Fat Stock Show

The Donley County Fat Stock Show will be held in Clarendon on Friday, February 23. All livestock will be in the barns by 9 o'clock in the morning and will remain in place until 4:30 in the afternoon at which time they will be loaded out for the Amarillo Fat Stock Show. C. L. Lewis, president of the show, says that Cudd Bros. trucking lines will haul the stock to Amarillo free of charge for the boys. Billy Cooke Jr. will furnish hay for the bedding of the animals at the county show free to the club boys.

Registered breeders will also have a department to show their stock and will not be judged.

The superintendent of the swine department is E. S. Ballew, of the sheep is W. L. Davis of Hedley, and of the beef calves is C. L. Lewis and Joe McMurtry, who will also separate the beef calves into two classes, putting the heavy calves in one class and the lighter calves in another class. H. M. Breedlove, county agent and secretary of the show, says that the judge for the show will be J. P. Smith of Texas Tech College. Tom Seay secured the judge for the show this year.

The classes of livestock and premium money to be paid are as follows:

Beef Calves
 Heavy class: 1st prize, \$25; 2nd, \$20; 3rd, \$15; 4th, \$10; 5th, \$5
 Light class: 1st prize, \$25; 2nd, \$20; 3rd, \$15; 4th, \$10; 5th, \$5

Group of 3 calves fed by one boy: 1st prize, \$15

First two calves in each class to be judged for grand and reserve champion of show: grand champion steer, \$25; reserve champion steer, \$15.

Swine
 Light weight, under 225 lbs.: 1st prize, \$5; 2nd, \$4; 3rd, \$3; 4th, \$2; 5th, \$1; 6th, \$1.

Heavy weight, 225 lbs. and over: prizes the same as in the light weight class.
 Duroc, Poland China, Berkshire, and Hampshire will be judged separately and use the above class and premium money for each individual breed. All first place breed champions will compete for the grand and reserve champion of the show.
 Grand champion: \$5 plus \$10 given by E. S. Ballew
 Reserve champion: \$3
 Pen of 3 barrows or gilts fed by one boy all breeds competing: 1st prize, \$5; 2nd, \$4; 3rd, \$3; 4th, \$2; 5th, \$1
 Litter of six barrows or gilts fed by one boy: prizes the same as above.

Sheep
 Mutton lambs: 1st prize, \$7.50; 2nd, \$5; 3rd, \$2.50; 4th, \$1.50
 Fine wool lambs: same prizes
 Cross breeds and other breeds: same prizes

First and second place lambs in each class will compete for the grand champion and reserve champion of the show.
 Grand champion lamb: \$10
 Reserve champion lamb: \$5
 F. F. A. and 4-H Club boys from all over Donley county will be competing in this show so make your plans to visit the Donley County Fat Stock Show and remember the stock leaves for Amarillo at 4:30 p. m., so be there early! The premium list for this show was donated by the business men and individuals of Clarendon and Hedley, and other people from over Donley County.

NEW ENGLAND DINNER



4 lbs. beef brisket (fresh or corned) 6 carrots
6 onions 12 small beets

Cover meat with boiling water (if fresh brisket is used, add 1 1/2 tablespoons salt to cooking water.) Simmer slowly in covered kettle 3 to 5 hours or until tender. Forty-five minutes before serving add onions and carrots. Fifteen minutes later add quartered cabbage. Cook beets separately. Serve on a large platter, with the meat in the center and the vegetables arranged around it. Serves 6.

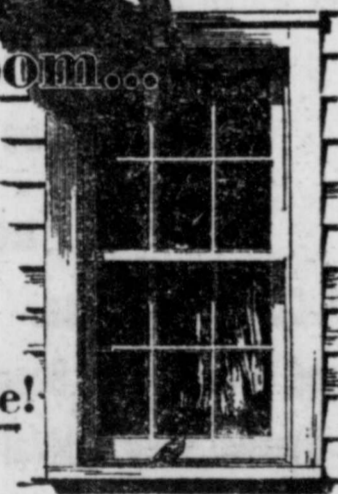

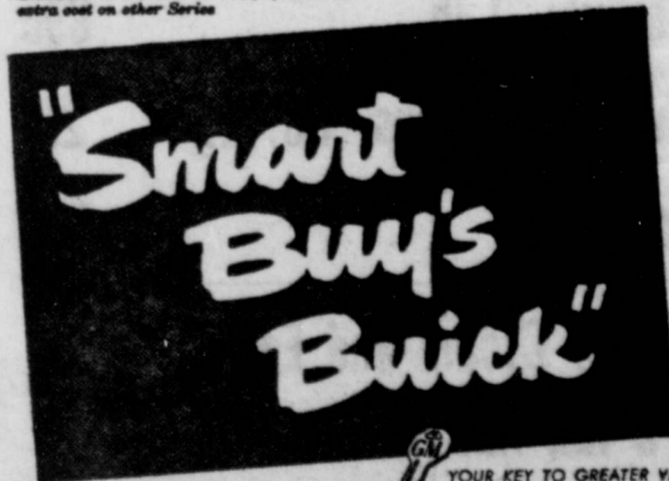

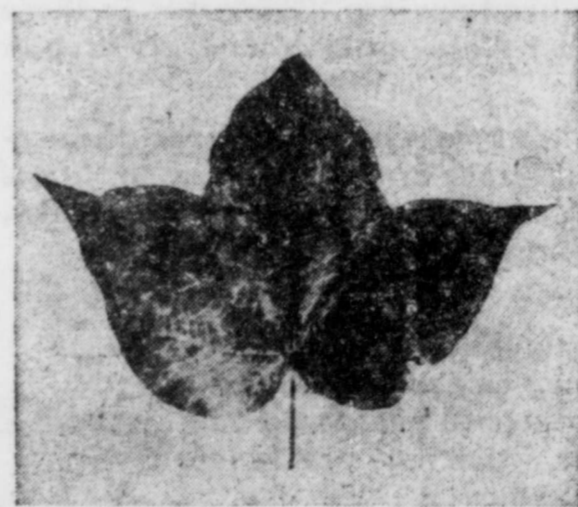

ANGULAR LEAF SPOT or bacterial blight can be stopped

Angular leaf spot, bacterial blight, boll rot, vein blight or black arm. These are all names for the same thing, and they all mean bad news for you as a cotton grower. The blight causes death of seedlings, defoliation or loss of leaves from the plant, and shedding or rotting of bolls. It all adds up to less cotton per acre.

As the name shows, it is caused by bacteria. The germs live in the seeds, and grow up in the cotton plant to cause various harmful results.

Clearly the way to wipe out this disease is to plant disease-free seeds. You can make sure that your cotton seeds do not carry the disease germs by killing the bacteria before you plant, using an organic mercury dust. You can do this on your own premises, or have it

done by the seed treating service of your local gin or seed supplier. The chemical costs less than 10¢ per acre. Other control methods include delinting of seeds with sulphuric acid or by hydrochloric acid gas. These are harder to apply, but also effective.

Because wind-blown rain spreads bacterial blight readily from one field to another, its control is a job that all the planters in an area should do together. Otherwise one field planted with untreated seed might re-infect all the others. It will pay every planter to stamp out bacterial blight in his fields. Planting seed that has been mercury dust-treated will not only reduce this disease, but will also reduce seed decay and damping-off (sore shin) organisms, too.
