A great shock to his many friends in both Hedley and Panhandle was the sudden death Friday morning of Carroll Deahl, who passed away in the home of his parents at Panhandle after a heart attack. At the time of his death he was operating Abel Elevator near Panhandle and farms at Panhandle and White Deer as well as his own place at Hedley.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock from the First Christian Church at Panhandle by Minister Jimmy Mitchell, pastor of the Clarendon Christian Church, Minister Bedford Smith, pastor of the Memphis Christian Church, and Minister Barrett Moore pastor of the Panhandle Christian Church. Burial was in the Panhandle cemetery.

Pallbearers were Friday Hughes, Clarence Williams, Lloyd Miller, Francis Holcomb, Red Grammer, C. L. Johnson, C. L. Taylor and D. H. Cox.

Carroll Eugene Deahl was 42 years of age and was a native of Carson county. He had worked with the old Panhandle State Bank there and later at Borger before entering military service in World War II, moving to Hedley in 1946 to operate a farm.

He was a past commander of the Hedley post of the American Legion, a past member of the Hedley Lions Club and a member of the VFW post in Panhandle.

His parents have been residents of Panhandle for 45 years. His father formerly owned the Panhandle State Bank before it was moved to Borger.

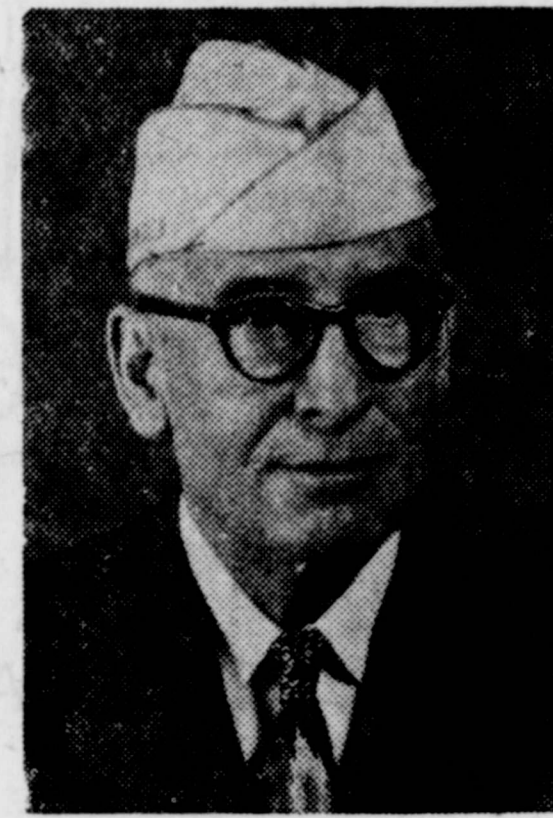

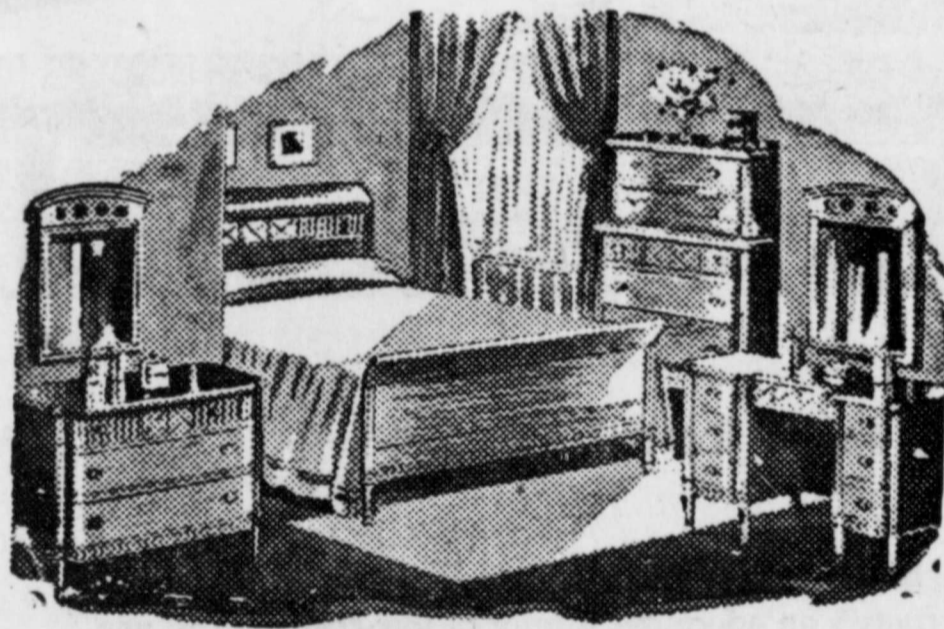

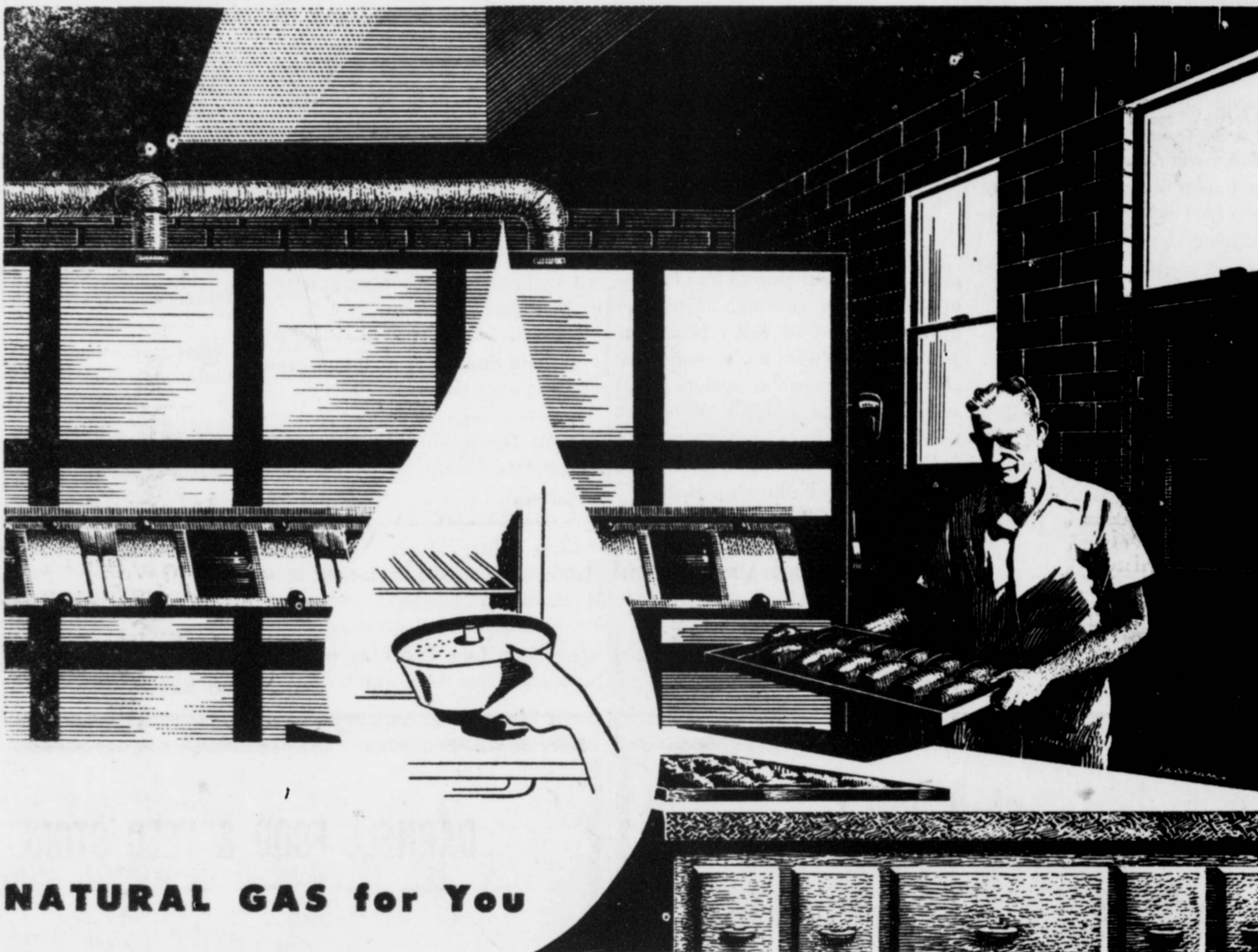

HUNGARIAN GOULASH

2 lbs. beef chuck or neck meat 2 onions 2 tablespoons lard Paprika	1/2 teaspoon caraway seed (if desired) 1/2 teaspoon powdered marjoram 1 clove of garlic 1 1/2 teaspoons salt 1 cup water
---	--

Cut meat into 1-inch cubes. Let onions brown in lard, then add meat and let it brown lightly. Add caraway seed, marjoram, chopped garlic, and enough paprika to effect a noticeable red color. Add water and salt, cover and simmer for 2 1/2 hours. Add more water if necessary. Whole potatoes may be added to the goulash 1/2 hour before done. Some goulash recipes call for the addition of tomatoes. Strained tomatoes may be substituted for water in this recipe. Serves 6.

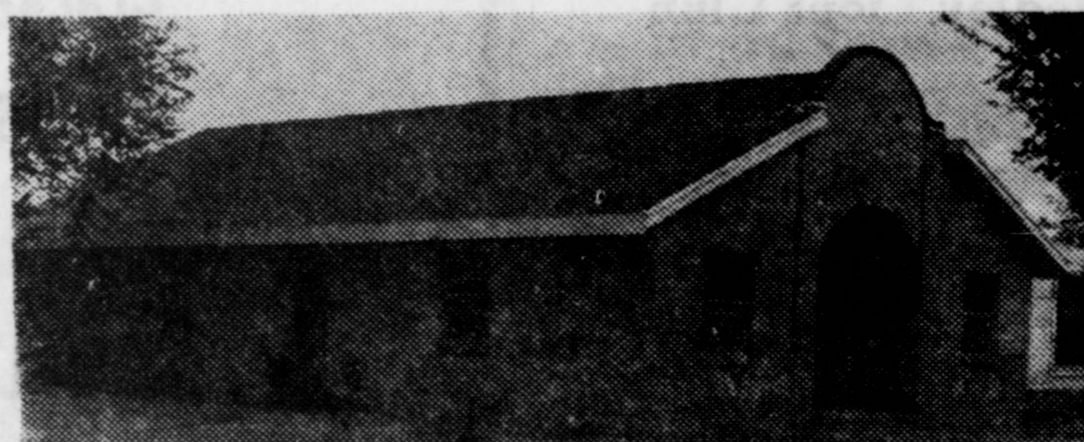
