## To Honor Lt. Hansard Games Tournament

Among the 134 exstudent war dead being honored by John Tarleton College, Stephenville, is 1st Lt. V. A. Hansard, Jr., former resident of Hedley. These men will be commemorated by the erection of a Memorial Stadium toward which \$55,000 of the \$100,000 goal has been raised. The movement is sponsored by the Tarleton Ex-Students Association.

The stadium will be located on a 38 acre tract recently acquired by the college. It will consist of dressing rooms, showers and other facilities under the stands, and will have a seating capacity of 8,000.

Lt. Hansard, son of Rev. and Mrs. V. A. Hansard of Pleasant Valley, was killed Nov. 25, 1944, while piloting his bomber back from a mission over Germany. The plane had suffered intense fighter and flak damage and crashed somewhere in England prior to returning to its base.

V. A. finished high school in Hedley, entering Tarleton College in 1941. His entry into the Army Air Force in 1942 interrupted his educational work but friends say he intended to recommence his studies upon his return from military service.

## County AAA Program Is Announced

The Donley County Agricultural Conservation Association committee along with the County Agent and representatives from the other government agencies, and the local banks have agreed to accept the practices listed here as those for which payment assistance will be offered under the 1949 Agricultural Conservation Program. Payment will be made for:

1. Construction of large ridge type terraces, and small ridge terraces for which necessary outlets and waterways are provided.
2. Construction of diversion terraces to control excess water.
3. Field strip cropping.
4. Subsoiling to permit better penetration of water.
5. Bringing clod forming subsoil to the surface of sandy cropland to prevent wind erosion.
6. Leaving on the land as a protection against wind erosion the stalks or stubble of sorghums or millet.
7. Managing crop residues to protect soil from wind erosion.
8. Contour seeding drilled grasses, legumes or small grains.
9. Constructing or enlarging drainage ditches.
10. Leveling land for irrigation where water is available.
11. Drilling or digging wells for livestock water.
12. Construction of earthen dams or reservoirs for livestock water or erosion control.
13. Elimination of destructive plants on noncrop pasture and range land.
14. Controlling competing weeds in pasture by mowing.
15. Establishing a satisfactory cover of winter legumes and ryegrass seeded in the fall of 1948

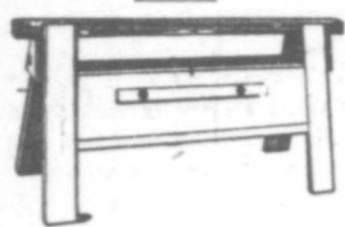

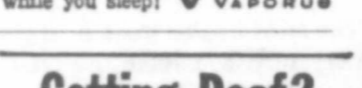

WEEKLY NEWS ANALYSIS

Record Budget Given to Congress; Acheson Confirmation Predicted; British Say Israel Menaces Peace

RECORD BUDGET:

Asked of Congress

President Truman, presenting a proposal for the largest peacetime budget in U. S. history to the congress, was greeted with the expected reaction. Democrats applauded, Republicans instantly demanded deep slashes in recommended outlay. It became evident quickly that the fight on adoption of the budget would be carried out strictly along party lines.

THE PRESIDENT declared it would take 41 billion, 858 million dollars to run the government right for the next year. And the punch line was that half of every American tax dollar would be spent to hold back the Communist tide in the world.

On a party line basis, approval of the budget was assured, assuming, of course, that the Democrats hold fast. The President had a comfortable majority in both houses and there should be no difficulty in getting his proposal adopted.

But the 41 billion-plus figure wasn't all. Mr. Truman served notice he will ask more funds later to supply arms to non-Communist nations, a step which would push the budget even higher.

THE ONLY possible bar to approval of the Truman budget was public reaction to the plan to finance with 50 cents of every American dollar anti-Red activities abroad. Would the people go along with American foreign policy and the theories of policy-makers that such a step was the only answer to Communist menace? Apparently the President is confident, because the people will support him in such a move and thus showed no hesitancy in his budget proposals nor in making his declaration that he plans to call upon the American people for even more money to stem the Communist tide.

Already thoughts are turning to the 1950 congressional elections and congressmen whose senses were not completely lulled by the 1948 Democratic sweep, may want to sound out the public sentiment on the high expenditure program. If that is the case, public opinion may be the final factor in adoption of the budget.

PALESTINE:

Toil And Trouble

The British lion was roaring at a snail.

