## Supt. Davis Explains Why Pupils Must Be In School

Every child in the State who is six years and not more than sixteen years of age shall be required to attend the public school in the district of its residence, or in some other district to which it may be transferred as provided by law, for a period of not less than one hundred and twenty days. Any child not so exempt may be excused for temporary absence due to personal sickness, sickness or death in the family, quarantine, severe storm which has destroyed bridges and made the regular means of travel dangerous, or for unusual cause acceptable to the teacher, principal or superintendent of the school in which said child is enrolled; provided that the excuse is in writing and signed by the parent or guardian of said child. Any case so excused may be investigated by the truancy officer discharging the duties of said attendance officer for the school from which said child is so excused.

Supt. A. L. Davis states that parents who have children that have not enrolled in school shall have them enrolled at once and they will be forced to attend school one hundred and twenty days. This will be enforced by a truancy officer employed by the Hedley School Board of Education. As provided by law a parent can be assessed a fine of \$5.00 for first warning, \$10.00 for second, \$20.00 for third, and if this fails, a child can then be sent to a reform school.

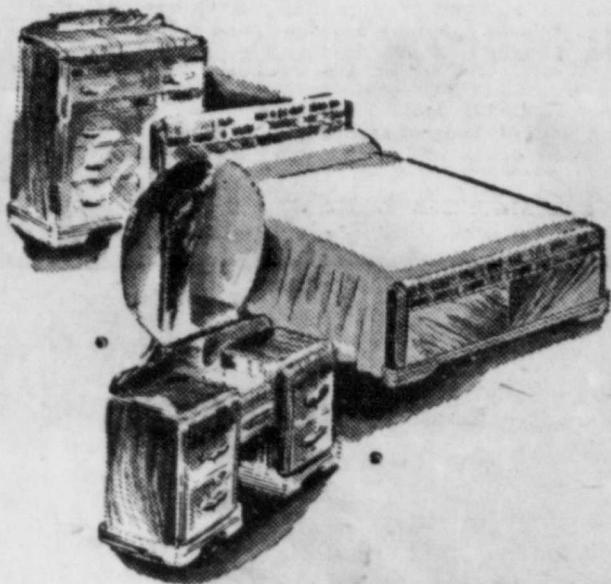

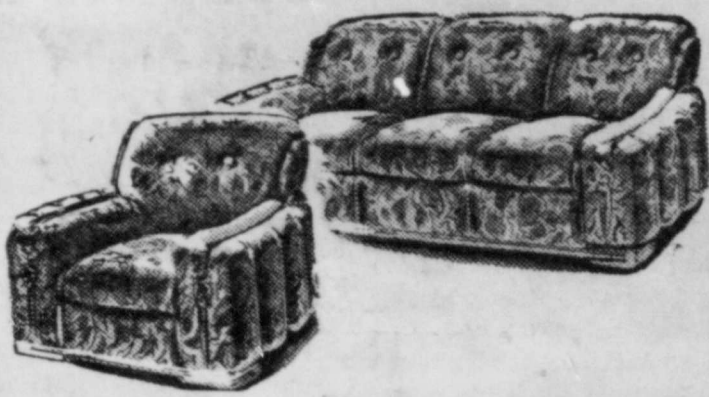

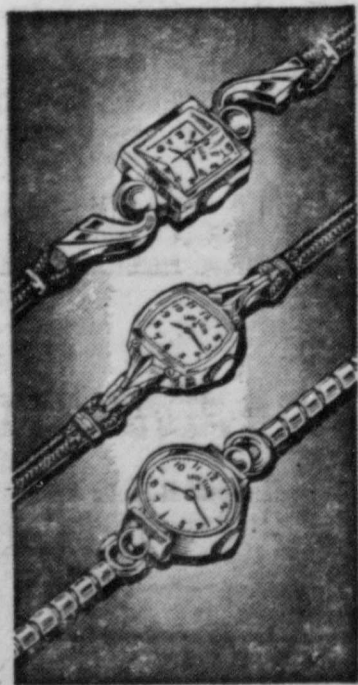

## It Looked Good But Do You Know What Happened?

### "JUST ONE LITTLE BITE"

By DON HEROLD

All that Socialism asks is that we take one little bite at a time. That's what the serpent said to Adam and Eve.

