the anthracnose fungi. This treatment cuts off the disease at its source. Used with other control measures, it can practically wipe out the disease from an entire area in a few years. Mercury dust treatment will also control seed decay and damping-off (sore shin) organisms and reduce angular leaf spot.

The cost of the chemical amounts to less than 10¢ per acre. Treatment can be done on your farm or by many ginners and delinters. Ask your County Agent or Farm Extension Service about the value of seed treatment and about where the