In a prepared statement, the English government declared that Palestine developments are "gravely threatening world peace."

Coupled with the diatribe was a report that Ernest Bevin, British foreign secretary, had offered to resign because of his Palestine policy and that Prime Minister Attlee had refused to accept the resignation.

THIS WAS instantly and emphatically denied. All these developments came as Israel formally filed with the U. N. security council at Lake Success a complaint that the British were fomenting an "artificial crisis" over Palestine by troop movements and various actions just as negotiations were about to open with Egypt.

The British foreign office statement warned that the security council has been "losing control over events" and said it had a reason to fear new Jewish violations of the cease-fire orders in the Holy Land area.

Meanwhile, the critics of British policy in the Middle East prepared to demand that Secretary Bevin explain how it happened that five RAF planes were shot down by the Israelis near the Palestine border. Britain's air ministry asserted all five planes were shot down while flying over Egypt.

IT COULD NOT be denied that the situation was difficult. Broken down to its basic essentials, it is a condition where one people must, or have been told they must, give way to the infiltration of another people—the Jews moving into Palestine and the Holy Land area, the Arabs moving out. It has never been a secret that British sympathies, for whatever reason, lie with the Arabs and John Bull looks with jaundiced eye on the partition action and the influx of the Jews. But the United States and some other nations have sided with the movement to return the Jews to their homeland, and thus the stalemate.

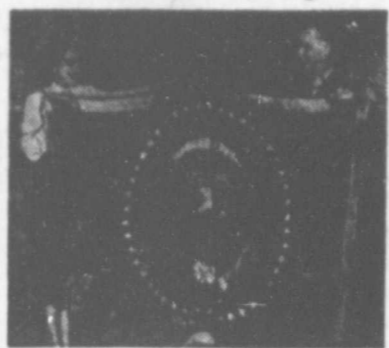
It may yet require organization of and action by a United Nations police force to settle the affair.

ACHESON:

Should Make It

General belief was that Dean Acheson would be confirmed by the senate as secretary of state. Named by President Truman to succeed George C. Marshall, Acheson is certain to be taken over by the hordes in public hearings on his appointment.

Protege of Justice Felix Frankfurter and former intimate and employe of Franklin D. Roosevelt, intimate with and former employe of Alger Hiss and a law partner of Donald Hiss, Acheson must inevitably be reminded of these facts by some of his interrogators.

On the other hand, he can point to a long and distinguished record of public service in which his loyalties have never been questioned. But in view of the current spy hunt in Washington and Acheson's connection with some of its principal figures, it would be little less than a miracle if his appointment were to be unquestioned.

According to the record, Acheson began his state department career with an attitude sympathetic to Russia—that is, to the extent that he believed the United States should do everything possible to get along with the Russians. But, since Yalta and Potsdam, observers report that attitude has changed and he is now one of the most determined anti-appeasers.

The ghost of Franklin Roosevelt will walk and the echoes of the Yalta and Potsdam parleys will rustle as the Acheson hearings progress. But with Truman supporters firmly in the saddles, there is little doubt of Acheson's final confirmation.

DESTRUCTION:

Nothing to Chance

Destruction would be certain... there would be nothing left to chance if military scientists perfect their newest idea of a guided missile. This would be no "ordinary" guided missile. Instead, it would be one that would identify its target from a picture, then attack it.

That's no fantastic dream of the men who plan the weapons of war. A hint of its imminence was contained in a "glossary of guided missile terms" made public by the federal research and development board.

The glossary's reference to the subject was terse, saying merely this:

"Guidance, homing, active—A system of homing guidance wherein the source, for illuminating the target, and the receiver are carried within the missile."

Here was the general idea: A guided missile (it could be a rocket or merely a pilotless plane) fitted with a television set and a picture of the intended target—perhaps an aerial photograph of a city. The missile is launched in the general direction of the target. When it arrives at a point when the pattern of the picture matches what its television "eye" sees, the missile "homes in" on the target.

That's an over simplified description because thousands of complex electronic actuating computing devices must make instantaneous and accurate reckonings; link the "eye" and the "brain" of the missile to its controls, and relay back to the base from which the missile was launched information on where it is and what it "sees."

Man's ingenuity in developing destructive devices apparently has not yet reached its zenith.

**Restyling Helps Add Interest When You Grow Tired of Clothes**

By *Erta Haley*

**ABOUT THIS TIME** of year, almost every woman can hardly wait for the new season's clothes to come out, and at the same time she has tired of clothes she's been wearing since last fall.

