## .fe Methods for Canning Blac

 e Peas at HomeHot Pack Method: Wash peas. Precook by coverng to a rolling boil. Drain. ing toa rean tolass jars or tin cans Add fresh boiling water to $\frac{t}{4}$ inch from top of jars and $\frac{1}{\frac{1}{2}}$ inch from tops of tin cans. Work out bubbes with a knife blade. Wipe mouth of containers with clean damp eloth. Seal. Place in hot pressure canner containing 1 to nches of boiling water. After steam appears, allow 10 minutes
steaming period, then close steaming period, then close petpounds pressure for hot to pounds pres
method are:
Glass jars: pints, 35 minutes
quarts, 40 minutes
Tin Cans: No. 2,30 minutes At No. 3,35 minutes out fire or remove canner from the fire. When jars are used leave the petcock closed until the gauge returns to zero. Cool jar
away from drafts. When tincan ofe used, release pressure at en by moving about in container cold water.
