Unit To Be In Friona

On Wednesday, July 20, from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., The Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Baptist Hospital Mobile Mammography Unit will be in Friona, at Parmer County Hospital, 1307 Cleveland. Exams are done by appointment only. For information or to schedule an appointment call 1-800-377-HOPE (4673) or (806) 359-4673.

The total cost of the screening is \$70. This includes the x-ray, physical breast exam, and the radiology fee for reading the mammogram. Funding has been provided by the Texas Department of Health to allow for free breast

The major goal of the clinic is the early detection of breast cancer. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self-examination, and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method know to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptions of breast cancer. (1) Learn and perform breast self-examination every month. (2) Have a physical examination every year. (3) Have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age: Age 40, one baseline mammogram; 40 to 49, a mammogram every 1 to 2 years; 50

and over, yearly mammograms.

It was reported this week by Methodist pastor, Steve Venable, that the Methodist Church will be offering a variety of activities this summer for the youth.



Other activities will include a backpacking trip June 26 through barbecue and many other July 2 to Weminuche Wilderness near Pagosa Springs, Colorado.


