## Rain Program

The delegates to the moisture increasing project meeting in Hollis, Okla. last Friday night voted for the temporary chairman and vice chairman of both the Texas and Oklahoma Projects to sign an agreement with Mr. Ford Hubbard, representing Dr. Irwin P. Krick's Water Resources Development Corporation of Denver, to take the necessary steps in preparation for "Cloud seeding Operations" by March 15.

According to Dr. Krick's forecast a front is due about that time that is appropriate for cloud seeding operations, and of course we want to take advantage of it. It is necessary for Texas and Oklahoma to form two separate organizations, which may contract jointly with WRDC. Separate charters have been applied for, and they are expected to be accepted and returned by Tuesday, March 4. A number of the counties have their funds raised, and those that do not promised to do everything within their power to reach their quota by Saturday. If Donley County wants in on this program we must get the money together and elect our officials by Saturday.

This is a non-profit organization and the directors must be elected by its members, therefore another meeting is necessary. It will be at the Mulkey Theatre in Clarendon Friday at 2:00 p. m.
