Supt. Davis Explains Why Pupils Must Be In School

Every child in the State who is six years and not nore than sixteen years of age shall be required to attend the public school in the district of its residence, or in some other district to which it may be transferred as provided by law, for a period of not less than one hundred and twenty days. Any child not so exempt may be exerted for temporary absence due to personal sickness, sickness or death it the family, quarantine, severe storm which has destroyed bridges and made the regular means of travel dangerous, or for unusual cause acceptable to the teacher, principal or superintendent of the school in which said child is enfolled; provided that the excuses are in writing and signed by the parent or guardian of said child. Any case so excured may be investigated by the truancy officer discharging the duties of said attendance officer for the school from which said child is so exc sed.

Supt. A. L. Davis states that parents who have hildren that have not enrolled in school shall have them enrolled at a ce and they will be forced to attend school one hundred and twenty cays. This will be enforced by a truancy officer employed by the Helley School Board of Education. As provided by law a parent can be assessed a fine of \$5.00 for first warning, \$10.00 for second, \$20.00 to third, and if this fails, a child can then be sent to a reform school.

Hot breads give cool weather meals that essential stick-to-the-ribs quality. More than that, their aroma and appeal gets the family to the dining table without coaxing!

FIRST on our parade of quick bread recipes is this for a bran nut bread which may be varied in four different ways:

Bran Nut Bread (Makes 1 loaf, 41/2x91/2 inch pan)

- 1 egg 34 cup sugar
- 1 cup milly 2 tablespoons melted short-
- 34 cur bran 21/4 cups sifted flour
- 1 teaspoon salt 3 teaspoons baking powder

34 cup chopped nutmeats Beat egg and sugar until light. Add milk, shortening and bran. Sift flour with salt and baking powder; combine with nutmeats; add to first mixture, stirring only until flour disappears. 



Symbolic Trains **Dramatize CROP**



A miniature railroad train is being used by approximately 2000 agri-cultural counties in the nation to dramatize their participation in the Christian Rural Overseas program (CROP), the overseas relief project of American churches.

After a county fills an actual railroad car with bulk commodities for the needy abroad, the county CROP chairman sends a miniature boxcar to state headquarters to be joined to the state train. Ultimately, the state trains will be joined into one long national train, symbolizing the expression of Christian brotherhood by Rural America. Rita Berger, of the Chicago CROP office, holds one of the symbolic Friendship Food Trains which are being distributed to counties.

The harvest season drive, to collect 3500 railroad carloads of commodities such as wheat, corn, milk and beans, now is in progress in this and 34 other top agricultural states. The program is sponsored by Catholic Rural Life, Church World Service (22 Protestant denominations) and Lutheran World Relief.






