians is claimed by the small Italian town of Barga in Tuscany province, where 21 of the 11,000 residents will never see their hundredth birthday anniversaries again.

Boy Helped Solve Problem Of Bridging Niagara Falls

When the first bridge over Niagara Falls was planned in 1848, the problem of getting a cable from the American to the Canadian side was solved by offering \$5 to the first person who could make a kite carry a string across the 800-foot chasm.

After this had been accomplished by a boy, the string was used to pull over a small steel cable which, for several years, enabled persons to go back and forth, two at a time, in a little wire basket. The original steel suspension bridge thrown across the river just below the American falls had a span of 820 feet, and was long considered to be a feat of engineering.

Steps in the Training of a Good Hunting Companion

There's nothing like a good dog to add pleasure and profit to the hunt. But good dog companions don't just happen; practically without exception they are the products of long, conscientious training in the demands of the woods and fields. Some of the steps in the training of a good gun dog are here illustrated by Elias C. Vail, widely-known trainer of field dogs and director of the Gaines Research Kennels, Ridgefield, Conn.



"NO!" is one of the most valuable commands in preventing waste motion in hunting. A dog who will refrain from eating when commanded "No!" is well on the way toward being well trained.

"HEEL!" This command keeps the dog at his master's side ready for any contingency. Pointers and Setters "heel" on the right side while Retrievers walk on their master's left side.



"WHOA!" Picking the dog up and then planting him down firmly on all four feet while restraining him from moving is the best way to teach him to stop in his tracks on this command.



THE YOUNG DOG learns the correct form for a point by example from association with an older and well-trained dog. Constant correction leads to ultimate perfection of stance.



"COME!" is the first step in training a field dog. He learns from repeated tugs on a long lead and from pats when he obeys.



FIELD TRIAL DOGS are run in braces. Exuberant dogs have to be held back until they learn to stand without a lead while waiting for the starting signal.

HOLDING a point until a gun is fired is taught by having one man flush the bird while another holds the dog. After the gun is fired the dog is allowed to run to the end of a long lead, and thus comes to associate the two.

Washday for Lamp Shades Makes Rooms Brighter

ROOMS will look brighter when you establish a washday for the lamp shades and light bulbs, the Rural Home editor of nationally-circulated Capper's Farmer advises housewives.

"In the days of kerosene lamps it was part of the weekly housecleaning to wash lamp chimneys," she points out in the farm magazine read by 1,200,000 farm families. "But not everyone realizes that electric lighting calls for a regular cleaning program."

"Your lamp shades will give better service and look much better if they are kept clean."

Here are her directions for giving lamp shades a real soap and water treatment:

Remove a parchment or paper shade from lamp; go over it with a cloth rung quite dry from rich suds. Then go over the shade with a cloth wrung out of clear water. Finish by wiping it with a dry cloth. Examine the shade to see if bindings are glued or sewed on and if there are ornaments that might not be wash-



able. These should be cut off before washing.

Make up a tub of good rich, lukewarm suds. Plunge the shade up and down in the suds. Rub obstinate spots gently with two well-soaped fingers. After the shade is bright and fresh looking, give it several rinses of the same even lukewarm temperature.

Stand the shade to dry on a bath towel, away from sunlight or direct heat. You can hasten drying by blotting the shade between the palms of your hands with another bath towel. When the shade is partially dry reverse its position.

Don't forget, too, that electric bulbs should be cleaned regularly. Do not try to wash the electric bulbs in their sockets. The best way is to remove the bulb from the socket and wipe with a soft cloth wrung out of soapy water. Hold the bulb by the metal end while wiping the glass with the soapy cloth. This minimizes the risk of wetting the metal. If the metal part of the bulb gets wet, be sure not to screw back into its socket until it is completely dry.

Cleaning the Oven

Grease "baked on" in range ovens is hard to remove, the Rural Home editor of nationally-circulated Capper's Farmer points out. Scouring, unless done with care, may damage the enamel finish. So home economists with the U. S. Department of Agriculture suggest placing a shallow bowl of household ammonia — or a wadded cloth dampened in ammonia — in the oven for several hours or overnight. Fumes help loosen greasy film; a badly soiled oven may need several treatments.

POTTED chrysanthemums are a fall favorite that bloom until near Christmas. They must be kept cool, and flourish best in a heated room or sunporch.

Water only enough to keep them alive and in the spring start new plants by pinching off slips from tops of growing stems or using the new shoots around the base for slips.

Mums can be potted all year and planted outside in summer but during these winter months they need cool, moist air to survive.

You may want to know about preserving other indoor plants—cyclamen, primrose, cactus, geranium. Proper planting and watering for these and others are discussed in our booklet No. 29.
