## Swing of SOUTHWEST FARM MARKETS

Southwest farm markets maintained generally firm to higher trends last week, according to the Production and Marketing Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Grain markets reached new high levels and remained strong throughout the week. Principal strengthening factors included unfavorable condition of the winter wheat crop, short European supplies, and rapid y diminishing domestic feed grains needed for the coming winter feeding season. Texas wheat closed Friday at \$3.27.

Activity in southwest cotton markets continued brisk during the week. Farmers offered freely in most sections, as prices advanced around \$7.50 per bale.

Eggs and poultry sold steady to firm the past week in good holiday demand. Current receipt eggs brought 47 to 50 cents per dozen at Dallas and Fort Worth and a little more at Denver. Most markets bought turkeys close to support levels. Heavy hens brought mostly 24 to 26.

Cattle sold generally steady to 50 cents higher compared to a week earlier, the only notable exception being a net loss of 25 to 50 cents at Denver on steers and yearlings, which continued scarce at all markets. Common and medium cows brought from \$12 to \$15 at Texas markets, and \$14 to \$17 at Oklahoma City. Canners and cutters moved at \$9.50 to \$12.50 at Texas markets and up to \$13.50 at other southwest terminals.

Hogs lost 25 to 50 cents per hundred for the week at most southwest markets, but Oklahoma City netted a little gain. Closing top on butchers stood at \$25.25 at San Antonio and Wichita, \$25.75 at Fort Worth and Oklahoma City and \$26.25 at Denver. Sows brought \$22 to \$23 at San Antonio and \$23.50 to \$24.75 elsewhere.

# Ramadier Quits as French Premier, Vast Struggle for Power Develops; Marshall Hits Russian Accusations

**DIVIDED: All France**  
All Gaul is divided into three parts—Communist, Socialist and DeGaulle.

Unable to make an impression on the turbulent French scene, Premier Paul Ramadier resigned his office in the face of widespread Communist-inspired strikes and France's elder statesman Leon Blum was given a mandate to form a new Socialist government.

The situation in France had never been worse. It was with the terrifying possibility of a civil war looming as a result of the present deep unrest.

Underlying cause of it all is France's prostrate economic condition and the prospect of a cold, hungry winter. Even if U. S. stopgap aid is rushed through immediately it will fall far short of being the oil needed to pour on the troubled waters. Superimposed on that situation were these political factors:

1. The Socialist government, trying to pursue a moderate course, was being squeezed between the stronger Communists to the left and Gen. Charles De Gaulle's Rally of the French People on the extreme right.
2. The Communists, true to the teachings of Marx, were trying to foment revolution by instigating the paralyzing strikes after their legal and political methods to overthrow the government had failed.
3. General De Gaulle, seeking the governmental reins for himself, has said he would deal with the Communists with a strong, authoritarian hand. De Gaulle is feared because he stands for totalitarianism.

The real struggle for France is being waged between the Communists and DeGaulle's followers. Moderate Socialism is simply caught in the middle.

**FED UP: With Russia**  
To his Chicago audience, it sounded as though U. S. Secretary of State George Marshall was full up to here with Russia's obtuse and exasperating tactics in the field of international relations.

He made it clear that the state of active resentment of the Soviet Union, to which Americans have been goaded by the obstructionist actions of Russian leaders, can in no wise be interpreted as warmongering.

It was one of the most angry denunciations yet made against Russia by a high U. S. official, and there was a distinct possibility that it was a reasonably accurate reflection of the temper of the times. Marshall's Chicago address, added to all the other recent expressions of disgust (including President Truman's) with Russian policy, indicated that perhaps a U. S. ultimatum dealing with Soviet obstructionism was not too far distant.

As a matter of fact, a strong possibility existed that Marshall might make just such a stand at the London conference of foreign ministers to discuss German and Austrian peace treaties. Awaiting the conference with utmost seriousness, the secretary of state told his Chicago listeners that:

"It is my purpose to concentrate solely on finding an acceptable basis of agreement to terminate the present tragic stalemate and to speed the advent of a new era of peace and hope for Europe and the world."

