An Open Letter

TO OUR NEIGHBORS:

Though I have talked to many friends in Hedley and tried in my meager way to express my sincere appreciation for the way I have been welcomed here, I felt that through this medium I could best express my thoughts. We have tried to clean up and in some ways modernize your Theatre, feeling that if there was to be a Theatre in Hedley it could at least be a comfortable one. We've tried to bring you the best shows available and still not increase the price of admission. We plan to modernize and clean up the main auditorium next. Some of the outstanding pictures we have booked for March are listed on this page. It takes a while for a relative newcomer to get the feel of things and to feel that he belongs to a community and that it belongs to him. The friendly and abundant words of encouragement have sparked life into the Theatre. My work is just a reflection of those encouragements. Therefore I take this method of asking your support and advice on a plan we are putting into effect for Sunday Night Shows.

It has always been my policy to give evidence of the faith I have in the work the churches of this community are now and have always been doing. We have gone out of our way to find and bring to Hedley in the near future some of the top Religious stories that Hollywood has produced. I think it is a vital part of the American way of life for all men, women and children to take an active part in their respective churches in whatever way they are able.

The question of the morality of Sunday night shows has been a touchy one throughout the civilized country. My personal opinion is that operated right they are of a benefit. It is not my intention to interfere with our day of worship. Our Sunday night shows will not start until evening church goes are through with their activities. However, Sunday night shows at the Hedley are not especially designed to catch you on your way home from church. They are being TRIED, and only tried, not a permanent plan, to give the young people a place to go, and something to do on Sunday evenings. It would be fitting of course for them to go to Church and to the splendid activities associated therewith and we shall continue to urge that on our screens. But I have watched intently the racing cars, the listless gangs on the corner, and the ever increasing streams of traffic out of town. I hope with an 8 P. M. show on Sundays to keep your youngsters home. I can promise you this. No picture that is not of the highest entertainment calibre morally speaking will be shown on Sundays at the Hedley. As I have said, it is only a trial, a test of an idea to be of service to my community. If I find it doesn't work, or if your response is to stop them, your advice will be followed. Starting this Sunday night our box office will open at 8:00 P. M. Our regular show will start at 8:30 P. M. with the final show ending no later than 11 P. M. This will be in addition to our regular afternoon matinee.

This week Judge Harold M. LaFont made his announcement for the office of State Senator of the newly created 30th Senatorial District of Texas. In making his announcement, Judge LaFont submitted the following statement.

In asking the people to elect me to this office, it is with a full realization that whoever the people elect has the responsibility of making the laws that govern over 7,000,000 people of the State of Texas. These laws directly affect the daily lives of practically all of us, and serious thought and consideration should be given to each and every law that is passed by the Legislature. It is my humble judgement that men who fill these offices of responsibility and in whom we place our trust and confidence, should be experienced, honest, sincere and capable.

As citizens, all of us are interested in the progress and welfare of our Senatorial District and of the State of Texas as a whole, and we have a right to expect our fair share of those things for which our tax money is spent. These include educational assistants, police protection for our families and property, a good system of state highways and farm-to-market roads. All of these items of state government help make our district a better place in which to live and to rear our families.

My home is located on an irrigated farm about three miles north-east of the town of Plainview. I am married and have a son 11 years of age and a daughter 7 years of age.

I am now serving as Representative of the 120th Representative District of Texas, which includes eight of the fifteen counties in this Senatorial District. At the close of the last session of the Legislature the Speaker of the House of