The answer to this problem is some simple restyling on clothes of which you have tired. Restyling does not involve any such extensive job as remaking a dress or hat completely. It simply means that you add some new touches to the clothing that you have to wear for a few months longer.

A new set of collars and cuffs, a bit of hem interest, a new set of buttons, a fresh yoke or plastron on a dress are refreshing and will add new life and interest to many garments.

Or, change the cuffs on a pair of fabric gloves by adding a dash of color. For a piece of fine veiling on a hat, substitute a piece of coarsely textured material and see how delighted you will be.

Dramatic buttons on a weary suit guarantee new interest. Some clip-on jewelry for your hand bag makes it almost new! These are all simple restyling tricks, but they will lift any wardrobe out of the doldrums until you can don lighter, gayer things of the new season.

**Do Cleaning, Repairs Before Restyling**

You will be both surprised and delighted at how much life you can bring to clothing with proper cleaning. Much of the original texture and shape of the garment can be restored to dresses, sweaters, hats and coats when dirt and grime are displaced. Wash those pieces which are guaranteed washable, and clean or have cleaned those which require it.

Repair buttons, snaps, zippers and other parts of the garment which need it. If the garment still

same material to hold the dress together.

Hem interest is still high, and a ruffled or gathered hem may be added to a full, flaring skirt, or a softly gathered one. If you are working with the skirt alone, and adding restyling in the form of a new hem to it, carry out the same motif in the pockets, too.

If you're adding the hem to a dress, it's easy to make a collar and cuffs of the same material as the hem. This forestalls an appearance of face-lifting, and makes the garment look as though just purchased.

In cases where you have gained or lost weight during the season, the restyling will consist of letting out or taking in a garment. The latter is an easy matter; the former slightly more difficult since material may have to be added.

For the too tight basic dress, add an inverted panel of trimming and use the same trim on the cuffs. For dresses that have become shorter because you've gained weight, a new hem plus collar and cuffs may be added.

**How to Restyle Torn Blouses**

There's a lot of under-arm strain on blouses resulting in tears beyond repair. For the short-sleeved blouse which has torn, full, new sleeves may be added.

For sleeves which have torn at the armhole, it's best to cut down the blouse and make a dickey out of it.

For lace which is frayed and shabby at the front of the blouse, carefully rip out the old, and insert some new lace which will match closely that which has been removed.

Blouses which button down the back, frequently tear at the button holes, or where the buttons are sewed. This is easily mended by placing a long strip of matching mending tape on either side, preferably on the button side. Place the tape inside where the fabric will cover it and then sew the buttons on that. It means a good reinforcing job.

**Change Your Shabby Accessories**

It's a simple matter to buy a new belt or change a tarnished buckle on the old one in preference to wearing a shabby one. Besides that, a fresh new belt or a reconditioned one will do more for both waistline and dress.

Clasps, zippers and trimmings on purses can be changed either by yourself or a repair shop. If a favorite hand-bag has a worn lining, it's easy enough to mend it or buy a new piece of fabric to make a fresh one.

Suede and leather cleaners may be used on gloves to good advantage. A stiff-bristled brush used on a suede bag will bring new life to it.

Try a brisk brushing, too, on a felt or suede hat and see how well the nap comes up in it. Many hats need nothing more to restore them than thorough brushing which will rid them of several month's accumulation of dust that dulls their color.

For hats which have been caught too frequently in rain and snow, do or have done, a re-blocking job. With a change of veiling in addition to this, hats will become practically new.



Add a new yoke . . . does not create more of an interest, embark on a bit of restyling.

**Buy or Make Your Patterns**  
Yokes, plastrons, collars and cuffs as well as puffy peplums which are now being used may be cut from tissue paper at home, or purchased if you don't feel clever about designing them.

Check your own sources of materials before purchasing any. A bit of precious lace from an old dress or trimming may give you a new



Or ruffle to restyle dress. yoke for a dress or collars and cuffs. It's possible to sew imitation rhinestones into the lace to add glitter and new life to the lace.

Old evening apparel often yields a piece of taffeta or net that can be utilized into yokes, collars or cuffs. The new tissue taffeta may be purchased by the yard to add a plastron to the front of a dress. Almost any type of material can be used to add a portrait ruffle neckline to a dress. Make a belt of the
