## Swing of SOUTHWEST FARM MARKETS

Prices dropped, and livestock showed mixed trends last week, as other southwest farm products remained generally steady to strong, according to the Production and Marketing Administration, U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Spot cotton markets increased activity. Harvesting made good progress and neared completion except in the high plains. Prices declined \$1 to \$2 a bale.

Eggs weakened further at principal southwest markets, as poultry sold steadily to slightly stronger. Current receipt eggs moved mostly around 40 cents a dozen at Dallas and Denver, 45 to 47 at Fort Worth, and 48 at New Orleans. Heavy hens ranged generally from 23 to 25 cents a pound.

Hogs scored net gains at Oklahoma City and Wichita, but lost ground at other southwest terminals. San Antonio reached a high point for the week of \$27, Fort Worth \$28, Oklahoma City and Denver \$27.50. Most sows sold from \$23.50 to \$25, and stocker and feeder pigs from \$15 to \$23.

Cattle moved generally at strong to 1 or more higher prices this week, although slaughter prices and yearlings sold lower at Houston, Fort Worth and Oklahoma City. Houston bought common and medium grades at \$16 to \$22, and Fort Worth took medium and good lots from \$22 to \$30. Oklahoma City paid a top of \$34 for fed steers, and San Antonio set a new high of \$29 on commerially fed kinds.

## Grainger McIlhany Announces For State Representative

A 29 year old business man of Wheeler has announced his candidacy for State Representative in the 122nd district, embracing Gray, Wheeler, Collingsworth and Donley Counties.

He is Grainger McIlhany, a native of the county seat of Wheeler county, who enters the race with a surprisingly large voter backing, despite the fact he has spent practically all his life in a town of 1,000 population, and has never been a candidate for political office or served in any public capacity.

The young man has a large number of personal friends in the four-county district, many of them former classmates at the University of Texas. He attended T. U. six years, receiving degrees in business administration and law. He is listed among the honor students.

In addition to his college friends, McIlhany formed many friendships during his four years service in the U. S. Army. He was in the field artillery and saw action with the 13th armored division of the Third Army. He was discharged with the rating of technical sergeant.

The candidate wishes to emphasize he does not believe his army service qualifies him to represent his district in the state legislature. He requests that the voters' decision be based on his education, general background, and record as a private citizen.

McIlhany is a partner of his mother in the ownership of a dry goods store at Wheeler which he manages. The store was founded by his father, the late M. McIlhany, who was one of the area's pioneer merchants. Mr. McIlhany, like most early day tradesmen, operated a general mercantile establishment and supplied hundreds of East Panhandle ranch families in the early 1900's. The store was, and is, an average successful small town store with a 25 foot front.

Young McIlhany was "out on his own" for about four years. Between the time he got his BBA degree from Texas U in 1937 and his induction in the army in 1941, he was employed as an accountant. He has had some small legal practice since getting his LL.B. degree in 1946 but most of his time is occupied with management of the store, and it is his ambition to continue running the business.

The Wheeler young man decided to make the race for the legislature when the incumbent, R. I. Templeton of Wellington, announced he would not be a candidate to succeed himself. McIlhany said he would be able to devote his full time to the office during sessions of the legislature without it interfering too much with management of his own business.

He will appreciate voters checking up on him at Wheeler. Most of the older residents there have known him since he was a child.

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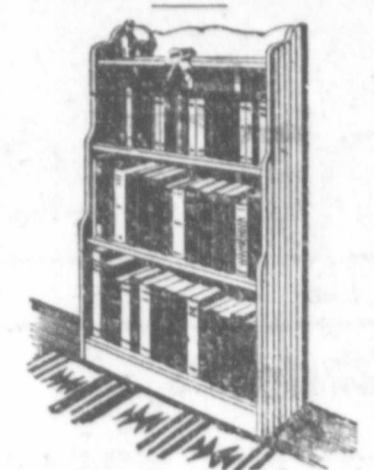

WEEKLY NEWS ANALYSIS Wallace Enters Presidential Race; Michael Quits as King of Romania; Farm Product Prices Hit New High

FOR PEACE Wallace Comes In

Henry Wallace was deluding no one, not even himself, about his chances of being elected President of the United States in 1948 on a third party ticket when, with zealous idealism, he announced that he would be an independent candidate.

His entry into the contest, as he announced on a nation-wide broadcast from Chicago, was based upon his revulsion against "the bi-partisan reactionary war policy which is dividing the world into two armed camps."

Both Republicans and Democrats, he indicated, can be filed in the same political pigeon-hole because both stand for the bi-partisan policies which are leading the nation to war and depression.

"That menace can be met and overcome only by a new political alignment in America which requires a new political party," averred the former vice president.

