Soil Testing

Farmers who will use commercial fertilizers in 1952 and have not had their soil tested for the correct fertilizers for various field crops can get this service from the Extension Service soil testing laboratories of Texas A & M College. H. M. Breedlove, county agent for Donley County, says that this laboratory is maintained for the purpose of soil testing only and the support of the force in the laboratory is by a fee of one dollar per soil sample sent to the laboratory. One pint of top soil and one pint of sub soil is all that is necessary to send in. The check should accompany the soil samples and should be made out to the Texas A & M College Soil Testing Laboratory. Breedlove says that he will be glad to help anyone prepare the samples for shipping and give them any further information that they might need.

The Ministerial Association of Hedley is making plans for a cooperative watch night service. The details of this effort will be announced later. Watch for it.

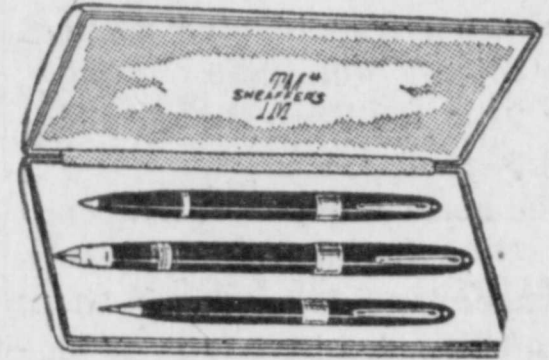
