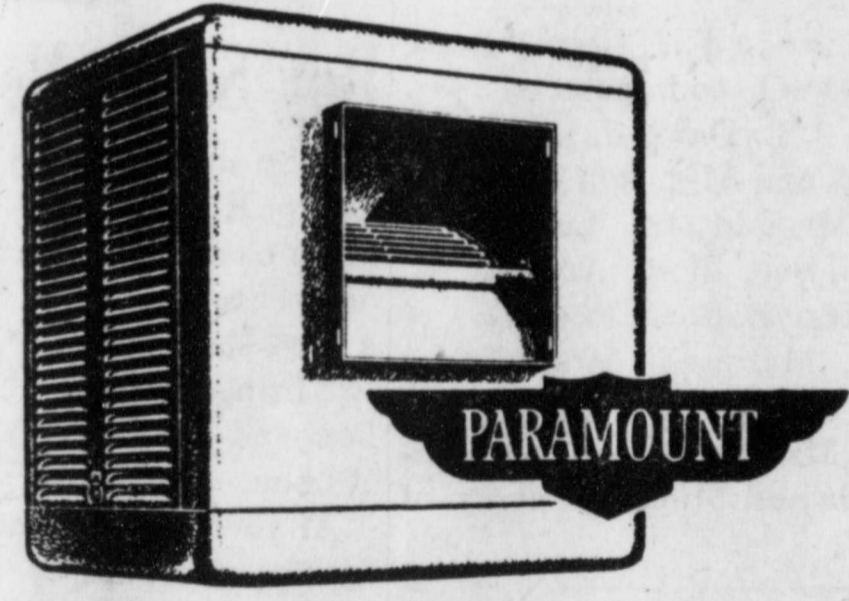

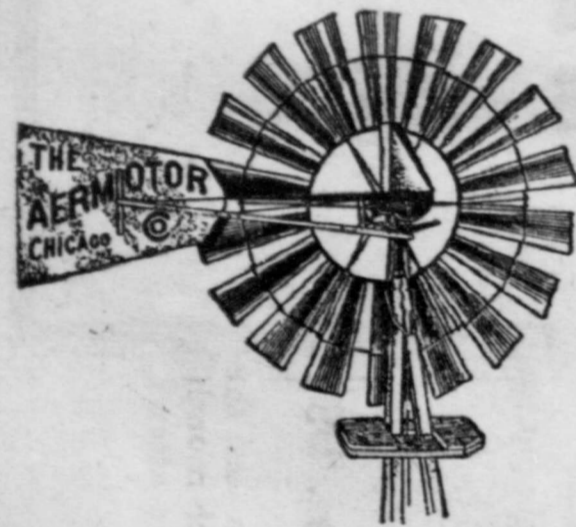

## Faulkner Announces For Representative

The following political announcement has been made by James E. 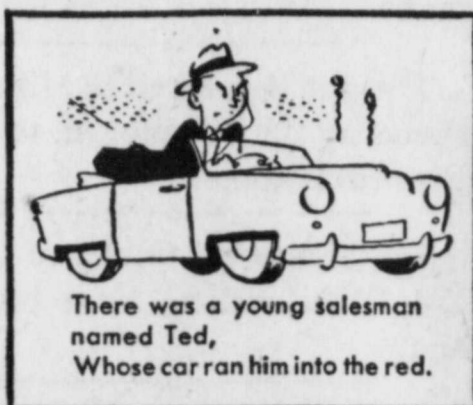

of things because they do not suit me, personally. After all, this is your job, you give the orders as to what you want done and it is the sacred duty of your State Representative to carry out your orders and not to carry on a personal legislative program. I make only one promise and that is this: Let me be your 'hired hand' in Austin during the next term of the Legislature and tell me what you want done, and I will do my utmost to carry out your orders as I have always done in every job I have ever had, because I will be representing you."

Jimmy Faulkner moved to Turkey with his parents when he was eight years old and lived there till he entered the army in March of 1942. After serving for a short time, (with the 90th Division) he received a disability discharge. He then went to Amarillo where he was employed by the Pantex Ordnance Plant, (in the Timekeeping and General Auditing Departments), till the end of the war. After the war he was employed by The Texas Employment Commission till June 15, 1951 when he became Manager of the Chamber of Commerce at Clarendon, which position he still holds. He has been very active in civic and service organization work for a number of years. He has been especially active in the American Legion, serving on post, district, state and national committees. He is a church member and a member of the Clarendon Lions Club.

Faulkner will spend the next fifteen days contacting the people of this four county district; meeting and talking with them. "There will be a number of the more than ten thousand people in this district that I will not be able to meet, but I want them to remember me when they go to the polls and to please consider this as a personal solicitation for their vote if I should fail to meet them," Faulkner concluded.

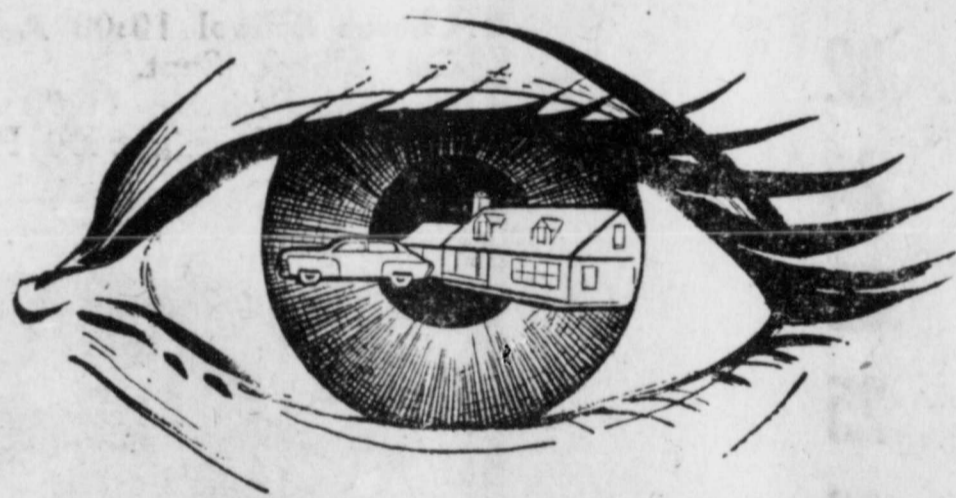