Whether or not it could be met by a third party — a "peace party" — founded on the assumption that the U. S. must adopt a softer, more co-operative attitude toward Russia and at the same time reject universal military training and preparedness in general was a question that probably even Wallace

history would not answer. Domestic political significance of Wallace's emergence as a third party candidate may be summed up briefly: Republicans like it, Democrats don't.

If Wallace can get on the ballots in one or more of the pivotal states — New York, Ohio, California, Pennsylvania or Illinois — he may be able to split off enough of the Democratic vote to swing the election to the Republican nominee.

Always the eminent liberal, Wallace is angling for all or a portion of the left-wing Democratic vote; and if he makes his inherent devotion to Rooseveltian ideals stick, he may be able to corral a considerable section of those on the left side.

One thing was certain. Wallace would have the hearty, although somewhat onerous, support of the Communists, no matter how much he might avow his own anti-Communist principles. He would have to go through the campaign with the Reds and fellow-travelers hanging to his coat-tails.

NEW HIGH: Farm Prices U. S. farmers continued to set new records in price levels, both for the produce they sell and the goods they in turn buy.

It was reported by the department of agriculture that the general level of farm prices rose 5 per cent between mid-November and mid-December to a record high of 301 per cent of the 1909-14 average.

Previous all-time high was 289 per cent, set last October. At the same time, prices paid by farmers for items for living and farm production also reached a new record. On December 15 the index of prices paid was 245 per cent above the 1909-14 average.

The farm price level in mid-December, the department said, was 14 per cent higher than January, 1947, and the index of prices paid 16 per cent higher.

Between mid-November and mid-December, average prices for virtually every group of farm commodities except fruit showed measurable increases.

REPUBLIC: Michael Quits Communist-controlled eastern Europe cast off its last tie with a happier past when King Michael I of Romania made public his abdication from the throne.

His announcement had not yet fully registered on Romania's bewildered populace when the Communist government promptly proclaimed the nation a "popular democratic republic."

Thus, with the 26-year-old monarch's abdication, ended a dynasty established in 1866, the last monarchy in the Soviet sphere of influence in eastern Europe and the last throne held by the House of Hohenzollern.

LIFE EXPECTANCY Science Lengthens Man's Span of Time on Earth You're never too old to get a break.

Middle-aged and elderly persons at last have begun to share in the progress of medical science which, until recently, conferred most of its benefits on children and young people.

It was estimated that a 40-year-old man's remaining span of life expectancy has lengthened only four years since 1789, medical improvements in the next quarter century are expected to secure for him much more time on earth.

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Warning Voice



On his traditional birthday interview in Washington, D. C., Gen. Peyton C. March, 83, World War I chief of staff, observed that the U. S. is "approaching the breaking point" with Russia and has "got to have" universal military training at once.

Michael, as some romanticists would have had it, might have renounced his throne purely for the love of Princess Anne of Bourbon-Parma and Denmark, but the Communist establishment of a "republic" and immediate reorganization of the government came too swiftly, too efficiently to lend much credence to that theory.

As the king himself pointed out in his abdication proclamation, he was resigning the throne because a monarchy no longer coincided with the "great political, economic and social changes" in Romania.

Nor was it logical for the Communists, grim advocates of their "international dictatorship of the proletariat," to be countenancing and cooperating with a hereditary monarchy. And Michael had acted as a sort of brake on some Communist actions in Romania.

DOWNTURN: Prices As two nation-wide retail firms announced major price reductions on a wide range of their goods American consumers stopped to wonder whether this might mark a definite break in the high price line or would simply turn out to be another incident like the Newburyport experiment last year.

General Electric company disclosed an average price cut of 5 per cent, effective January 1, on an extensive selection of home appliances. The company estimated consumers would save 50 million dollars this year as a result.

Sears Roebuck, large retail mail order house, put into the mails a regular mid-winter sales book listing price reductions up to 20 and 33 1/2 per cent on some merchandise.

The actions followed closely after President Truman signed the anti-inflation bill which would combat high prices by seeking voluntary agreements among business and industry to lower costs.

Charles E. Wilson, General Electric president, declared that the reductions were "not made to stimulate business." "We could sell in many lines twice what we can produce," he said.

He added his voice to the theory upon which the Republican congress based its recent anti-inflation act: That industry generally must take the initiative in reversing the inflationary trend.

London Braces England is full of suspense, but it isn't the kind that keeps a man's trousers up.

British braces (suspenders), made under a government order limiting the classic to three inches at the back, have been the cause of a number of London breaches falling down and finally drove Historian Arthur Bryant to reporting his plight in a letter to the London Times.

