Gruene: Quaint Little Old Place Is Quite A Paradox
built a saloon with a good-sized meeting hall in the back. Gruene Hall became the center of the com munity's social life.
In the 1920 , boll weevils killed the cotton crops and the Great Depression killed the economy. The Coton Mill burned and was not rebuilt. The mercantile closed and Gruene became a ghost town for several years. Then about 100 years
after the town came into existence, some enterprising business people recognized good potential in the cluster of old empty
buildings along the river banks and the town was reborn eventually gaining recognition on the National Register of Historic Paces.
We all had a delightful lunch, dining al fresco on one of the meny outside porches and decks which are now attached to
the remains of the old mill on the river bank. After lunch the remains of the old mill on the river bank. Atter lunch,
we noticed a rather nondescript white frame building located
next to the Grist next to the Grist Mill Restaurant. We ambled in for a look
around. Oh gracious! It was the old saloon that Mr. Gruene
 Gunsmoke TV series, and in the back was a great long dance
hall with an old juke box at one end and a raised stage for performers at the other end. A light bulb went off in my brain and sudan
remembered seeing this place written up in Texas Monthl
magazine and also on the magazine and also on the "Texas Country Reporter" TV
program. The "Wall of Fame" (actually three or four walls) prog attracting a lot of tourists who were checking out pictures of all the famous and infamous country musicians who had
performed at Gruene Hall. It seems that the place was
instrumental in kicking off the careers of George Strait, Lyle Lovett, Hal Ketchum, Joe Ely and Jerry Jeff Walker.
Also the movie "Michael" which starred John Travolta and Andy McDowell was filmed at Gruene Hall. For the big dance scene, the "Gruene Hall" sign was temporarily removed from
the building and replaced with wne that tod burg and replaced with one that read "Tom's."
