The school has purchased a 36 passenger GMC bus which cost \$2432. A payment has already been made of \$642, which leaves a balance on bus of \$1800. This will be paid out at \$600 per year for the next three years.

Money for the bus will be paid from the activity fund each year. Money furnished from this source will not cost the school. This bus will not be used on any route as soon as the new route bus arrives.

## Mary Alice Hunsucker Crowned Queen of Annual School Carnival

The annual school carnival was held last Saturday night in the high school auditorium. A large crowd attended and enjoyed various games of chance and no chance. The high spot of the evening was the crowning of the princess and queen of the carnival.

The grade school princess was Patricia Pritchard of the 8th grade. The high school queen was Mary Alice Hunsucker of the 12th grade. Both coronations were impressive, with some comic relief in the queen coronation proving very popular.

The carnival gross was \$839.72, with the classes receiving 40% of their gross receipts from both the queen contest and the class booths, or a total of \$333.63. The classes had to pay their own expenses from their 40%.

The school had expenses of \$5.60, leaving a net of \$500.49, which will be used to make a payment on the new activity bus which arrived some time ago.

## SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Parents are cooperating much better than in past years in their children attending school. Compulsory attendance is an important item in our school system today in having children in school who have not attended for a long time. Education is essential so that each man and woman may go out into society and lead a normal successful life.

Many parents have cooperated to the extent that about 22 new students have enrolled recently for the first time this school year. Since school opened about 100 students have enrolled who did not attend the Hedley schools last year.

Some parents are somewhat uninterested in their child getting an education, but only interested in the 120 days the child must be in school. Starting Monday, Dec. 12, the school will only have 120 teaching days left. Some parents get the idea that their child can start to school after the first of the year and get the required amount of days in attendance.

The child must be enrolled now in order to meet the State requirement. All parents who have children between the ages of 6 and 16 better enroll them at once or suffer the consequences.

Each child must attend 120 days each year, and this law is going to be enforced to the fullest extent. Some parents are going to be fined, and this is as simple as your ABC. A. L. Davis, Supt.

## Cotton Allotment

Every effort is being made to increase the Cotton Allotment give Donley County. Members of various interested organization met in the P. M. A. Office November 29th to discuss the situation and to decide what could be done to give our county the most benefit possible.

It was decided to send a committee to meet with State Director, Mr. B. F. Vance, at the State Office in College Station, Tex. Making the trip were Roy Jewell, Claude Moore, and W. M. Pickering, Committeemen for Donley County; J. Holly Wood and Lee Shaller, members of the Donley County Farm Bureau; J. Walter Hammond, President of the Soil Conservation Service; Odos member of the Chamber merce and Bowen Dulaney, member of the local Lions Club.

Roy Jewell, Claude Moore, J. Holly Wood, and Lee Shaller stopped at Waco and met with J. Walter Hammond, President of the Farm Bureau. They were able to see Mr. Hammond shortly after his return from twenty-four counties. They met to see if some could not be done about their allotments. The conference lasted about two hours.

All of the representatives in Donley County met for about three hours Saturday morning with B. F. Vance, State Director, Reynolds, Assistant State Director, Henry Marshall, State Statistician, Edd Rawlins, Marketing Quota Specialist. They were told that the State has used up its quota distributing it among the counties. Unless something can be done in congress, the county allotment will not be raised. Some plans have been made by which the acreage might be increased. The State Committee is doing all it can to help raise the allotments. Several plans were submitted to the delegation for the purpose of finding which one of the plans will benefit our county the most. The plans were being worked on in the county office, and as soon as they are all tried, and the best one for us is found, they will be sent to our congressman, and will be considered in Washington.

The delegation felt that the trip was not in vain, because by finding a plan for our county, and sending it to Washington, the farmers in Donley County might receive more cotton acreage. It is not up to the County or the State, only action by Congress will raise the 1950 allotments.