In the past year, he said, he bought four pairs of braces. "After each occasion," lamented Bryant, "the braces have broken irretrievably within three months."

The Times, in a helpful mood, depicted the situation in an editorial: "The Four Freedoms are a hollow mockery if our braces are going to be bursting all the time. No nation can be expected to hold up its head if it also is required to hold up its trousers."

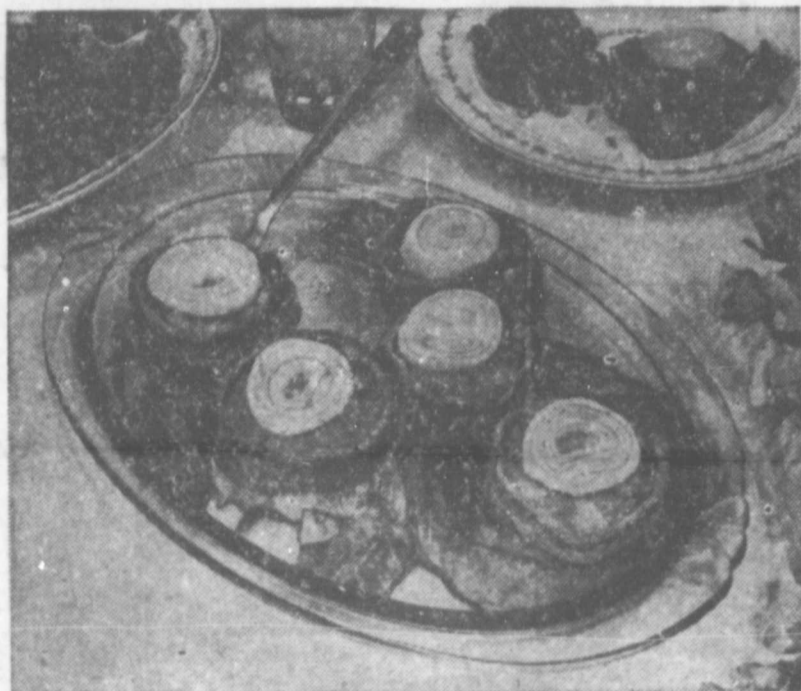

Stretch the Meat with Vegetables (See recipes below.)

**Mostly Vegetables**

What's the best way to save on meat? Serve smaller amounts and round the meal out with several vegetables.

When you come to consult figures on meat consumption you will realize that a great many of us actually overdo the eating on meat and take it easy on the vegetables. Now that the former is high in price and will become more scarce, if reports are true, plan to include more vegetables in your meals.

Here are some very satisfying main dishes which you will be wise to use. There's enough meat to satisfy the hungry and those with a taste for it, but there are also dishes which are budget-wise.

**\*Vegetable Pie.**

- 3 tablespoons butter
- 5 tablespoons flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon celery salt
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 3 cups milk
- 16 small white onions
- 1 cup cooked peas
- 1 cup cooked string beans or lima beans
- 3 cups cooked carrots
- 2 cups chopped leftover roast or meat loaf

Melt butter, add flour and stir until well blended. Add seasonings and then milk, stirring constantly until smooth and thick. Bring to a boil and cook for 2 minutes. Add vegetables and meat. Pour into a large baking dish; cover with the following:

- \*Peanut Butter Crust.**
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons peanut butter
- 1/2 cup milk
- 4 strips raw bacon fat

Sift together dry ingredients; add peanut butter and mix in thoroughly with a fork. Add milk to make soft dough. Turn out on floured board; toss lightly until the outside looks smooth. Roll out to fit baking dish. Cut slits for steam to escape; place on top of baking dish. Cut bacon in very small pieces over top and bake in a hot oven (425 degrees) about 20 minutes until bacon is crisp and brown.

Here is an interesting, well-seasoned dish which is both filling and satisfying in addition to being an excellent way in which to stretch a pound of meat:

**Talerni.**  
(Serves 6)

- 1 green pepper
- 1 pound hamburger
- 2 tablespoons oil
- 1 small can tomatoes
- 1 small onion
- 1 clove garlic
- 1/4 pound dry noodles
- 1 can corn kernels
- 1 can ripe olives
- 1/2 cup olive liquid
- 1/2 cup Longhorn cheese

Fry cut-up pepper and hamburger in oil. When browned, add tomatoes

Don't overload your refrigerator and keep it defrosted in cold as well as hot weather. An excess of ice will cut down on the cold you actually have in the refrigerator.

Your sewing machine should be oiled after each day's sewing, or after 8 to 10 hours of stitching.

The most practical way in which to defrost quickly is to have the current turned off; empty the ice trays all with warm water.

and remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil, then turn down heat and cook from 45 to 60 minutes.