And we are tempted to try just one little bite, because, after all, we are by nature curious and what harm can one little bite do?

First thing you know we've eaten the whole apple.

That's how England got her Socialism just nibbling at it. It was

a definite, cold blooded policy of the founders of Socialism in England to feed it to the nation gradually—without even mentioning the word Socialism. The movement got going in 1905. Now 44 years later England is the victim of the snake in the tree. The same sneaking attack is being made by Socialism on American methods of life. Unless we watch out, we'll be sold piecemeal on letting the government do everything for us, instead of sticking to the American "do-it-yourself" ideals which have made us so strong.

They'll try to socialize our industries, one by one. To take one field

by industry alone, our federal government has already built or bought 46 hydroelectric and 10 steam power plants. And 42 additional plants are under construction or have funds appropriated, while Congress has authorized construction of 74 future plants. In all, the government has plans which would involve expenditures in this field of over 40 billion dollars.

And that would be just the beginning of Socialism's conquest of American industry. Socialism doesn't declare its intentions. It makes a slow, creeping advance. All it asks is "Take just this one little bite now."

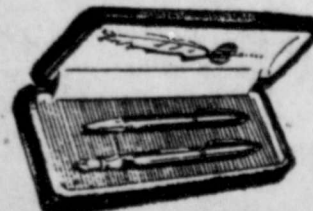

Fragrant Quick Breads Are Easily Made  
(See Recipes Below)

### Bake Them Often

QUICKLY BAKED BREADS provide inspiration for any meal and snack, so they're easily won the few minutes it takes to mix and bake them.

Give your breakfast a lift with some delightful fruit and nut bread by baking it while the stragglers are getting down to breakfast. Or, why not plan to make an inspired lunch box with some delightful variations of a quickly baked bread?

Snacks are something special if you have some beautifully textured prune bread with a spread of cream cheese and jelly. Dinners, too, can be budget-wise if you'll take less than half an hour to mix and bake honey butter roll-ups or orange-date muffins.

Hot breads give cool weather meals that essential stick-to-the-ribs quality. More than that, their aroma and appeal gets the family to the dining table without coaxing!

FIRST on our parade of quick bread recipes is this for a bran nut bread which may be varied in four different ways:

**Bran Nut Bread**  
(Makes 1 loaf, 4 1/2 x 9 1/2 inch pan)

1 egg  
3/4 cup sugar  
1 cup milk  
2 tablespoons melted shortening  
3/4 cup bran  
2 1/4 cups sifted flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
3/4 cup chopped nuts

Beat egg and sugar until light. Add milk, shortening and bran. Sift flour with salt and baking powder; combine with nuts; add to first mixture, stirring only until flour disappears. Spread in greased loaf pan, which has been fitted with waxed paper at the bottom. Bake in a moderate (350°) oven for 1 hour and 10 minutes.

**DELICIOUS** pineapple coffee cake which bakes in less than an hour will be welcome at breakfast on chilly mornings.

**Pineapple-Currant Coffee Cake**  
(Makes 1 9-inch cake)

2 cups sifted flour  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/4 cup sugar  
1/4 cup shortening  
1 egg, beaten  
3/4 cup milk  
1/2 cup currants  
1/2 cup drained, crushed pineapple

**Orange crumb topping**  
Sift together flour, baking powder and salt with sugar. Cut in shortening until mixture is crumbly. Add egg and milk, stirring until flour is moistened. Drop batter into greased nine-inch cake pan spreading evenly. Spread currants and pineapple over top of batter and sprinkle with orange crumb topping:

2 tablespoons butter  
2 tablespoons sugar  
1/4 cup flour  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon  
3 tablespoons grated orange rind  
1/4 cup dry bread crumbs

**Prune Bread**  
(Makes 1 loaf)

2 cups white wheat flour  
1 cup white flour  
1 teaspoon soda  
1 teaspoon baking powder  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 cup cooked, drained, chopped prunes  
1 egg  
1 cup prune juice  
1/4 cup milk  
3 tablespoons melted butter

Sift together dry ingredients. Add prunes and mix well. Combine beaten egg, prune juice and milk, and add with melted butter to the first mixture. Pour into a greased loaf pan. Bake in a moderate (350°) oven for 1 1/4 hours.

**\*Honey Butter Roll-Ups**  
(Makes about 16)

2 cups sifted flour  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
4 tablespoons shortening  
3/4 cup milk  
1 tablespoon melted butter  
2 tablespoons honey  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Sift flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening. Add enough milk to form a soft dough. Turn out on lightly floured board and knead 1/2 minute. Divide into two equal portions. Roll each portion into a circle and spread with melted butter and honey; sprinkle with cinnamon. Cut into pie shaped pieces. Roll up beginning at wide end. Bake in a hot (450°) oven for 10-12 minutes.

**Orange-Date Muffins**  
(Makes 12 muffins)

1/2 cup sifted flour  
1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 cup dates, chopped fine  
Grated rind of 1 large orange  
1/4 cup molasses  
1 egg, beaten  
1 cup milk  
1/4 cup melted shortening

Sift together white flour, baking powder, sugar and salt. Add dates and orange rind; mix well. Add whole wheat flour. Combine molasses, egg, milk and melted shortening. Add to dry ingredients and mix only until ingredients are moistened. Do not beat until smooth. Spoon batter into well greased muffin pans, 2/3 full. Bake in a hot (400°) oven about 20 minutes.

Leftover meat and chicken can be made into really generous hot sandwiches if they're dipped in egg-milk mixture, then fried. Serve with spiced fruit for a completely satisfying supper.

### U. S. Motorists Learn To Drive More Safely

CHICAGO.—American motorists are learning to drive more safely, according to the 1949 edition of the National Safety Council's statistical yearbook, "Accident Facts."

The 1948 traffic volume was the greatest in the nation's history—8 per cent greater than 1947. Yet the mileage death rate—deaths per 100,000,000 vehicle miles—was the lowest in the nation's history. The 8.0 rate was 30 per cent lower than the average rate of 11.5 through World War II. If the higher rate had prevailed last year, 14,000 more lives would have been lost.

However, there still were 32,000 traffic deaths in 1948—only 700 fewer than in 1947.

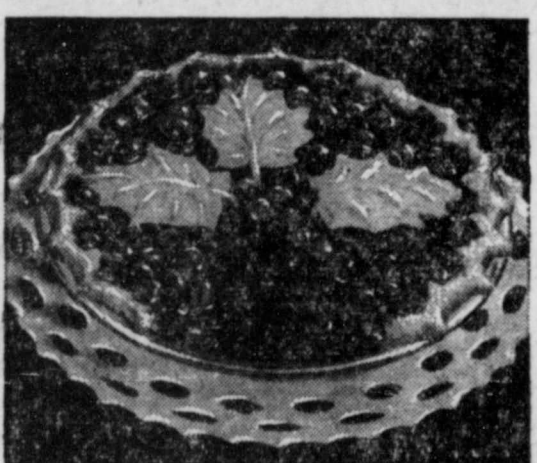

A miniature railroad train is being used by approximately 2000 agricultural counties in the nation to dramatize their participation in the Christian Rural Overseas program (CROP), the overseas relief project of American churches.

After a county fills an actual railroad car with bulk commodities for the needy abroad, the county CROP chairman sends a miniature boxcar to state headquarters to be joined to the state train. Ultimately, the state trains will be joined into one long national train, symbolizing the expression of Christian brotherhood by Rural America. Rita Berger, of the Chicago CROP office, holds one of the symbolic Friendship Food Trains which are being distributed to counties.

