"In 1939-40 the public schoo support totaled 30.31 cen s of each state dollar expended. During the last school year the schools' shale of that dollar was 29.67, or exact.y 51 of a cent less. At the same time, enrollment greatly increased, the number of teachers employed we is m ch higher and the ave.age dany a tendance skyrocketed. The average da sy attendance jumped in one year 35,708 unuer the new school program. Every child in Texas is guaranteed the opportunity of having 175 days of actual instrue ion per year.

Cha les H. Tennyson, executive secretary of the Teachers Atsoc ation, commented that until the Gi.mer-Aikin program gave Texas a position near the top in the national education field, a proportionate share of the state dollar was not going to the schools.

"We are designted to find that the vastly-improved school system is taking less of the state dollar,"