**Vegetable Loaf.**  
(Serves 6)

- 1/2 cup cooked peas
- 1/2 cup cooked string beans
- 1/2 cup chopped carrots
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 egg
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika

Press peas through a sieve, cut beans into small pieces, and combine all vegetables. Add milk, slightly beaten egg, crumbs and seasonings. Turn into a greased baking dish and bake in a moderate (350 degree) oven until firm. Serve with 2 1/2 cups medium white sauce to which has been added 4 tablespoons of deviled ham. Blend thoroughly.

There are innumerable ways in which that good protein food, cheese, can stretch vegetables while substituting for meat. Here are several taste-tempting ideas.

**Macaroni-Stuffed Peppers.**  
(Serves 6)

- 6 green peppers
- 1 cup cooked elbow macaroni
- 1/2 pound grated American cheese
- 1 cup cooked tomatoes
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs
- 1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Dash of pepper

Cut a slice off the top of each pepper and cook in boiling salted water for 5 minutes. Drain and remove seeds. Mix remaining ingredients, saving 1/2 of cheese for top. Fill peppers with mixture, stand upright in pan and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for 30 minutes.

**Broccoli With Cheese.**  
(Serves 6)

- 1 onion, minced
- 6 tablespoons butter
- 4 tablespoons flour
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 2 1/2 pounds cooked broccoli
- 1/2 cup dry bread crumbs

Cook onion in 4 tablespoons of butter until tender, stir in flour and add milk gradually, stirring constantly. Add seasoning, egg yolk and cheese. Pour half of sauce into baking dish, arrange broccoli on top of sauce and cover with remaining sauce. Sprinkle with bread crumbs and dot with remaining butter. Bake in a hot (400 degree) oven about 20 minutes.

**AID TO SPREADS**

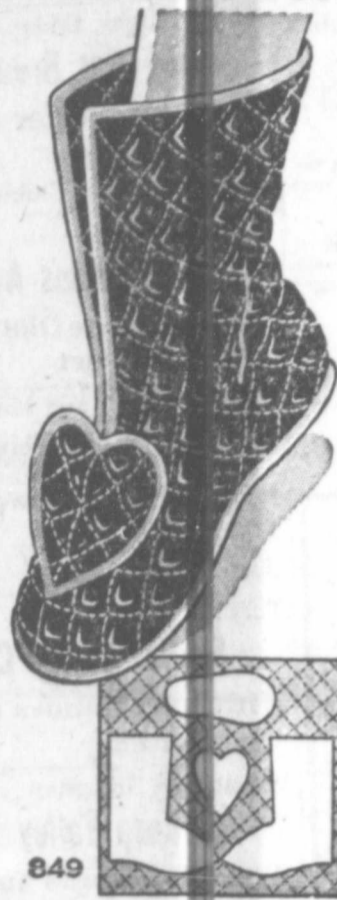
A little citrus juice mixed into many sandwich spreads not only improves the flavor but also thins the mixture for easier spreading. Try a dash of orange juice in cheese spreads, ham or peanut butter.

Any equipment which has an electrical element should never be immersed in water. This includes roasters, coffee pots, mixers, toasters, waffle irons, griddles, etcetera. The motor may be wiped with a damp cloth, but carefully so as not to get it too wet. Always have the equipment disconnected.

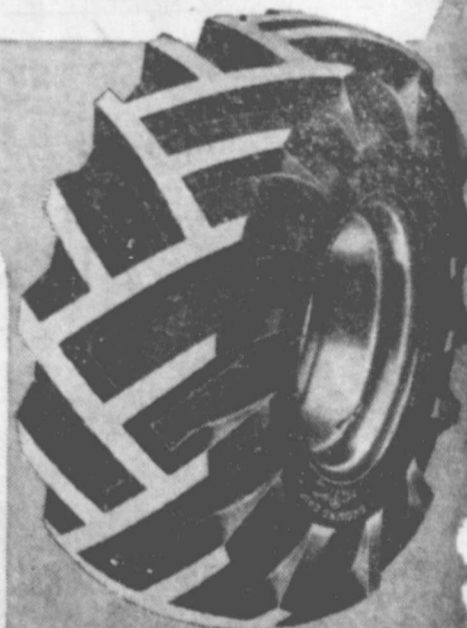

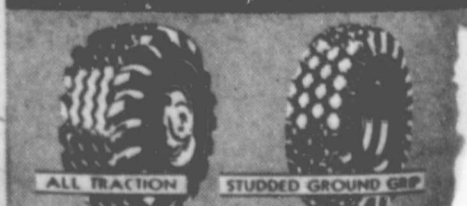
