Rev. B. J. Osborn, 75 year old retired Methodist minister, died at 5:30 p.m. Friday in a Cisco hospital following a 24 hour illness.

Rev. Osborn, a former pastor of the Hedley Methodist church, had been a resident of Cisco since his time honorary member of the retirement in 1940.


He served pastorates in Old Hansford which is now Spearman, Dumas, Caps, McLean, Pampa, here Saturday.

CRANBERRY STUFFING: 2 cups fresh cranberries, ground; $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar; 3 tblsp. butter or margarine; $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped celery; 1 tblsp. chopped parsley; 2 qts. $\frac{1}{2}$ " bread cubes; 1 tspn. salt; $\frac{1}{4}$ tspn' sage or marjoram; $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk of bouillon. Grind cranberries and add sugar. Melt butter in a skillet; add celery and saute, until tender. Combine cranberry and sugar mixture, celery, parsley bread cubes, salt, sage and milk. Y ield: 5 cups.







Walnut Stuffing?

WALNUT STUFFING: 1/4 cup butter or shortening; 2/3 cup chopped celery; 2/3 cup chopped onion; 1 cup chopped walnuts; 11/4 qts. toaseed or dry 1/2" bread cubes; 1, tspn. salt; } tspn. pepper; } tspn. thyme; 1/4 tspn. sage; 1 egg, beatcn; 1 cup milk. Melt butter in skillet ; add celery and onion and saute until tender and lightly browned. Pour over walnuts, toasted bread cube, salt, pepper, thyme and sage Add beaten egg and milk and mix well, Yield: 11 qts.
