## Dividend Paid

Members of the Donley County National Farm Loan Association received checks this week representing a 10% dividend on their stock in connection with their Federal Land Bank Loans. This is in keeping with the policy of the Federal Land Bank of Houston and the Association to pass a part of the earnings, after adequate Surplus and Reserves have been established, to the members.

Beginning in 1944, Mr. Rayburn L. Smith, Secretary-Treasurer, reports, the Donley County National Farm Loan Association has paid a total of \$26,249.25 to its members in dividends. The average interest cost after dividends in 1951 was only 3.14%, to members of the Donley County National Farm Loan Association.

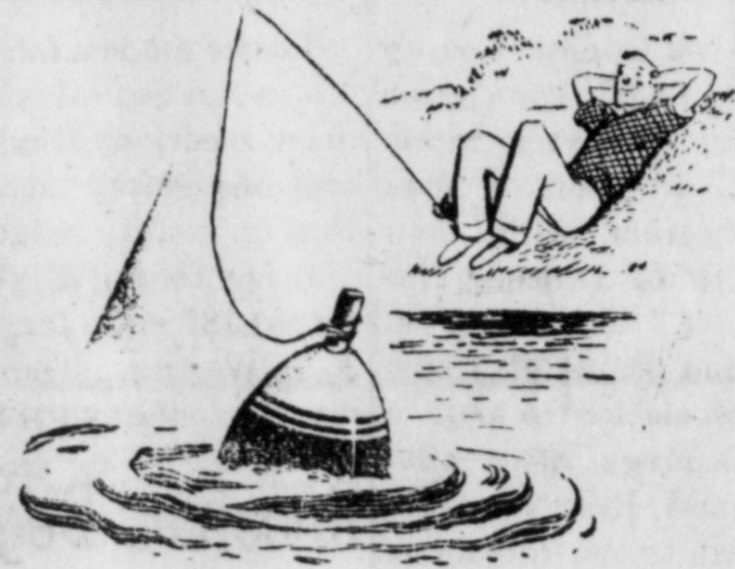

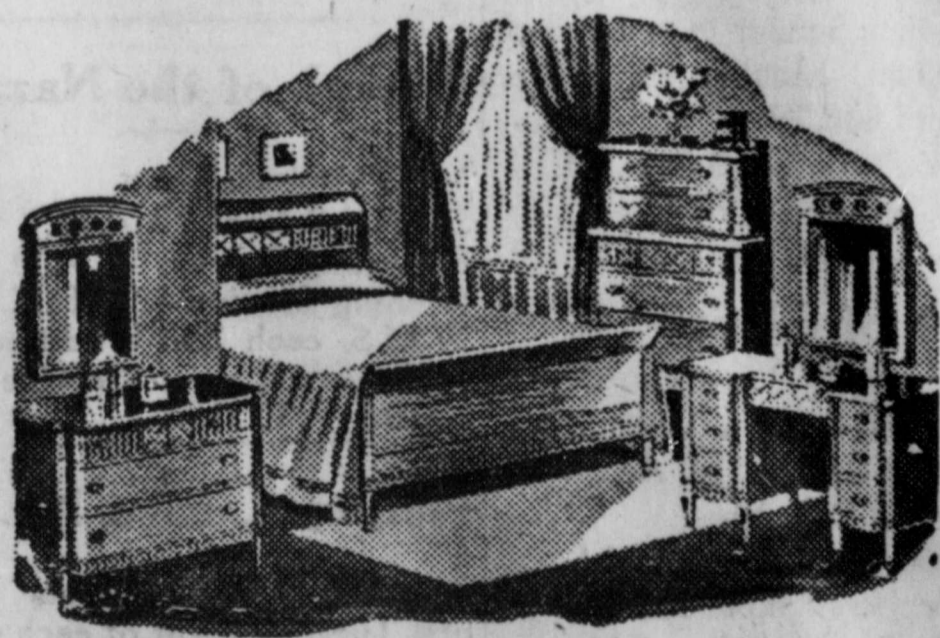

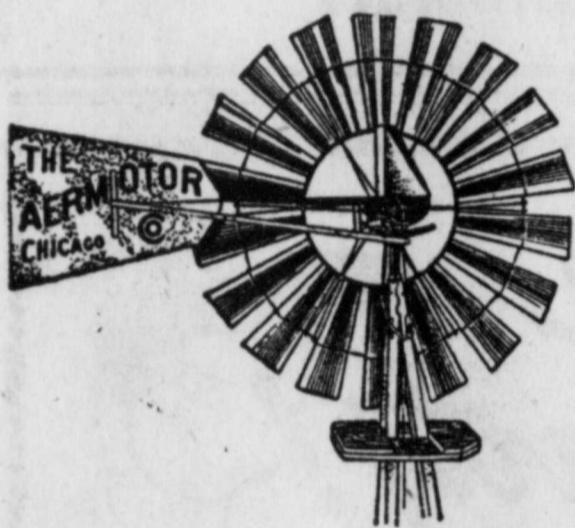