The harvest season drive, to collect 3500 railroad carloads of commodities such as wheat, corn, milk and beans, now is in progress in this and 34 other top agricultural states. The program is sponsored by Catholic Rural Life, Church World Service (22 Protestant denominations) and Lutheran World Relief.

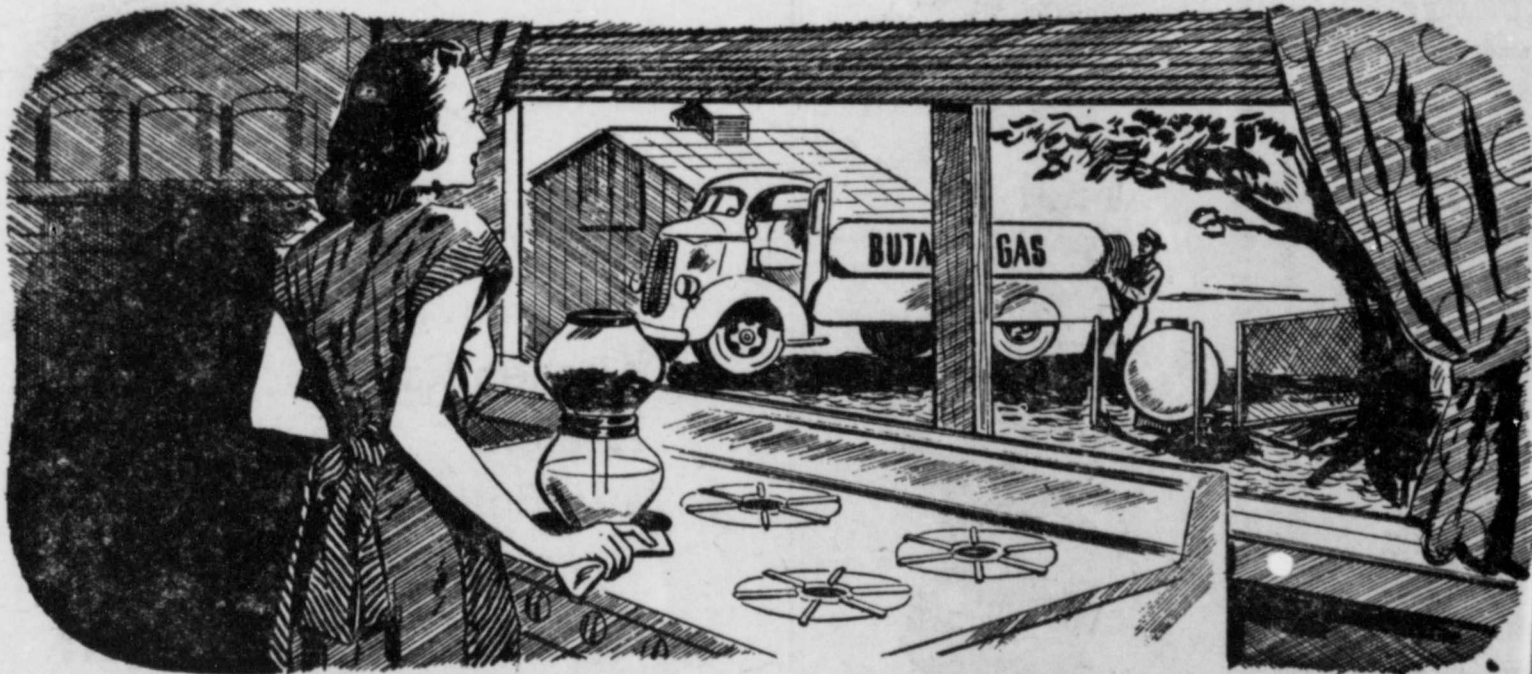