**ROYAL EXPENSE: Going Up**

Before the wedding, parliament appropriated \$2,100,000 annually for the king, his brother, sister, mother and eldest daughter. However, King George has announced that he will ask no increased allowance for himself and Philip, but

Did you ever think of giving prize winning jellies or home preserved things for presents? They are one of the most pleasant gifts to receive as well as to give...

full rolling boil, over hottest flame. Stir constantly before and while boiling. Boil hard 1 minute. Remove from fire and stir in bottled pectin. Then stir and skim by turns for just 5 minutes to cool slightly...

Apricot Pineapple Jam. 1 pound dried apricots, 1 pint can crushed pineapple, 1 1/2 cups pineapple juice and water, 3 cups sugar. Soak apricots overnight; drain and cut into small pieces...

Grape and Mint Jelly. 3/4 cup cold water, 3 cups bottled grape juice, 1/4 cup lemon juice, 1 3-ounce package of powdered fruit pectin, 4 cups granulated sugar, 1/2 to 1 1/2 teaspoons peppermint extract.

Thrifty Marmalade. 3 1/2 cups prepared fruit, 5 cups sugar, 1/2 bottle fruit pectin.

To prepare fruit, use skins from 6 medium oranges and 2 medium lemons and cut in quarters. Lay quarters flat; shave off and discard about half of the white part.

Measure sugar and prepared fruit into large kettle, pour in the hot syrup and add a cup of water if necessary. Mix well and bring to a

Ginger Pear Conserves. 4 pounds pears, 2 lemons, 4 pounds sugar, 1/4 pound candied ginger. Peel, core and chop pears fine. Grate the rind, and add the juice from the lemons...

Apple Chutney. (Makes 6 pints) 4 pounds onions, peeled and chopped, 3 pounds green apples, peeled and chopped, 4 1/2 cups brown sugar, firmly packed, 1 pound seeded rasins, 2 teaspoons ginger, 2 teaspoons powdered cloves, 3 teaspoons cinnamon, 3 teaspoons salt, 3 tablespoons molasses, Dash of cayenne pepper.

Pineapple Chutney. 5 pounds cooking apples, peeled and chopped, 4 1/2 cups brown sugar, firmly packed, 3 pints cider vinegar, 2 teaspoons salt, 3 teaspoons ginger, 2 teaspoons cardamom seed, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, 1 teaspoon powdered cloves.

Combine all ingredients in a large kettle and simmer, uncovered, for about 1 1/2 hours, stirring occasionally until mixture becomes thick. Pour immediately into hot, sterilized preserve jars and seal immediately.

If vegetable or cereal burns, plunge the vessel in cold water and let stand a few minutes before removing contents. This will do away almost entirely with the burned taste.

Cabbage can be cut quickly on a coarse shredder. Cut head in half if it's a large one.

To save time and dishwashing when you use muffin tins, use paper baking cups in them. They don't need to be greased and muffins do not get all...

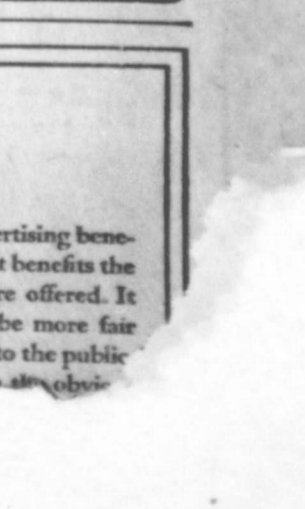

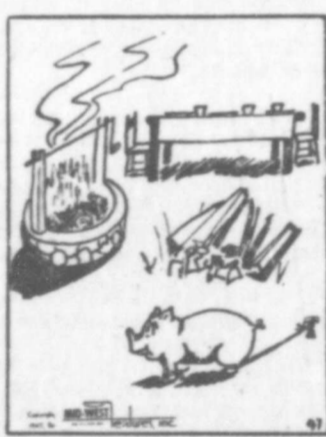
