

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE EGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding thereto a new Section, to be numbered Section 63, which shall read as follows:

"SECTION 63. The Legislature shall have the authority to provide for a statewide system of retirement and disability pensions for appointive officers and employees of the counties of this State under such a plan and prothorize; provided, that participation therein by counties shall be voluntary and shall first be authorized by vote of the qualified voters of such county; provided persons over sixty-five (65) years propriation to pay any retirement over the age of sixteen (16) herein.
