## Later Band Donations March of Dimes

Cotton seed will be in demand for planting all over the state this spring says county agent H. M. Bredlove and if you do not have plenty of seed on hand for spring planting at this time, now is the time to get your seed and store it on the farm. There will be no restrictions on cotton for 1951 and the department is calling for six to ten million bales in 1951 to meet the demands of the war department and civilian consumption. Bredlove says that this will mean an acreage similar to that in 1949, keeping in mind to plant cotton on land suitable to growing cotton and still not hold back your soil building program and conservation. In 1951 we must plan our farming operations to fit cotton into a balanced farming program but still make our production high enough to meet the needs of the armed forces.

Cotton seed and fertilizers will surely be hard to get later in the spring and the prices will probably be higher, so now is the time to get the seed for cotton planting and fertilizer that you will need and store them in a good dry place on the farm. Planting starts much earlier down the state and if weather conditions are not favorable and they have to plant over, then a definite shortage of seed and fertilizer could exist by the time we are ready to plant. Bredlove advises that buying of your seed now might be good insurance for you for a cotton crop in 1951.

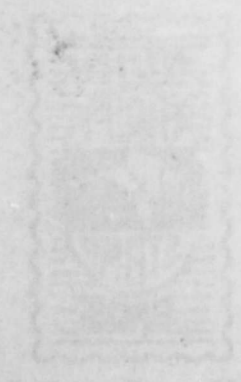

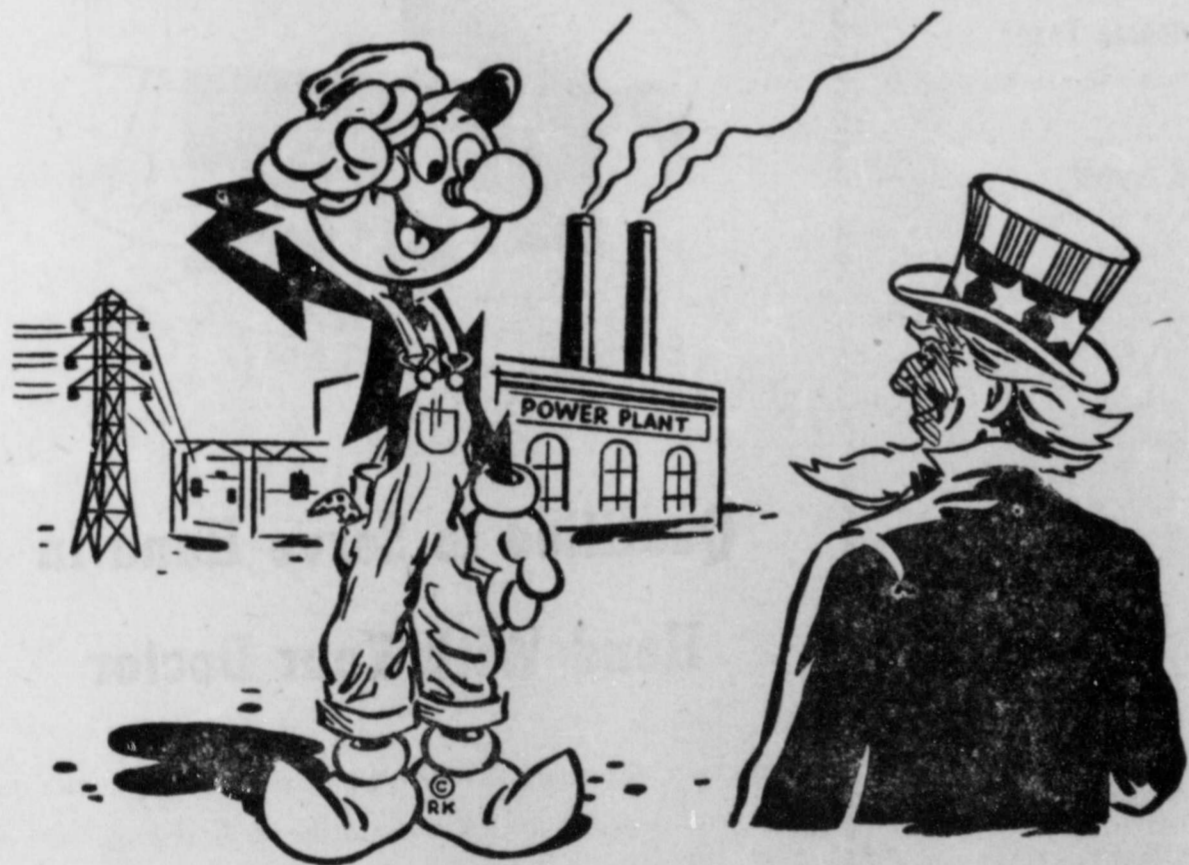
