## Explorer Scouts

Members of the Hedley Explorer Scouts are training for emergency service anywhere within a 50 mile radius that they might be needed. Training will include elementary fire fighting and control, first aid, traffic control, and handling of crowds.

The unit will stand by on call at any time to serve in Hedley or surrounding areas following severe storms, floods, fires, or major accidents.

The Explorers now are outfitted with the regulation Forest Green Cap and Explorer T shirt identifying them as Adult Scouters. Friends and families were entertained by the boys Monday night at the City Park for a picnic and meeting combined. This Saturday morning the boys will leave Hedley at 8:00 a. m. for Boy's Ranch for a day long visit.

May 9th they will leave for a three day camping trip at Scout Camp Kiawah. Work parties will be organized to ready the camp for Boy Scouts who will use it this summer season.

The Hedley Lions Club, sponsors of the group, announced separation of the Explorers from the Boy Scouts by applying for a Post charter for the group. Lion President Clyde Bridges appointed 3 executive Scout committeemen last week to serve as governors of the Explorer Scout Post 36. Chairman of the committee is Ross Springer who with Henry Moore and Carl Reid will supervise all club work.

Any boy 14 or over is eligible to join the Explorers and scouts will be transferred automatically from Clifford Johnson's organization into the Explorer post when they reach 14. Meetings are held at 7:30 every Monday night in the Movie Den, second floor of the Theatre Building
